DC distributes blankets and jackets to nuns

LHOU, March 16: Tawang DC KN Damo distributed blankets to the nuns of the Singur Ani gonpa on March 10.

Around 20 nuns who hadn't received jackets last year were also provided with maroon jackets donated by Gurgaon-based International Charitable Society – The Hans Foundation.

Besides this, the 40 Mountain Brigade of the Indian Army organised a free medical camp for the nuns.

On 9 March, blankets and jackets were distributed to the students of the Bodong Tashi Cholling orphanage.

CBBF campaign held

YINGKIONG, March 10: A cataract blindness backlog-free (CBBF) campaign under the Pradhan Mantri Netra Jyoti Abhiyaan 2022-23 was conducted in Upper Siang district on Friday, March 10.

As part of the campaign, nine ophthalmic assistants, led by Lower Dibang Valley district hospital eye specialist Dr Tape Kaye and Upper Siang district hospital eye specialist Dr Monggoli Tatin, are carrying out a door-to-door survey from 5-14 March.

The team is screening operable cataract cases and dispensing presbyopia glasses to those requiring them.

Sixteen identified persons underwent surgery at the district hospital here, and five more were identified for treatment on Friday.

The team has so far visited 58 villages and 3,344 households, with a total population of 16,747.

Python rescued and released

ZIRO, March 16: A giant seven feet long python was rescued from Lumri village in Lower Subansiri district on Sunday, March 12.

The snake was first spotted by villagers, curled up near the culvert on the Lumri ring road. The villagers informed the Lumri Natural Resource Committee, which apprised Yachuli Range Forest Officer (RFO) Likha Obi, who rushed to the spot with a team.

The RFO requested the Itanagar Zoo authority for rescue and relocation of the python. In response, Itanagar Zoo Curator Raya Flago dispatched a rescue team to the site.

The snake was rescued and has been relocated to the Itanagar Zoological Park for shelter.

CRPF distributes water storage tanks

KAIMAI VILLAGE, March 16: A number of water storage tanks were distributed to the locals here in Tirap district by 36 Bn CRPF under its civic action programme on Tuesday, March 14 in presence of Kaimai chief Khamwang Lowang, Khonsa block ZPM Wanghong Pan-ka and GB Tawang Wangsa.

Addressing people during the distribution programme, 36 Bn commandant Pawan Kumar Singh informed that rain is the only source of water in the entire region and people face a lot of problem especially, from October to March every year when it does not rain in abundance. "As a result, to cater for various needs, such as drinking farming, rearing livestock etc, poor villagers have to go miles to fetch water. Providing water storage tanks will definitely benefit the poor and needy people of Kaimai village," he added.

The program was also attended by deputy commandant Mishri Singh Yadav, assistant commandant Sudhansh Kumar and Gram Panchayat member W Wangsa.

Centre giving more thrust to infra push along border: CM



ITANAGAR, March 16:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu on Friday, March 10 said that the central government is capable enough to tackle the border issue between India and China, and is accordingly giving more thrust to infrastructure development.

The process of building adequate infrastructure, particularly border connectivity, is being speeded up in the Northeastern state. Work on the 2000-km-long Arunachal Frontier Highway has already started in certain

sections and work is going on in full swing for construction of the Sela tunnel, located at a height of 13,700 feet.

Responding to a question from Congress MLA Ninong Ering, the chief minister said that the Centre has increased the presence of army and paramilitary personnel on the border with China after the recent standoff between both neighbours.

Referring to the recent face-off between Indian and Chinese soldiers at Yangtse in Tawang district, Khandu said, "India is not as before and the

situation has changed after the BJP-led NDA came to power at the Centre."

Yangtse is located in Mukto constituency, represented by Khandu in the assembly.

"Earlier, there was no infrastructure in the border areas. Now the scenario has changed with more impetus on strengthening border infrastructure in the state. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is capable enough to tackle such a situation," Khandu asserted.

Indian and Chinese troops clashed along the line of actual control in the Tawang sector on 9 December last year, and the face-off resulted in "minor injuries to a few personnel from both sides," the Indian Army had said.

The clash near Yangtse took place amid the over 30-month border standoff between the two sides in eastern Ladakh.

The chief minister said that, because of Modi, the voice of the people on the border issue can now be heard, which was not the case earlier.

"Previously, after a minister visited the Northeastern state, the next day China used to protest. Now such protests are not seen even after the visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Droupadi Murmu to the state in recent times," the chief minister added.

DCM presents Rs 758.26 cr deficit budget

ITANAGAR, March 16:

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein on Tuesday, March 7 presented a Rs 758.26 crore deficit budget for 2023-'24, with special emphasis on creating livelihood opportunities.

The state has projected total receipts of Rs 29,657.16 crore, which is 14 percent higher compared to the total estimated receipts of Rs 26,111.63 crore in the budget of 2022-'23.

"Our vision is to support the aspirations of our people through impetus to economic growth and provide them with ample livelihood opportunities, especially the youths," said Mein, who also holds the finance, planning & investment portfolios.

"For the 2023-'24 fiscal, we are able to keep the fiscal deficit at an estimated two percent of gross state domestic product (GSDP), which is Rs 758.26 crore," he said.

The state's GSDP has nearly doubled from Rs 20,373 crore in 2015-'16 to Rs 39,000 crore now, he said.

"Arunachal Pradesh has been able to maintain more than 30 percent share of capital

expenditure in total expenditure outlay, which is the highest in the country and consistently so over a five-year period," Mein said.

He added that the per capita in-

come of the households has increased from Rs 88,768 to Rs 1,15,902 in the last six years. This is more than 30 percent increase in the average income of the people of the state.

The budget gives priority to border area development through road connectivity, and power projects to stop migration of people, Mein said, adding that "a roadmap has been prepared for the development of border areas with all available facilities to the people and armed forces."

"Fulfilling the aspirations of the youths, and livelihood generation through self-employment opportunities while continuing with our investment in infrastructure for improved connectivity will be the foundation of a prosperous and happy Arunachal Pradesh," Mein told reporters later.

The state is ready to contribute to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a USD 5 trillion economy, he said.

"In the last six years, the state witnessed unprecedented development in the infrastructure and connectivity sector," he said, adding: "This year we are planning to invest in the waterways sector too."

Emphasis is also being laid in the budget on the preservation of culture and tradition, the deputy chief minister said.

Assembly passes 3 bills

ITANAGAR, March 16:

The Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly here on Thursday, March 9 unanimously passed 3 (Three) bills with voice vote. The bills included – The Arunachal Pradesh Goods Tax (Amendment) Bill, 2023, The Arunachal Pradesh Protection of Drinking Water Catchment Areas Bill, 2023 and The Assam Frontier (Administration of Justice) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 2023.

Deputy Chief Minister and Minister of Tax, Excise & Narcotics Chowna Mein, while moving the Arunachal Pradesh Goods Tax (Amendment) Bill, 2023 for consideration and passing said that the bill is placed to amend the Arunachal Pradesh Goods Tax Act, 2005 (Act No.73 of 2005) and shall come into force with effect from 1st April, 2023 for whole of Arunachal Pradesh.

Public Health Engineering & Water Supply Minister Wangki Lowang informed the house that the Arunachal Pradesh Protection of

Drinking Water Catchment Areas Bill, 2023 is to provide for the protection of drinking water catchment areas with a view to preserve drinking water sources and to make provisions for the same and matter connected therewith.

Lowang, while seeking support from the members for passing of the bill, said that water is one of the most vital elements to human life and community, adding that development activities are being affected due to lack of water supply. He said that as the drinking water sources in the hill areas are diminishing due to denudation, effect of global warming and unwanted human activities in the catchment areas, it has become necessary to take regulatory measures to protect and improve the environment and the catchment areas and thereby preserve the drinking water sources therein and augment the yield of drinking water from other such sources, springs, streams and rivulets.

Arunachal developing infrastructure along international borders: Mein

ITANAGAR, March 16:

The state government has initiated several infrastructure development programmes in areas of the North-eastern state bordering China, Bhutan and Myanmar, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein said in the assembly on Thursday, March 9.

Under the Border Area Development Programme (BADP), infrastructure has been developed in 65 model villages, the deputy chief minister said.

Mein was responding to a question by Congress MLA Ninong Ering on the steps taken by the state government in view of the construction activities carried out by China along the international border with India.

"For developing the education sector, four new Vivekananda Kendra Vidyalayas (VKV) and four such existing schools have been upgraded under BADP with an estimated cost of Rs 80 crore," he said.

Moreover, eight model schools have been established in the border



area during 2017-'18, the DCM said.

"To address infrastructure gaps at the border, development projects such as road connectivity, foot suspension bridges, health facilities, drinking water and electricity facilities have been provided through the normal allocation of BADP fund and also from the state fund," Mein said.

The Centre, he said, has sanc-

tioned the ambitious Frontier Highway at an estimated cost of Rs 44,000 crore.

The union ministry of road, transport & highways (MoRTH) recently approved sanction for the 1,500-km Frontier Highway, which would connect all the border areas of the state from east to west.

Assembly passes budget for 2023-'24 by voice vote

ITANAGAR, March 16:

The state assembly on Friday passed the budget for the 2023-'24 fiscal by voice vote on Friday March 10.

The estimated receipts and expenditures for FY-'24 were presented in the House by Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein on 7 March.

Responding to the observations made by members of the House during the budget discussions, Mein said that the annual financial statement for 2023-'24 is prepared after in-depth studies and due consultation with the people and community-based organisations in a transparent manner, encompassing all strata of the society.

"This is an inclusive budget. It is based on the philosophy of trust with the motto of self-reliance by fulfilling the dreams of the youths," Mein said.

Emphasis has been laid to make the youths self-reliant, so that they would be job providers instead of job seekers, the DCM said.

The state government is preparing a roadmap to make Arunachal Pradesh a developed state by 2047, in accordance with the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, he said.

4 Corps GOC calls on the Governor

deployed in western Arunachal Pradesh. He appreciated the Army's contribution towards the wellbeing and security of the people living in and around the deployment areas of 4 Corps.

The Governor appreciated the effort made by Hq 4 Corps for motivating and providing assistance to the local youth in the Agniveer recruitment process as well as organizing awareness and motivational camps and pre-recruitment rallies for the recruitment of local youth in different parts of the State.

The Governor suggested

combined efforts be made by the Army and State for goodwill projects in the border areas to strengthen the bonhomie with the local population. He said that focus be on providing assistances in health and education sectors.

The GOC, 4 Corps briefed the Governor on various issues including defence readiness and goodwill projects of the Indian army.

Lt Gen (Dr.) DS Rana, GOC, 4 Corps presented a book 'TWO DECADES THAT SHAPED PLAS WE KNOW TODAY' which he has written to the Governor.

Will take people into confidence before arriving at decision on interstate border dispute: Khandu

ITANAGAR, March 16:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu on Tuesday, March 7 told the assembly that his government will take the people of the state into confidence before arriving at a conclusion over the decades-old boundary dispute with Assam.

Responding to a zero hour discussion in the House, initiated by senior Congress member Ninong Ering, the chief minister said that 12 regional committees, constituted by the state government to study the disputed areas with Assam, have submitted their reports to the authorities concerned, and that he would take up the matter with his Assam counterpart sometime soon.

"Before arriving at a conclusion, I will sit again with the committees to have a clear picture of the boundary areas. If there is any public grievance, it will be placed with Assam," Khandu said.

Earlier, Ering had pointed out that the Daying Ering Wildlife Sanctuary (DEWS) in East Siang district, which is named after his father, has its office in a territory that is currently controlled by Assam.

Sagalee connected to power grid: DCM

ITANAGAR, March 16:

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein on Friday, March 10 informed the assembly that "Sagalee (Papum Pare) is connected to the grid supply at 11 kv voltage level."

He said this during question hour, in response to a query raised by leader of opposition Nabam Tuki, who asked whether the government would provide sufficient fund "for replacement of electric poles and other electric material in CFY 2023-'24."

"Sagalee sometimes faces irregular power supply as a result of interruption due to technical and non-technical issues like felling of trees and bamboos, and insulator puncture on the lengthy 11 kv transmission line between Yupia and Sagalee," the

DCM said.

He added that "the state government is funding the maintenance of the T&D system, and will provide fund for special maintenance of dilapidated T&D under RDSS and comprehensive scheme."

Home Minister Bamang Felix informed the assembly that "there is already 100 police stations notified across the state, out of which 21 are especially for women police stations, in which seven police stations are functional and the remaining will be functional soon, as and when they fulfil the laid down criteria of availability of land free of cost and adequate funds."

"Khonsa is one of the notified police stations, but due to lack

of infrastructure and unavailability of building, it is not yet functional," the minister informed while answering a question from Borduria-Bogapani MLA Wangling Lowangdong regarding the status of women police stations to be established in Khonsa.

Responding to a query from MLA Tarin Dakpe regarding establishment of an AIIMS-like institute in the state and upgrading the health institution in Pasighat (East Siang), Health Minister Alo Libang said that "the government has a plan to set up an AIIMS-like institute in the state, with special reference to Pasighat."

"The proposal will be initiated after the upgrading of the BPGH in Pasighat to a 300-bedded hospital," the minister added.

Traditional games and sports competition organised



TAWANG, March 16:

Rigzhung Tsemo Den-dur, traditional games and sports competition was organised by the Ex-servicemen welfare Association of Tawang with the assistance from the Indian army and District administration Tawang at Mentsemte festival ground on Monday, March 13.

DC Tawang, Kesang Ngu-

rup Damo while inaugurating the programme said the traditional game should not be limited as entertainment during lossar celebrations only, but should be encourage amongst youngsters to take up as career and appeal the parents to encouraged their children to speak in their own local dialects.

The DC further appealed the veterans to extend their support in

fight against plastic and other pollutants.

12 teams for archery and 5 teams from veer Naris in lei and Thepi participated in the competitions, informed Chairman ESMA Tawang, Thupten Wangdi earlier.

Commander Tawang brigade and Joint Secretary MMT Tawang block Sherap also spoke on the occasion.

CRPF organises free medical camp

CHANGLANG, March 16:

A free medical camp was organised by the 149 Bn CRPF under its civic action programme at the government middle school in Laktong here on Monday, March 13.

In total, 160 patients, including 40 children, were treated during the camp by doctors from the district hospital here.

Changlang ADC M Riba, who

inaugurated the camp, said that "earlier, the villagers had used opium for medicinal purposes to treat specific ailments; but now the people, especially the younger generation, are getting addicted to it, which is not healthy for the individuals and the society."

Riba appealed to the people, especially the youths, to abstain from opium and other drugs. He also spoke on the legal consequences of drug

abuse.

Battalion Inspector AM Sahu said that the force could not organise the medical camp in the interior villages this time due to shortage of time. He, however, said that the force will try to organise such camps in the interior areas in the coming days.

Among others, Dr K Mossang, Dr Reshma Pait and DSP R Khomrang attended the camp.

Tribals need to obtain tax exemption certificate from IT dept: DCM

ITANAGAR, March 16:

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein on Thursday, March 9 said that the indigenous tribal population of the state residing within the areas of the 6th Schedule given under the provision of Clause 26 of Article 366 of the Constitution is exempted from the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Responding to a question brought in the assembly by Congress member Nabam Tuki on notices served to some tribal people of the state by the income tax (IT) department, Mein said that the tribal population needs to obtain tax exemption certificate (TEC) from the IT department under Section 197 of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

"If any tribal person earns

money within his state, he is exempted from income tax. But if the person earns money in non-scheduled area or other states of the country, he is liable to pay income tax," Mein, who also holds the finance, planning and investment portfolios, said.

When Tuki pointed out that the IT department had issued notices to many people of the state on amount deposited in their bank several years ago, the deputy chief minister informed that the state government so far has not received any such report of harassment.

He, however, asserted that the government would take up with the IT department "as and when such instances of imposition of income tax to genuine people, who are not earn-

ing through business from any other states, is brought to the notice of the government."

Responding to a supplementary from Tuki, Chief Minister Pema Khandu said that, if abnormal transactions in bank accounts of tribal people are made, notices from the IT department would come automatically and in such cases, source of income has to be shown.

"After explaining the source of income with proper documents, there will be no problem for the indigenous tribal people," Khandu added.

The chief minister also requested the members to develop the habit of filing tax returns even if they are exempted from income tax in the state.

DA organizes "Har Ghar Green House" awareness under ARC



PASIGHAT, March 16:

The East Siang district administration in collaboration with the department of Information and Public Relations (IPR) and Agriculture department organized "Har Ghar, Green House", an awareness programme under the 'Arunachal Rising Campaign' (ARC) on March 9 at the office conference hall, wherein good number of urban women actively participated.

Addressing the gathering, Deputy Commissioner Tayi Taggu said, "Arunachal Rising Campaign is a comprehensive publicity campaign that ushers in a positive shift through its citizen-centric approach".

"Such campaign empowers citizens by providing them information, guidance and accessibility to various schemes, welfare measures and flagship programmes initiated by the government in the state and as a part of ARC 2022-23, district administration this year campaigning

for many welfare schemes including "Har Ghar Green House", informed the DC.

Arunachal is bestowed with a wide range of climatic and geographical conditions making it more suitable for growing various kinds of vegetables. But despite the climatic potentiality there are few disadvantages like heavy and prolong rains in the district hinders vegetable production in many parts of the district and vegetable cultivation are not pursued at its best except for few crops. This unfavorable situation can be minimized to some extent by providing green house to all under "Har Ghar Green House" scheme, asserted Taggu.

Appreciating the Dean of CHF Dr. BN Hazarika and DAO Opang Moyong and their associates for supporting the campaign, the DC stated that vegetable is the major source of minerals, fibers and vitamins in a balance diet. It also develops and

strengthened the immune system.

Vegetable is an indispensable part of our healthy food and cultivation and consumption are constantly increasing day by day due to the increase in population. 15 ENNG cadres surrender



ITANAGAR, March 16:

A total of 15 cadres of Eastern Naga National Government (ENNG) including its President Tosha Mossang, active specifically in three eastern districts of Arunachal Pradesh – Tirap, Changlang and Longding known as TCL region – laid down arms before the state government in a simple 'Homecoming Ceremony' here at the state police headquarters in presence of Chief Minister Pema Khandu, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein, Home Minister Bamang Felix, the state chief secretary, DGP and top officials of Assam Rifles and other central armed forces, on March 12.

In his brief address, Khandu welcomed back the 'misguided youths to the mainstream' and expressed hope that their willingness to lead a 'normal' life would inspire those still 'underground' to shun the

life of violence and terror.

He asserted that the central government, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah, is committed to bring all misguided persons, who have taken up arms against the establishment for one or other reason, back to the mainstream and provide them with a normal and better life.

"Violence is no solution to any problem. Peace, dialogue and commitment are the solution to every problem," he said.

Khandu pointed that Arunachal Pradesh has always been a peaceful state and that his government is committed to ensure that it remains so.

"With you (ENNG) returning home to normal life, Arunachal Pradesh has made a giant leap towards peace. I hope this step of yours

will set the doors open for others to come back home," he said.

Khandu informed that the state government has the 'Underground Surrender Policy' in place to rehabilitate them as well as facilitate their livelihood.

"This financial year (2023-24), we have allocated Rs 5 to encourage misguided youths to shun violence and become partners of growth. We assure the surrendered cadres all help to join the mainstream for their meaningful contribution to the State and the country," he said.

The Chief Minister lauded the role of Assam Rifles and the state police in pursuing with the rebels and encouraging them to surrender and start a normal life. He expressed optimism that the forces would continue with their effort to curb insurgency in the region but with a humane touch.

Mein visits Subansiri Lower HE Project in GERA KAMUK for site inspection



GERAKAMUKH, March 16:

Arunachal Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein on March 11 visited the 2000MW Subansiri Lower HE Project site in Gerakamukh, Lower Subansiri. Mein was accompanied by MLA cum Adviser to Minister (Power), Balo Raja, MLAs Tarin Dakpe, Taniya Soki, and Rode Bui, Secretary Power Ajay Kumar Bisht and CE DHPD, R. K. Joshi.

The dignitaries visited the various sites of the project to take stock of the progress made. He appreciated the progress of the works and lauded the project executing team. The project, which was taken over by NHPC Limited since 2000, is nearly completed, with 86% of the overall progress made till date. The DCM was also informed by the officials of NHPC that the projects are expected to be completed by May of this year, and 2 units of 250 MW each will be commissioned by June of this year,

while the remaining 6 units with a total capacity of 2000 MW of power will be completed by June of 2024.

After the visit, Mein held a meeting with the NHPC officials at their Office complex and discussed the issues of Subansiri Middle (Kamala) and Subansiri Upper (Menga) HEP, allotted to NHPC by Govt of India in presence of local representatives and PRI leaders. He urged them to expedite the execution of the project immediately and said that the matters pertaining to Subansiri Middle HEP will be taken up in the next Cabinet Meeting, after which a MoA will be signed between GoAP and NHPC as per the Cabinet decision. Standard operating Procedures (SOP) for Subansiri Upper HEP should also be finalised soon, he said.

DCM also asked the NHPC officials to execute their work with professionalism and to achieve the

target as per specification. He urged them to ensure that no further delays in the project completion is made as it causes cost escalation and more losses to the State exchequer, amounting to loss of revenue. The successful completion of the projects will also open up ample scope for establishment of an industrial zone in the area, Mein added. He also lauded the public for their cooperation in the smooth implementation of the project and asked the NHPC officials to win the confidence of the people through efficiency of their works.

Mein also assured the NHPC officials of the Government of Arunachal Pradesh's full support and cooperation in the successful implementation of these projects.

During the site inspection, NHPC Executive Directors (Subansiri), Vipin Gupta and ED Itanagar, R K Chaudhary briefed the visiting dignitaries about the projects.

Food baskets provided to TB patients adopted by Tuki

ITANAGAR, March 16:

Two months' worth of food baskets were provided to 10 TB patients adopted by Sagalee MLA Nabam Tuki as 'nikshay mitra', under the Prime Minister's TB Mukh Bharat Abhiyan (PMTBMBA), during a function at the TU here on Saturday, March 11.

Ward 10 Corporator Yukar Yaro, on behalf of Tuki, handed over the food baskets, containing cereals, pulses, edible oil, milk and eggs, to the patients.

Yaro advised the patients to take medicines regularly and complete the course. She further advised them to maintain proper diet and hygiene.

The staffers were also requested to deal with the patients politely and with respect.

Papum Pare DTO Dr PD Thongchi told the patients that "the food baskets are over and above the facilities provided by the government."

Khandu inaugurates RKM infrastructure



LUMDUNG, March 16:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu on Saturday, March 11 inaugurated the newly created infrastructure - Administrative block (Saradananda Bhawan), Academic block (Vivekananda Bhawan), Activity Block (Nivedita Bhawan) and Jambe Tashi Science Laboratory - of the Rama Krishna Mission School at its permanent campus here at Lumdung in East Kameng district. He had laid the foundation stone of the infrastructure on October 9, 2018.

Present on the occasion were Swami Gautamananda, Vice President Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, SwamiBodhasarananda, Assistant General Secretary Ramakrishna Mission, Swami Sarvagandha, Secretary Ramakrishna Mission School, Lumdung, Union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju, local legislator and state cabinet minister Mama Natung, Education Minister Taba Tedir, MLAs TseringLhamu, PhurpaTsering, KumsiSidisow, DongruSiongju, DorjeeWangdiKharma, TapukTaku, HayangMangfi, GorukPordung, BR Wahge and Ojing Tasing, Chief Secretary Dharmendra and others.

Khandu lauded the exceptional quality of the buildings and credited Secretary of the school Swami Sarvagandha for personally monitoring the execution of the infrastructure. On a lighter note, he said that engineers of the government's working departments 'need to learn a lesson or two from the Swamis in maintaining supreme quality on tight budgets'.

Hailing the establishment of RKM in Lumdung, East Kameng that

will cater to the people of western sector of Arunachal Pradesh, Khandu observed that it was long overdue.

"The central sector got the first RKM school at Aalo in 1966 and the eastern sector got it's at Narottamnagar in 1972. The dream of the people of the western sector to have its own share of a quality institution like RKM has been now fulfilled," he said.

He expressed gratitude to the people of Lumdung for donating land free of cost for establishment of the school and giving the school authorities a free hand in creation of school infrastructure.

"We (the people of western Arunachal) lost out on getting quality RKM education. But we need to provide this opportunity to the next generation," he remarked.

Khandu pointed that due to the proactive support of the central govt, revenue generation of the state has witnessed a rapid growth. He said this has enabled the state government to invest on sectors like education, health, connectivity, etc.

He informed that since 2018, the government has spent Rs 36.75 crore in establishment and development of the Lumdung RKM.

"We will be developing this school up to the higher secondary level, for which government will provide sufficient funds. In this year's budget, we have allocated Rs 29.3 crores for the school as grants-in-aid," he informed.

Acknowledging the role of RKM schools in providing quality education to the youths of the state,

Khandu revealed that this year Rs 7 crore grants-in-aid has been allocated for the school at Narottamnagar.

"I had assured construction of a Golden Jubilee Hall at RKM Narottamnagar worth Rs 10 crore. This year we have sanctioned Rs 5 crore for the same. Another Rs 6 crore has also been sanctioned for construction of a boys hostel in the school. And for RKM Aalo, Rs 2 crore for improving the internal roads and Rs 5 crore for construction of new staff quarters have been sanctioned," he revealed.

In line with the education system in RKM schools and Vivekananda Kendra Vidyalayas, Khandu said the state government has started dovetailing contemporary education with cultural learning through 'gurukul-type' institutions.

He said enough provisions are being kept in the budget for supporting such institutions with the first one established at Rang village near Seppa in East Kameng. Similar Gurukul has also been established in Lower Subansiri district and at Basar in Leparada district whilemore are in the pipeline at Pasighat and in Tirap, he informed.

Khandu reiterated the state government's commitment to overhaul the education scenario of the state.

"Earlier we had less number of schools but quality of education was exceptional. As time passed we started establishing schools randomly, may be due to political compulsions. Till last year we had at least 3000 government schools across the state. On closer inspection, we found that several were defunct and several had zero enrollment. We were forced to close down about 700 schools till date. Today, we are concentrating on running schools with proper infrastructure, sufficient number of teachers as well as students providing quality education," he informed.

Later in the evening, the Chief Minister along with Rijiju and others inaugurated the three-day inter-tribe youth festival - YuvaSamanvay. He also unveiled the statue of 'AtoRingso', great grandfather of the Natung clan and inaugurated the convention hall named after him.

Losar function organised at LAC



BUMLA/TAWANG, March 16:

The Monpa Mimang Tshogpa (MMT) on Saturday, March 11 organised a Losar function at the line of actual control (LAC) near Bumla, which is situated at an altitude of 15,200 ft above sea level.
