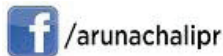

Incentive for enhancing rural road connectivity in state

ITANAGAR, April 6:

In a major push towards enhancing rural road connectivity in the state, the Centre has released an amount of Rs 22.74 crores to Arunachal Pradesh under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) as grant-in-aid.

The incentive has been given for best performance of the State in implementation of PMGSY during 2022-23 under set parameters. The funds released will be used for periodic maintenance of rural roads already constructed under PMGSY as per directives of Govt. of India.

During 2022-23, (till December 2022) a length of 1096.24 kms was constructed in the State including 61 long span bridges. Efforts of the state government in improving good quality construction with appropriate new technology and fund spent on maintenance & renewal of roads is considered for the financial incentives.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu while expressing gratefulness to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Rural Development Minister Giriraj Singh assured that the grant will be optimally and judiciously utilized.

He said that rural connectivity is a top priority of the state government and the grant would greatly help the state government in maintenance of already constructed PMGSY roads.

The Chief Minister also congratulated the state Rural Works Department for their good work, which has been recognized by the central government.

Ziro Valley has huge potential in tourism Industry: Khandu



ZIRO, April 6:

State Chief Minister Pema Khandu, on official tour to Lower Subansiri, Kamle, Upper Subansiri, West Siang and Shi Yomi districts had inaugurated the Tana Agyang View Point at Ziro on Wednesday, April 5, 2023.

Overlooking the Tahing Lampii cave, the project has been implemented by MGNREGA job card holders in tie-up with Tayang Sukung and Nago Arang gram panchayats. The innovative, revenue-earning model, supported

by Habung Welfare Society, is a fine example of convergence mode driven by the community.

Foundation Stone of the project was laid by Khandu in January last year.

Appreciating the Habung Welfare Society and the two gram panchayats of Tayang Sukung and Nago Arang for the novel initiative, Khandu said the project has set the trend of convergence mode of project implementation and urged others to follow suit.

"A total of Rs 20.75 lakhs was utilized for the project, which was sourced from various programs like the MGNREGA, 'My village, My development Plan', 14th FC Grant, APEDA, state govt resources and voluntary contributions from members of the Habung Welfare Society. This indeed is one of the best projects implemented through convergence mode. People of Ziro have shown a way forward," Khandu said.

Natung reviews construction of Sports Outdoor Stadium

AALO, April 6:

Mama Natung, Minister Sports & Youth Affairs, Water resources and Environment & Forest attended a review meeting regarding the long pending Sports Outdoor Stadium at Aalo here on Wednesday.

The Minister also inspected the outdoor stadium and later attended the review meeting on the progress and other issues of the outdoor stadium.

Minister Natung in his address had strongly directed the executing agencies to increase the labour force of minimum 150-200 with 24x7 working hours in shift wise and asked them to complete the outdoor stadium by October 2023. He said that there is no hindrance from public and fund is available at the department. He urged the Deputy Commissioner and Aalo Sports Department to physically monitor the work.

West Siang DC, Penga Tato assured the minister of logistic support from the District Administration.

Anurudin Singh, Secretary Sports & Youth Affairs discussed with the implementing agencies and also appealed the work agencies to complete the work as desired by the Minister.

Local MLA Kento Jini also appealed the agency to complete the project so that the sports lovers of West Siang can avail the facilities as early as possible.

Earlier, DSO Tumto loyi welcomed the dignitaries and highlighted the progress of ongoing project.

The construction of Aalo stadium was started during the year in 2016 and for two years construction was discontinued due to the Covid 19. During the recent visit of Chief Minister Pema Khandu on November last year at Aalo, the construction agency assured to complete the ongoing project of Aalo stadium within March 2023, but its yet to be completed.

Mein calls on Union Power Minister to discuss State's hydropower projects

ITANAGAR, April 6:

Deputy Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh Chowna Mein, along with the Advisor to the Government of Arunachal Pradesh Hari Krishna Palwal, called on to Union Power Minister RK Singh recently on March 31 last to discuss about the hydropower projects in the state, that are to be now undertaken by Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSUs), including NHPC, NEEPCO, SJVN and THDC.

They discussed about the fourteen major hydropower projects in the state, which did not register visible progress till date. Of these projects, five of them had their allotment to private developers cancelled due to a lack of progress; whereas eight projects registered very limited progress that could not be substantiated with much significance and also about the Demwe Lower Hydropower Project which is pending in NCLT.

The Deputy Chief Minister put forth the Arunachal Pradesh government's expectations and commitment pertaining to these projects, highlighting the need to expedite their respective development.

After a lengthy process of transferring these projects from private developers to the CPSUs, a final stage has almost been reached, as the

state cabinet granted approval to the Memorandums of Agreement (MoA) with the CPSUs during the recent cabinet meeting held in Itanagar this week. The signing of the respective MoAs is scheduled to take place next month.

The Union Power Minister highly appreciated the progress made by the State government so far in this direction and expressed his desires to personally visit Arunachal Pradesh to witness the signing of MoAs. He further emphasized that the commencement of these projects will lead to the overall development of the state in the form of infrastructure, social and economic upliftment, and will open up many opportunities for the local people. During the meeting, Singh also added that the development of hydropower in the state will result in a substantial rise in the income generation of the people, eventually leading to Arunachal Pradesh recording one of the highest per capita incomes in the country.

The Union Power Minister also congratulated the Deputy Chief Minister and his team for the significant progress made so far, while extending assurance of the Central Government's full support in the successful implementation of these projects which are to be undertaken by the CPSUs.

Mass rally organized demanding speedy trial of Tasso Grayu murder case

ZIRO, April 6:

A massive rally was organized demanding speedy trial and conviction of former Arunachal Times editor Tasso Grayu murder case at Padi Yubbe Outdoor Stadium here on April 3 last.

More than 2000 rallyists comprising family members, well-wishers, pan Tani NGO's, Tani SupungDukung (Apex Body of Apatani), Supung Jugo Council, SupungBulyang Council, Apatani Youth Association, Priest Association, gaonburas and gaonburis took part at the rally.

The rallyists demanded speedy trial, conviction and capital punishment to perpetrator of the murder of the octogenarian former editor of Arunachal Times and a prominent public figure of Ziro Plateau Tasso Grayu.

The rally started from Padi-Yubbe Outdoor Stadium (PYOS) covering Dani Kunia Higher Secondary

School, Pai Gate and Hapoli Township and culminated at the PYOS.

Several prominent public leaders and well wishers including former minister Padi Richo, former MLA Nani Ribia, APCC general secretary Nani Rajen, TSD President H.K Shalla, Supung Bulyang Council member Nani Tatung, ZPM's Tasso Tana and Hage Dolo, AYA general secretary Nani Tangu, GB Nani Hanya and Gaon Buri Duyu Otung spoke in favour of speedy trial, conviction and award of exemplary punishment to perpetrator of the crime.

On behalf of family members of Lt.Tasso Grayu, District Agriculture Officer and President of Hari Employees and Pensioner's Welfare Association (HEPWA) Tasso Butung thanked all the participants for taking part in the rally and exhibiting solidarity for the cause of Lt. Tasso Grayu.

CM inaugurates Tana Agyang View Point...

Rooting for the convergence mode in project implementation, the Chief Minister said it not only calls for participation of the local communities but also saves wastage of public money.

"If this same project would have been implemented under the sole jurisdiction of the state government in accordance with the old way of implementing projects, it would have cost the government exchequer not less than a crore," he observed.

Khandu assured that the promised fund for further development of the site would be released soon.

He said that once the project is further developed and completed, he would invite members of other communities to visit it for case study on convergence model. "Convergence model is the best way forward. People of rest of the communities should learn to take advantage of this model for development of their respective areas. I have been rooting for convergence model with all executing agencies of government departments, district administrations and community leaders since years," Khandu said.

He also released the case study report of the entire convergence mode involved in implementation of the said project.

On the occasion, the Chief Minister said tourism industry is the growth engine of an economy for a hilly state like Arunachal Pradesh and Ziro valley has huge potential in tourism industry, provided the god-gifted inherent natural charm of Ziro valley is maintained in its pristine glory.

Stating that a road map of tourism for Ziro valley was need of the hour for holistic growth of tourism industry which will not only benefit the people of Ziro valley but also the entire state, CM urged the people of the valley to maintain the pristine beauty of the valley.

"The wet rice paddy fields along with fish cultivation is the main charm of Ziro valley which is unique and nowhere practiced in other parts of the state. Tourists come to see this unique feature and hence people of Ziro should refrain from constructing dwelling houses and other commercial structures at the paddy fields", he appealed.

Appreciating the pluralistic Apatani society for being the torch bearer in the state showcasing support, cooperation and hand holding system which had paved the way for producing so many bureaucrats and technocrats, CM said Ziro valley had a very limited land but was blessed with god-gifted natural beauty which had tagged it as one of the most tourist centric places of the state.

Strongly appealing the Apatani civil societies, the Tani Supung Dukung, NGO's, Apatani Youth Association, panchayat leaders and the District Administration, CM Pema Khandu urged them to pool in together and device a solution to the rapidly increasing construction of structures at the wet rice paddy fields in the valley.

It may be mentioned here that Lower Subansiri Deputy Commissioner Bamin Nime had also repeatedly urged in various public platforms to halt the increasing trend of filling up the wet rice paddy fields with soil for the purpose of constructing dwelling and commercial houses. If this trend is not corrected timely and if the wet rice paddy fields of Ziro valley vanish in course of time, the much-hyped tourism potential of the valley would be lost forever and Ziro valley would remain just an ordinary town like others.

Among others, local MLA and Minister Agriculture and Allied Er.Tage Taki, MLA Liasam Simai, Lower Subansiri Deputy Commissioner Bamin Nime, Heads of Departments, panchayat leaders and public were present on the occasion.

tobacco product to persons under 18 years of age, according to the guidelines of COPTA-03 Sec-6.

The team comprising of CO Talo Moyong, District Consultant (DTCC) Nijali Tacho, Inspector (Tax, Excise and Narcotics) Nini Pasing,

Psychologist (DTCC) Miti Gammeng and Office Assistant(DTCC) Bolung Tatak searched and seized all tobacco products found in the shops and issued challans to 18 shopkeepers and collected an amount of ₹ 3600, for violation of rules.

Trading community urged to take part in curbing drug menace



TEZU, April 6:

Lohit Assistant Commissioner Himanshu Nigam has urged the trading community to take part in the administration's efforts to curb the drug menace in the district.

Addressing an 'awareness-cum-sensitization programme' on 'Prevention of drug and substance abuse among children and illicit trafficking' at the zonal hospital here on March 30, 2023, Nigam urged liquor shopkeepers and chemists to install CCTV cameras in their shops, and to never sell tobacco, cigarette, bidi or alcohol to underage children.

TDO Dr Asmi Mega said that "Lohit district being one of the vulnerable districts in the country in terms of substance and alcohol abuse, the district administration has taken up various programmes aimed at eradicating the drugs and substance abuse."

"Under the Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyan, various village-wise awareness campaigns have

been conducted by the district administration, in collaboration with the tax, excise & narcotics department, the NCB, and the police.

"Similarly, the COTPA Act has also been implemented in the district," Mega said.

DSO (IDSP) Dr S Towang spoke on drug abuse and the types of inhalants being abused by habitual drug users.

He said that "instances of road traffic accidents in the district are one of the highest in the state, and these accidents are caused due to the ill-effects of alcohol and substance abuse."

Dr Towang advised all the chemists not to sell any kind of drug (medicine) or syringe without any prescription from a licensed medical practitioner.

Drug Inspector Taloh Jamoh spoke on "Schedules H, H1, or X drugs," and said that the district administration is soon going to make it mandatory for all the pharmacies and chemist shops to install

CCTV cameras and digitise their registers for selling medicines, "so that a proper record is maintained and abuse of common medicines, if any, can be stopped."

Tezu WPS OC Bharati Mingki spoke about Sections 77 and 78 of the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015.

"Shopkeepers selling intoxicating liquor or narcotic substances to a child can be booked under Section 77 of the Juvenile Justice Act, 2015," she said.

DRCHO Dr Linya Lollen said that incidences of communicable diseases like Hepatitis B and C and HIV among users of intravenous injectable drugs are on the rise. He informed also about the availability of free screening for Hepatitis B and C, under the National Viral Hepatitis Control Programme, at the zonal hospital here.

The programme was conducted by the trade & commerce department, in collaboration with the health & family welfare department.

Monastic dances introduced



JANG, April 6:

Monastic dances, especially the dance of deities Palden Lhamo and Gonpo or Mahakala, were introduced in the Jang Palpung Zangdok Palri monastery here in Tawang district on March 30 last.

tradition and culture to us and its our responsibility now to hand it over to coming generation without it being diluted. The present generation parents and teachers have very important role and responsibility to play in this regard he added.

DDSE Tawang, Hridhar Phuntsok said that the new education policy also stresses on education with good moral and kind heartedness, asked the teachers to implement whatever is learnt in the training at grass root level. DDSE echoed Chairman DoKAA and said preservation of our own dialect is important without which we are losing our identity.

One of the resource person of the SEE Learning, Thupten Kalden, said SEE learning is basically to learn how to practice warm heartedness without having any religious affinity, which in turn will be beneficial

to all. He further informed that initially the SEE Learning programme was launched by the Dalai Lama w.e.f 4-6 April 2019 at Delhi.

In the beginning training was given in 14 languages, and after review meeting in December 2022 it is now covering 22 languages with 44 countries and there is two SEE learning centre in India.

Digitalization: A sui generis catalyst of Indian economy

Indispensability of digitalization as a foundational rail to almost every activity in an economy is well acknowledged. Growing internet penetration, affordable data, technological innovations, and above all, the government's thrust on building digital infrastructure is ensuring faster delivery, better targeting, and improved accountability.

The Digital Impact

During the period 2014-2019, India's core digital economy increased from 5.4% to 8.5% of GVA. The digital economy grew 2.4 times faster than the overall economy during the same period. The digitally dependent economy accounted for around 22% of the total economy in 2019, as per an RBI bulletin recently published.

The government's emphasis has been on developing Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) which,

- ensures public availability of digital components for more participative service delivery systems,
- triggers market-led innovations,
- facilitate more affordable & faster on-boarding of services, and
- ensures development of more transparent systems and thus increased user trust.

The cascading effect of Digital India geared towards improving accessibility, affordability, connectivity, and inclusivity is now visible across India. Aadhaar, a key component of digital infrastructure, through its inherent virtue of uniqueness has become an important tool of digital governance in the country. Nearly 1700 welfare and good-governance schemes of the central and state governments using Aadhaar is a testimony to that. Use of Aadhaar has ensured benefits reaching the intended beneficiaries without leakages. For example in PDS, significant reduction in diversion of grains owing to computerized supply chain management, removal of nearly 47 mn fake/duplicate ration cards af-

ter Aadhaar seeding of 750 mn PDS beneficiary data and automation of fair price shops resulted into savings worth USD 12 bn. Similarly, in cooking gas subsidy scheme (PAHAL), savings worth USD 8.5 bn and under farmer support scheme, a reduction of 12 mn metric tons of fertilizer sale to retailers resulting into a saving of USD 1.2 bn have been recorded.

Increasing Digital Penetration

The country currently having more than 1.17 bn mobile telecom subscribers, over 600 mn smartphone users and 840 mn internet connections, a 200 percent increase in rural internet subscriptions between 2015 and 2021 as against 158% increase in urban areas, covering all villages with at least 4G mobile services is set to further reduce the rural-urban digital divide. Efforts are also underway to make the low-cost feature mobile phones even more powerful capability-wise; thus, making the digital economy more inclusive.

The recently launched 'Digital India BHASHINI' project seeks to enable easy access to the internet and digital services in regional languages, including voice-based access, is poised to take care of the diversity of languages with aim to provide for solutions in a medium that people can intuitively relate to.

Digital Inclusion driving Formalization

Digitalization accelerates economic growth through higher financial inclusion, greater formalization, increased efficiencies and enhanced opportunities. Some of the successful digital public infrastructure supporting this endeavour include Aadhaar, UPI, Co-Win, DigiLocker, Diksha etc. In terms of the scale achieved, more than 94.5% of country's population now have Aadhaar; and more than 2.2 bn Aadhaar authentications is happening per month. Similarly 5.5 bn UPI-based payment transac-

tions with a 75-fold increase in last 5 years are made every month; 1.1 bn CoWin registrations; 140 mn users with a DigiLocker account and 5.6 bn official digital documents available in the DigiLocker repository; registration of 286.5 mn unorganized workers on e-shram portal, 4.4 mn street vendors on PM-SVANidhi and 12.7 mn enterprises on Udyam portal; increase in GST payers base from 7 mn to 14 mn during 2017 to 2022 etc. are indicative of how things are shaping up.

Open and Participative Digital Innovations

In India, the supportive environment for innovation by both, government and private players is driving innovations in the digital space. In the domain of new-age technologies such as AI/ML, India is a top contributor to open-source AI projects. For instance, AI publications from India are growing at 18%, faster than the US, China, EU and the UK. A higher percentage of IT workers in India possess AI skills than any other G20 country.

The government, on its part, is also actively collaborating with industry for designing and testing newer applications/use-cases through a stream of their own captive sandboxes and test-beds. The role of iSpirt for IndiaStack open public platforms, NPCI for fast digital payments, ONDC for open digital commerce, the user entities in the UIDAI ecosystem are some of the examples of the PPP model is speeding up digitalization.

India has realized the imperative of using, to the extent possible, standards, technologies and tools that are essentially open-source thus avoiding vendor lock-in and high costs associated with use of proprietary technologies. At the same time, this strategy is also encouraging interoperability among and scalability of, various solutions built on top of open tools, while enabling affordability.

The projects include - a multi-purpose hall, an outdoor gym, ladies barrack, M.T. garage, upgraded solar plant, type IV quarter, a guest house & a computer lab.

Inaugurating the projects, the DCM mentioned that the funds provided by the government have been judiciously utilized and thanked the young and competent Commandant Smt. Akhansha Yadav for her zeal to work for the upliftment of the battalion through efficient and judicious use of funds.

He also highlighted that the new infrastructures and facilities are expected to boost the morale of the 2nd IRBN personnel and enhance their ability to protect the state from unlawful activities. Vibrant Village, Jemeithang – A glance



JEMEITHANG, April 6:

Jemeithang under Tawang district is one of the last administrative headquarters of India towards Indo-Tibet border. The area is traditionally known as PANG-CHHEN, which means the people living in this area have taken vow not to commit the ten major sins as per Buddha's teachings and the people are called as Pangchenpa's. Historically, the six cluster of villages known as Pangchhen Ding gro formed the Pangchhen Tso.

Jemeithang is now covered under vibrant village programme and with this, the District Administration Tawang is geared up to facilitate tourists visiting Jemeithang and the Indian Army and other security forces are also extending cooperation in making Jemeithang vibrant.

Traditionally, it is believed that the first Queen of Monpa King Kalawangpo was from Jemeithang area. Her name was Hachang, but it is told that Queen Hachang was a demigod-

dess.

The Gorzam Stupa at Gorzam village is one of the oldest monument which dates back to 12th Century AD. The Stupa was constructed by one Sangey Drathar of Kharman village. An evil spirit (Sada Dugpachen) had been creating nuisance to the public using Gorzam, a stone bridge over Nyamjang river. So to subdue that evil spirit Sangey Drathar constructed the Stupa over that stone bridge.

The Lumpo/Lhunpo village in Jemeithang circle is an example of tobacco free village. Nawang Chot-ta, the Gaon burah of this village for last 35 years, proudly informed that he and his villagers are following the instructions given to them by their forefathers and religious gurus by not using any kind of tobacco product in their village. Tobacco is harmful for human as well as all sentient being that comes in contact with it, and its a sin for us to use this poison, he added. Kenzamani in Jemeithang is

the place from where His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama Gyalwa Tenzin Gyatso entered India on 31st March 1959 leaving behind his country. The walking stick used by him on his long journey from Ihasa to Kenzamani was planted here at Gorong Kukpa and has grown into a beautiful tree, now people visit this place to see this holy tree and take blessings from it.

The Baa-Chham, Shawa Chham, and unique Aji Lhamo dance are some of the most beautiful dances performed by almost every village of Jemeithang. Some of the historical figures who contributed in making of present Jemeithang and Tawang were Tantrik Mahasiddhas Terton Jigme Lingpa, Lama Teugyi Purygen, Khenpo Choitsal Rabjor and Sangey Drathar etc.

Besides all these, Jemeithang valley has beautiful natural sceneries; the black necked cranes migrate to Brokyenthang village adding more colour to its beauty.
