It is reported that properties worth lakhs of rupees and local beads have been lost in the incident. Cause of the fire is yet to be known, however no loss of life has so far been reported, reports DIPRO.

State Chief Secretary Shri Dharmendra visited some important places of East Siang District on Sunday, April 23 last.

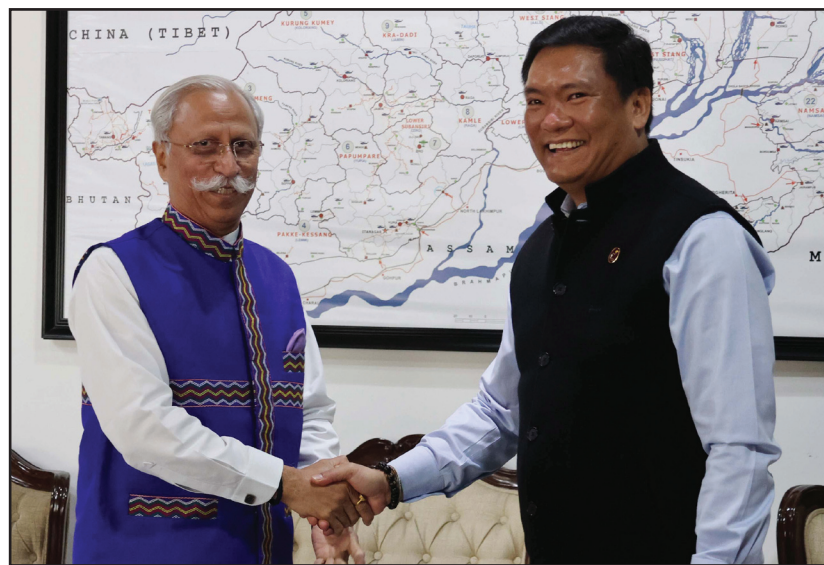
