State Cabinet discusses on a record number of 33 agenda points;

Approves creation of Itanagar Range Police administration for effective law & order



ITANAGAR, June 1:

The State Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Pema Khandu, met for the 9th time this year on Wednesday, May 31, 2023 and discussed on a record number of 33 agenda points.

The Cabinet approved a one-time relaxation of 2(two) years beyond prescribed upper age limit of 22 years for filling up of vacant posts of constables advertised by the APSSB vide Recruitment Notice No APSSB-13/6/2023 dated 03/05/2023. This step will give more opportunities to the aspiring youth seeking employment in the state police force.

The Cabinet has approved the Under-14 Indrajit Namchoom Annual Football League and the Monduro Cycling Event as Annual Calendar Event. This will give a fillip to young sporting talents of the state.

To ensure effective law and order and safety and security of law abiding citizens of the state capital, the Cabinet has approved creation of Itanagar Range Police administration, headed by a DIG with three SP level officers.

The Cabinet felt the need to develop and strengthen the State Administrative Institute (ATI) to train Direct Recruit government employees including gazetted officers at higher level such as the State Civil Services Officers and other senior level officers. It today approved creation of 4 posts of Deputy Director (Faculty) for ATI.

In order to cater to the three upcoming ITIs, one each at Lungla, Pangin and Kanubari, the Cabinet approved creation of 80 posts. The three ITI's will provide Skill Develop-

ment Training to a minimum of 600 youths of Arunachal Pradesh every year.

Cabinet further approved the post of Legal Remembrancer-cum-Secretary, Justice, for efficient and prompt handling of legal matters of the state government by creation of two wings in the existing Law, Legislative and Justice department and creation of three posts thereof. Further, it approved the denotification of 33 obsolete Ordinances/Acts to ensure reduction of compliance burden.

To ensure timely release of convicts after grant of bail, the Cabinet approved amendment of Arunachal Pradesh Prison Manual 2017. This will do away with the delay faced in release of convicts after grant of bail.

Lower Subansiri celebrates International Year of Millets

ZIRO, June 1:

The International Year of Millets was celebrated in a befitting manner at Abotani Hall on Tuesday, May 30.

Organized by the Department of Agriculture, the event included one-day awareness campaign on the importance of millets, exhibitions and display of millet food products, farmers' awareness and interaction sessions with scientists and subject experts and buyer sellers' meet.

Inaugurating the event, Lower Subansiri Deputy Commissioner Bamin Nime said millet was once upon a time considered poor man's food in comparison to rice. However, with the change of time and food habits, millets have now become an essential food item considering its high nutritional and health benefits, he explained. Nime also informed that he is an avid advocate of the 'vocal for local' concept and serves snacks made out of millets and local rice powder to guests at District Secretariat and Subansiri Sadan.

Exhorting the farmers to take up millet cultivation seriously particularly Ziro farmers in face of paucity

of land at Ziro valley, Nime also appealed the unemployed youth to take up farming for their self-employment and income generation in face of declining white-collared jobs.

Highlighting the importance of the day, Lower Subansiri District Agriculture Officer Tasso Butung informed that the United Nations General Assembly had declared 2023 as the International Year of Millets (IYM) which was a vision and initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The DAO informed that Lower Subansiri had been given the opportunity to host the meet involving farmers from the five Districts of Lower Subansiri, Upper Subansiri, Kamle, Kra-Dadiand Kurung Kumey. He also informed that similar awareness campaigns at the block levels would soon be conducted at Yazali, Yachuli, Talo and Param Putu circles.

Explaining further importance of millet, the DAO informed that millet was a 'hardy crop' which is perfect for cultivation at a hilly state like Arunachal Pradesh.

Union culture ministry organises cultural exchange programme



JEMEITHANG, June 1:

The union culture ministry organised a cultural exchange programme, themed 'Explore culture, cuisine, heritage and vibrant villages of India', here in Tawang district from 28-29 May.

Fifteen students from Bhubaneswar, Odisha, along with officials of the union culture ministry, led by its consultant Gauri Basu, members of the NEZCC, and officials from the Arunachal Pradesh art & culture directorate participated in

the programme.

Interacting with the visitors, Deputy Commissioner Kesang Ngurup Damo informed them that, "till April this year, there has been 67,000 tourist visits to Tawang."

He added, however, that "the tourists visiting Tawang have only four places to visit – Bumla, Jhonga-tser, Sela Pass and the Tawang monastery – whereas Jemeithang area, which is still unexplored and has so much potential for tourist attraction, is left out."

"Namka-chhu – the place where the first bullets of the 1962 war were fired – and Kenzamani, from where the Dalai Lama entered India in 1959, besides the 12th century old Gorzam stupa, beautiful waterfalls, and centuries old shrines are all in Jemeithang area, and tourists visiting Tawang must visit these places," he said, and expressed hope that Jemeithang would come up as an important tourist destination in the near future.

Mein holds preparatory meet for upcoming 24th TCC / RPC meeting



TAWANG, June 1:

Deputy Chief Minister Arunachal Pradesh Chowna Mein held a preparatory meeting on Thursday, May 25 to discuss the upcoming 24th TCC (Technical coordination sub-committee) and RPC (Regional Power Committee) meeting of the North East Regional Power Committee (NERPC). The meeting is scheduled to take place on 15th-16th June 2023 in Tawang.

After assuming the role of NERPC Chairman, this is the first official meeting chaired by DCM Mein. The primary objective of the preparatory meeting was to oversee the preparations for the upcoming TCC

and RPC Meeting with the goal of facilitating interrupted power supply in the region and identifying bottlenecks in the process.

During the meeting, SE Nangkong Perme (E) SO & PSC made a detailed presentation of the program through powerpoint presentation.

The NERPC comprises 24 constituent members including the seven North Eastern States and Hydropower developers. They are responsible for coordinating and managing various aspects of power generation, distribution and consumption within Northeast India. It is important to note that RPCs play a crucial role in ensuring the reliable and efficient

supply of electricity, promoting inter-regional cooperation and addressing issues related to power infrastructure, grid stability, energy planning and policy development.

The preparatory meeting was attended by Advisor to Minister (Power), Balu Raja, Advisor to DCM, Anupam Tangu, Chairman Technical Coordination Sub-Committee, Ginko Linggi, Director NERPC, S Aimol and Superintendent Engineers (Power), Nangkong Perme and T K Tara.

The forthcoming 24th TCC and RPC meeting of NERPC in Tawang is expected to be attended by around 100 delegates.

DC Papum Pare holds meeting with Lakhimpur DC

YUPIA, June 1:

Papum Pare DC Cheechung Chukhu held a meeting with his North Lakhimpur (Assam) counterpart Sumit Sattawan in North Lakhimpur on Friday, May 26.

World Bicycle Day

In April 2018, the United Nations General Assembly declared June 3 as World Bicycle Day. The resolution for World Bicycle Day recognizes "the uniqueness, longevity and versatility of the bicycle, which has been in use for two centuries, and that it is a simple, affordable, reliable, clean and environmentally fit sustainable means of transport."

Founding

Professor Leszek Sibiński (who is a Polish social scientist working in the United States) led a grassroots campaign with his sociology class to promote a UN Resolution for World Bicycle Day, eventually gaining the support of Turkmenistan and 56 other countries. The original UN Blue and White #June3WorldBicycleDay logo was designed by Isaac Feld and the accompanying animation was done by Professor John E. Swanson. It depicts bicyclists of various types riding around the globe. At the bottom of the logo is the hashtag #June3WorldBicycleDay. The main message is to show that the bicycle belongs to and serves all of humanity.

Significance

World Bicycle Day is a special day meant to be enjoyed by all people regardless of any characteristic. The bicycle as a symbol of human progress and advancement "[promotes] tolerance, mutual understanding and respect and [facilitates] social inclusion and a culture of peace." [3] The bicycle further is a "symbol of sustainable transport and conveys a positive message to foster sustainable consumption and production, and has a positive impact on climate."

World Bicycle Day is now being associated with promoting a healthy lifestyle for those with Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes.

KOMKAR, June 1:

The Cabinet also granted one-time relaxation of hard belt posting criteria of 2 years (as prescribed in APCS Rules 2018) to the APCS (Senior Grade) and APCS (Entry Grade) officers who were promoted vide order dated 01.05.2023.

For 100% saturation, 13 social welfare schemes were reviewed by the Cabinet. These include PMAY (Urban and Rural), Jal Jeevan Mission, Ayushman Bharat, PMGSY, Kisan Samman Nidhi, Jivan Jyoti Beema Yojna, Swamitva, Bharat Net, Soil Health Card, Kisan Credit Card (Agri, Animal Husbandry and Fisheries), Atal Pension Yojna and SVANidhi.

The Cabinet also approved amendments in the recruitment rules with regard to departments of Art & Culture, Forest and Home.

It also approved restructuring of the work force in PWD aimed to enhance the department's work efficiency.

Millet, which is more nutritious than rice due to its high food value content can be grown in any place either plain or hilly and it does not require much water and fertilizers to grow, he explained.

Outlining the upcoming further activities, the DAO informed that during May and June the Department would be training the farmers on millet harvesting, threshing, post-harvest techniques, awareness and training on value addition, processing, packaging and branding. During July, August and September farmers would be trained on sorting, grading, and packaging while field visits, monitoring, stakeholders meet and exploring markets would also be organized. During October, November and December there would be state and district level review of the programme, pilot project on setting up of processing units in potential Districts, evolve marketing strategy and review of the activities and plan for sustaining the growth of millets for future.

Chaturvedi, farmers, members of several SHG's and millet lover citizens of the District attended the meet.

Lungla ADC Tashi Dhondup said that "it is a rare opportunity for all of us to see cultural performance from other parts of the country in such a remote area."

DC convenes meeting on monsoon preparedness; advocates identifying vulnerable places



YUPIA, June 1: DC Papum Pare, Cheechung Chukhu on Thursday, May 25 convened a meeting to review the monsoon preparedness with all the departments concerned, along with State Disaster Response Force and the National Disaster Response force at the DC Conference hall, Yupia.

The DC said, "Vulnerable places, which are susceptible to landslides and floods should be identified. Proper warning system has to be in place to effectively alert the citizens on any eventualities", after reviewing the Disaster response preparations by all the departments

Instructing DDMO and NEEPCO to install signage at all vulnerable places along the Pare river he added that "Along the Pare river, specific areas like Kasel in Midpu and Bohapahar in Tigdo are like death traps, where more than 20 cases of

drowning have been reported in the past few years. Out of these cases, 90 percent are outsiders, unaware of the river's turbulence and the water release timings from the Pare dam. Specific signage has to be installed in these places to prevent the youngsters from venturing into dangerous areas."

Lauding the Automatic Early warning system (AEWS) installed by NEEPCO at Dam site, Jampa village, Chiputa, Doimukh (NEEPCO colony), Banderdewa (near police station) and power house DC Chukhu suggested for exploring options to issue warnings for other disasters as well.

While discussing about mushrooming of resorts and restaurants on the banks of the Pare reservoir without any safety SOP in place, DC Cheechung Chukhu assured to discuss the matter with all the stakeholders and ensure a safety SOP is

formulated.

He also suggested for ensuring Miniature circuit breakers (MCBs) are installed in all commercial shops to prevent fire accidents by electric short circuits.

DDMO, Nima Tashi elaborated the roles and responsibilities of the responsible departments and sought cooperation from all in mitigating any disaster.

Further highlighting the role of 'Apda Mitras' DDDMO Tashi informed that "Papum Pare has the highest number of Apda Mitras in the state."

"Apda mitras are trained community volunteers who will assist the District Administration during disasters", he further informed.

Among others ADC (HQ) abang Bodung, HoDs, Admin Officers, representatives from SDRF, NDRF, NEEPCO and Pare Hydro projects attended the meeting.

Lowang inaugurates smart School under project 'Digi-Kaksha'



DEOMALI, June 1: DoTCL Minister Wangki Lowang inaugurated a smart school under 'Project Digi-kaksha' at the government upper primary school in NTC here in Tirap district on Saturday, May 27.

Digi-kaksha is a first-of-its-kind project in any government school of the state, the Tirap DIPRO informed.

"It has a 4K HD interactive android teaching board, which will revolutionise teaching and learning pedagogy. The smart school will have pre-loaded (offline and online) creative learning content for the learners from nursery to Class 12, based on the CBSE curriculum," the DIPRO said, and added that "the use of phonetics, animated and real-life concept videos will empower even the children with special needs at the early stages."

Opium smeared clothes, 3.77

gms of brown sugar, and 45,000 Myanmar Kyat were seized during the first raid from their possession.

The Changlang SP commended the GBs, mahila groups and youths of Vijaynagar for taking a proactive role in the fight against the drug menace in the remote circle.

The thirty bedded hospital currently has nine indoor patients. At an average, 8-9 patients receive treatment as outdoor patients daily.

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CM reviews status of road projects



ITANAGAR, June 1:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu, on Thursday, May 25 took a detailed review on status of road projects being executed by the state departments of Highways, Public Works, Rural Works and Urban Development in the state.

While emphasizing on quality and timely completion of all under progress road projects, Khandu urged the engineers, especially the Chief Engineers of all zones and divisions, to check the practice of compiling DPRs (Detail Project Reports) with exuberant budget estimates.

He pointed that most of the DPRs prepared by departmental engineers always tend to be on the higher side of actual cost of the project.

"Yes we need roads and other developmental projects. But we must always consider the financial capabilities of the state government while preparing DPRs. I have seen DPRs of bridges of smaller proportions costing more than those executed by agen-

cies like the BRO of much bigger proportions. Concerned chief engineers should review and revise such exuberant DPRs before submitting to the government," he advised.

He suggested that relevant technology of road construction - as per the geographical and topographical conditions of the place - must be adopted to maintain quality and longevity of the project and check cost escalation during construction.

Khandu also advised the secretaries and particularly the chief engineers to physically visit the work-in-progress sites once a month. He said this will not only keep the pace of work in tune and ensure quality, but also boost the morale of junior level officers and staff working on the ground.

He also called upon them to keep a check on any allegations or complaints of corruption involving their officers and insisted on 'zero tolerance' towards any kind of corrupt practices.

Discussing on the maintenance and revamping of existing roads under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive State Road Development Plan (CMC-SRDP), Khandu suggested the PWD to complete all the ongoing projects before entertaining new proposals within this financial year. He assured that the requisite fund for this would be made available by the state government.

Reviewing the status of PMGSY roads, executed by the RWD, Khandu said the department needs to concentrate more on the districts of East Kameng, KurungKumey, Kra-Dadi and Upper Subansiri as the data presented showed that most of the unconnected villages fall in these districts.

Meanwhile, the Highways (PWD) informed that as the Trans Arunachal Highway is near completion, the focus now is on the Frontier Highway and Inter Connectivity Corridor projects, which were recently approved by the Centre.

The Frontier Highway is proposed to begin from Bomdila in West Kameng and end at Vijaynagar in Changlang covering a distance of 1748 kms. Parts of this highway will be executed by NHIDCL and BRO besides state PWD.

On the other hand, the union ministry of Road, Transport and Highways has identified six inter connectivity corridors to connect NH-52 (now NH-15) in Assam with the Trans Arunachal Highway (NH-13) and the proposed Frontier Highway (NH-913).

The review meeting was attended by RWD Minister Honchun Ngamdam and top officials of PWD, Highways, RWD and UD.

GOC 4 Corps calls on the Governor

The General Officer Commanding, 4 Corps, Tezpur, Lt. General Manish Erry, AVSM, SM called on the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. Lower Subansiri on war footing fighting mode on garbage menace



ZIRO, June 1:

The Lower Subansiri District Administration is on a war footing mode to fight the chronic garbage menace affecting the District Hq. for the past several months.

Team UD&H led by Assistant Engineer-cum-DLRSO Chakpu Raju on Thursday, May 25 cleared the tons of garbages dumped at the entrance gate of the Swachh Destruction Machine at Hong village recently.

Around 20 vehicles of dumped garbage had piled up at the site and team UD&H comprising 15 members including safai karamcharis, sweepers, drivers and lifters cleaned up the garbage and segregated them from early morning till late afternoon.

After the primary and secondary segregations, garbage have been placed separately and scrap dealers can now come and pick up the dry garbage including metal and plastic wastes while wet garbage have been placed at the compost bins, informed Raju, while appealing

the people of Hong village to do primary segregation of garbage at their homes home prior to dumping.

He also informed that UD&H department is on the job to bring the defunct Swachh Destruction Machine to use which would be of great help in mitigating the garbage problem to an extent.

Meanwhile, the UD&HAE further informed that a RRR (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle) centre is also coming up at the UD&H complex near LBS school on temporary basis similar to the ones of Deomali and other places in the state. The RRR center was cleaned in the morning to be pressed into service.

An RRR center is a one stop solution for citizens, institutions, commercial enterprises etc. to deposit or donate unused or used plastic items, cloths, footwear, books and toys. Once collected, these items would be handed over to different stakeholders to be refurbished or reused by converting them into new products.

While appreciating the efforts of team UD&H led by Chakpu Raju,

Lower Subansiri Deputy Commissioner Bamin Nime said the District Administration is aware of the problems and concerns of citizens of the district in respect of garbage problem and assured to leave no stone unturned in mitigating the chronic problem sooner than later.

"The garbage management at our District is doable and it requires only will power and dignity of labour, he said, while adding we will explore every possible solution including replicating an RRR center from other place or any other solution which would augment in mitigating the problem.

Nime further informed that the RRR center would be funded from DC's untied fund instead of waiting for Govt. funds which is tedious and time taking.

The DC also informed that the District Administration would organize another secondary garbage segregation programme at Rachi towards Kardo on May 27 where participants would be distributed free hand gloves.
