Governor extends World Blood Donor Day greetings

ITANAGAR, June 13:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General K.T.Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) has extended his warm greetings to the people of the State on the occasion of World Blood Donor Day. He expressed his hope that the occasion will raise awareness of the need for regular blood donation to ensure the availability of quality blood for people in need of it.

The Governor, who is the President of the Indian Red Cross Society, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch said that the requirement for blood transfusions, whether due to accidental blood loss or for therapeutic reasons, is a common and urgent necessity. Given the current state of medical science, blood cannot be artificially produced or stored indefinitely. Thus, blood donation has become a continuous obligation to support life-saving efforts, he said.

The Governor complimented all the Blood Donors of Arunachal Pradesh on the special occasion for their precious gift of blood to the blood needy people. He also appealed to every able-bodied person, within the permissible age health limits, to donate blood.

Swearing-in ceremony held Pema Khandu takes oath as State's Chief Minister for 3rd term

Pema Khandu took oath as the chief minister of Arunachal Pradesh for the third consecutive term on Thursday, June 13 here at Dorjee Khandu State Convention Centre.

Khandu, who was re-elected unopposed from the Mukto constituency of Tawang district, was sworn in by Governor K.T. Parnaik in the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, BJP president J.P.

Nadda, Union Parliamentary Affairs & Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma and Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang, among others.

Eleven other MLAs were also sworn in as Ministers at the function held in the Dorjee Khandu State Convention Centre. Among them were Deputy CM Chowna Mein, former Assembly Speaker P.D. Sona, BJP State president Biyuram

Wahge, and Dasanglu Pul, the widow of former CM Kalikho Pul.

While Dasanglu Pul is the lone woman Minister, the new Cabinet has eight fresh faces. The others inducted into the Cabinet include Palin MLA Balo Raja, Kanubari's Gabriel Denwang Wangsu, Panging legislator Ojing Tashing, Kento Jini of Aalo East and Nyato Dukam, who won the Taliha seat unopposed.

New Cabinets rolls out Reform 3.0

ITANAGAR, June 13:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu after being sworn-in on Thursday, June 13, immediately got to work by convening the first Cabinet meeting in the afternoon and lay the foundation for building a Viksit Arunachal in the next five years.

Building on the foundations laid by the Pema Khandu Government in the past few years, the new Government has pledged itself to a transformative reform agenda for the next 5 years. As the first step of this journey, the Cabinet today rolled out Reforms 3.0, identifying 24 citizen centric initiatives as part of the transformative journey touching citizens lives and aspirations and directed all Departments to implement these initiatives in letter and spirit.

Top priority has been accorded to Governance Reforms with decision to achieve 100% digitalization of the Finance and Planning Departments to enable all Government payments only through digital mode. Bottom-up Planning process will be initiated for effective development and preparation of district-level consultative Vision Plans. To improve last mile service delivery, Offices of the Divi-

sional Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners will be strengthened. Committee of Secretaries will be set up to examine the existing compliances and recommend steps to enhance ease of living and ease of doing business including repeal of old and archaic laws.

The Cabinet approved creating a Golden Repository of citizen data of the State to ensure pro-active scheme enrolment with no/minimal enrolment process for citizens. A policy think tank, Institute for Transforming Arunachal (ITA) will be constituted to drive innovation in governance and enable socio-economic transformation.

Further, an Administrative Reforms Commission will be notified to examine and provide recommendations for improved organizational structure, recruitment and staffing policies to build a lean, efficient and agile administrative structure with maximum adoption of technology.

In order to provide enhanced quality of life to citizens, the Cabinet resolved to ensure 100% physical and digital connectivity to all unconnected villages and

CM Khandu approves release of Rs 100 crore fund under CMSS

ITANAGAR, June 13:

After being sworn-in as Chief Minister for the third consecutive term, Pema Khandu signed the first file approving release of fund to the tune of Rs 100 crore under the Chief Minister's Social Security Scheme (CMSSS) benefitting about 80000 beneficiaries across the state on Thursday, June 13.

Guided by the principles of Antyodaya, the State Government is dedicated to the most vulnerable and marginalized section of the society. CMSSS, a state flagship scheme, provides pension to old-age persons above 60 years, widows and divyang jan. The funds approved will help enhancing the quality of life and providing a dignified way of living for these sections of the society. This is also a testament to the compassionate and citizen-centric governance model of the State Government.

Signing the file, Khandu said that a scheme that benefits the vulnerable sections of the society should



be continued without hindrance.

"Considering the fact that preparation of state budget has been delayed due to the general elections, it is necessary that the benefits under CMSSS reach the needy beneficiaries at the earliest," he pointed.

During the last financial year

an amount of Rs 90 crore was allocated for the scheme benefitting 56030 old-age persons (above 60 years), 8782 widows and 3950 divyang jan (differently abled).

The Khandu government had launched the scheme in 2019 and money is deposited to the beneficiary's account through DBT route.

Progress of Kameng Cultural and Heritage Museum discussed

NYUKMADUNG, June 10:

A coordination meeting among the District Administration, Indian Army and members of the Indian Institute of Heritage (IIH) was held on Monday, June 10 at Nyukmadung to discuss the establishment and progress of the Kameng Cultural and Heritage Museum in Nyukmadung of the Dirang Sub-division of West Kameng District.

The representative of Indian Army outlined the museum's plans

and layouts, detailing additional facilities that will be available to the public. These include a children's park, souvenir store, cafeteria, Audio Video Hall (movie theatre), a traditional Monpa hut, etc.

The construction will be completed by the 1st of week of August, they added.

Dr. Darge Tsering elaborated on the details and history of various artifacts and traditional items col-

lected so far, donated by villagers, to Prof. (Dr.) Manvi Seth, Director/ Pro-Vice Chancellor and Head of the Department of Museology at IIH, and Dr. B.R. Mani, Vice Chancellor of IIH, Head of Archaeology Science, and Director General of the National Museum, GOI.

During a visit to the ongoing construction site, participants shared their views and ideas to enhance the overall project.

Hage Tarung, ADC Dirang, appealed to all sections of the district to actively participate in the donation drive to enrich the museum's collection.

Annual academic plan for schools prepared

School-wise CBSE examination results, including the results of the elementary government schools of Lower Siang district for the 2023-'24 academic session were reviewed, and an 'annual academic plan for the 2024-'25 academic session for enhancement of 10% in the CBSE results and overall academic performance of the district' was formulated during a coordination meeting held here on Friday, June 7.

required subject teachers in every school of the district have been provided as per the demandsof the principals and the headmasters of the district by recruiting guest faculty members."

"The poor performance of the students in the CBSE exams was due to lack of proper planning and lack of sensitisation of parents," he said,

and advised the heads of the schools to "ensure completion of courses within the month of December."

He urged the heads of schools to "conduct periodic tests and term examinations, including pre-board exams, as per the calendar of activities notified by the state's education directorate."

World Blood Donor Day

World Blood Donor Day (WBDD) is held on June 14 each year. The event was organised for the first time in 2004, by four core international organizations: the World Health Organization, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies; the International Federation of Blood Donor Organizations (IFBDO) and the International Society of Blood Transfusion (ISBT) to raise awareness of the need for safe blood and blood products, and to thank blood donors for their voluntary, life-saving gifts of blood. World Blood Donor Day is one of 11 official global public health campaigns marked by the World Health Organization (WHO), along with World Health Day, World Chagas Disease Day, World Tuberculosis Day, World Immunization Week, World Patient Safety Day, World Malaria Day, World No Tobacco Day, World Hepatitis Day, World Antimicrobial Awareness Week and World AIDS Day.

Transfusion of blood and blood products helps and save millions of lives every year. It can help patients who suffering from life-threatening conditions live longer and with higher quality of life, and supports complex medical and surgical procedures. It also has an essential, life-saving role in maternal and perinatal care. Access to safe and sufficient blood and blood products can help reduce rates of death and disability due to severe bleeding during delivery and after childbirth.

In many countries, there is not an adequate supply of safe blood, and blood services face the challenge of making sufficient blood available, while also ensuring its quality and safety.

An adequate supply can only be assured through regular donations by voluntary unpaid blood donors. The WHO's goal is for all countries to obtain all their blood supplies from voluntary unpaid donors by 2020. In 2014, 60 countries have their national blood supplies based on 99-100% voluntary unpaid blood donations, with 73 countries still largely dependent on family and paid donors.

World Blood Donor Day is celebrated every year by people around the world on June 14. It is celebrated on the birthday anniversary of Karl Landsteiner on June 14, 1868. Landsteiner was awarded the Nobel Prize for his discovery of the ABO blood group system.

Blood is a necessary resource for the planned treatments and the urgent interventions. It is helpful for patients who are suffering from life-threatening conditions for living longer and with a higher quality of life. It supports complex medical and surgical procedures.

Awareness programme on ill effects of drugs held

YINGKIONG, June 7:

DC Hage Lailang, said that, "it is very important to educate our children about ill effects of drugs and substance abuse which has become a threat to the society and a challenging global problem" while addressing the participants.

He further said that in order to keep district drug free District Administration along with District Police is always vigilant and had done tremendous work to eradicate and raise awareness on drug related cases in every villages and every corner to make society drug free and a better place to live for growing up generations.

Reiterating need for collective effort from every individuals of the society,

DC Lailang further said that administration, police and NGOs alone cannot fight it out unless and until there is all round support and cooperation to curb the menace of drugs in the society and so he requested each and every one come forward and inform DA and Police if they notice any drug peddlers and added "your one act of alertness can save many life".

Meanwhile, speaking on the importance of education, DC advised the students to stay away from drugs and maintain discipline, respect teachers, elders and concentrate on career to become a good human being and a good citizen in future.

Resource Person of the programme Kennedy Bagra, Mentor, Mother's Vision, Aalo who is well recognized crusader of drug menace in the state spoke and gave presentation on ill effects of the drugs and substance abuse. He elucidated on various facets of drug abuse and how it can prevented on time through self-awareness, family support

and collective effort from all stakeholders of the society. He advised youngsters to keep themselves engaged in sports and other creative works which they like to do to stay away from unwanted activities

Dr. Karo Teng, Senior Psychiatrist and MS, District Hospital Yingkiong-who was also present on the occasion spoke on signs and symptoms of drug addicts and its prevention. He also informed about ten bedded Drug De addiction Centre Yingkiong where drug addicts persons are given treatment free of cost.

APWWS, Yingkiong Unit General Secretary Kosiang Pangkam also spoke on the occasion and advised the students to be aware of the risks of taking drugs and said that never do anything where you don't feel comfortable with and always try to share with parents and trusted friends about the pressure and problems faced during any situation.

Principal, Lutni Perme also spoke and asked the students to spread message among their family and friends to

create more awareness besides asking them to not to remain mute spectators and immediately report to Principals if they notice any hints of drug use among their friends.

Among others attended the programme were DDSE, DD ICDS i/c, Teaching staffs and students.

Later on, the DC along with DD ICDS i/c CDPO Ojing Talam, Dr. Karo Teng and Kennedy Bagra visited and inspected Drug De-Addiction centre, Yingkiong wherein Kennedy Bagra gave orientation to the staffs and highlighted on how to improvise the monitoring system.

New Cabinets rolls out...

Administrative Headquarters for which a detailed action plan will be prepared. In line with the National Education Policy, 2020 that envisions universal access to education, improve learning outcomes and pass percentages of students, develop 21st century skills amongst students and improve efficiency and efficacy of teacher training, a implementation road map of the policy will be prepared.

The government will formulate a Policy enabling top educational institutions to setup campuses in Arunachal Pradesh and also encourage participation of Community Based Organizations, NGOs and other CSOs in the field of education. The Dulari Kanya Scheme will be revamped to provide incentive to every girl child from Arunachal Pradesh to encourage enrollment in Graduation or Professional Courses.

An action plan for 21,000 plus women to become LakhpatiDidis over the next 5 years, earning an annual income of more than Rs. 1,00,000 and achieve a higher standard will be made. The government will formulate a new farm-to-fork Agricultural and Horticultural Policy to unlocl the agri-allied sector potential of the state.

The Chief Minister Social Security Scheme will be revamped for wider coverage of beneficiaries and timely coverage of beneficiaries such as widows, elderly and Divyangsto ensure their dignity of life and improve their quality of life. The government will work towards 100% saturation of DBT for all Schemes ensuring targeted and timely payments to beneficiaries.

Digital Asset Inventory will be created for all public infrastructure, especially schools, hospitals (SHCs, PHCs, District Hospitals), Anganwadi Kendras etc. for proper planning and utilisation of public assets.

The Cabinet also decided to create a new Master Plan to make Itanagar-Naharlagun twin capital city future-ready and improve urban liveability.

To fulfil aspirations of the youth, the government will identify and list vacancies in all Departments for preparation of annual recruitment calendars. The SEE Trinity (Skill Development, Entrepreneurship, Employment) will be launchedto completely reorient the entire ecosystem in the interest of youth and provide 25,000+ employment and self-employment opportunities to the youths in next 5 Years. Besides launching the Arunachal Olympic Sports Mission enabling participation of sportspersons from Arunachal in 2028 and 2032 Olympic Games, the government will dedicate to the youth an innovative Youth Policy, focusing on youth aspirations, education, skilling, health including mental health, entrepreneurial aspirations, community involvement, participation in governance mechanisms etc.

In order to attract investment a new Arunachal Industrial Policy will be introduced by dovetailing with UNNATI Scheme launched by Government of India. Also on cards is notification of a new 'Arunachal Pradesh Handloom and Handicrafts Policy' and 'One Tribe, One Weave Mission' to protect and promote indigenous textiles, handicrafts which is expected to provide enhanced incomes for artisans, market linkages and enabling applications for Geographical Indication (GI) tags.

A new Tourism Policy will also be launched that will include film, farm, wine and eco-tourism and homestay to provide holistic experiences to domestic and foreign tourists and attract investments and provide employment opportunities for the youths.

The Cabinet recommended for appointment of a Pro-temSpeaker. The Council of Ministers also recommended for the commencement of the first Assembly Session of the 8thLegislative Assembly on 14th June 2024 for administrating Oath to Members of Legislative Assembly of Arunachal Pradesh and election of Speaker and Deputy Speaker.

Deputy Commissioner Rujum Rakshap in his speech reiterated the importance of education and the role of the teachers in shaping students' lives.

Drawing similarities between the life of an administrative officer and a teacher, he said that "no matter how hard the posting, you will always find the presence of both, and it is this experience that a teacher should most rejoice in, because teachers give it all to shape a brighter future."

He commended the DDSE for conducting themeeting at the beginning of the session, and emphasised the need for "reassessment of the teaching methodology and practices of GSS Kangku and GHSS Koyu, as their performance have been below average in the board exams with a pass percentage of 20 and 33, respectively."

Speaking on parents' preference for private schools over government schools, "even though the government schools have more highly qualified teachers than private schools," he said that "the fault is within the government schools themselves – be it lackadaisical attitude of the teachers, or choosing comfortable posting places, the school system is at fault and not the parents, which needs remedial and corrective measures."

The DC promised to reward the best performing school of the district from this session onwards, and stressed on increased involvement of administrative officers in the education sector.

Earlier, DEO (academic) in-charge Dajo Ngomle highlighted that "the pass percentage of the Class 10and Class 12 board exams were 59.30 and 74.42, respectively, "whereas it was 59.70% and 66.31% in the district in the 2022-'23 academic session."

"There has been no improvement in the Class 10 results and a slight improvement of 8.1% in the Class12 results," he informed.

The principals, vice principals and headmasters reported the performance of their respective schools, and gave assurance that they would perform better in this academic session.
