Chief Minister Health Emergency Life Protection Service launched



ITANAGAR, June 20

Giving a fresh boost to health services in the state, Chief Minister Pema Khandu on Tuesday, June 20 inaugurated a new initiative - Chief Minister Health Emergency Life Protection Service (CM HELPS) at Khando Drowa Sangmo District Hospital at Tawang in the presence of Hon MLAs Tsering Lhamu and Tsering Tashi, DC KN Damo and SP B Kamduk.

CM HELPS centre is second after TRIHMS, Naharlagun, which would cater to people residing in remote, tough terrains. The customized, affordable, accessible, quality emergency care would be a great help to patients for providing ease of medical service, said Chief Minister, Khandu in his speech on the occasion.

Arunachal Pradesh is a State having remote and dispersed habitation with rugged and tough terrain. Health emergencies often strike when patient and their families are mentally, physically, and financially vulnerable and not adequately prepared to cope with the situation, he said.

Reflecting further, the Chief Minister said: "There is a need for affordable, accessible, contextual, and quality emergency care, need to es-

tablish robust integrated emergency care service system. CM HELPS is an effort in that direction."

The Chief Minister said that State Government is upgrading and transforming casualty room/Emergency Unit of District Hospital Seppa, District Hospital Tawang, General Hospital Aalo, District Hospital Koloriang, District Hospital Longding to modern Emergency Care Centre and they will be launched before June end. In phases, emergency/casualty unit of all district hospitals in the state to be transformed.

He said that for the first time in the Health Department, a written Standard Operating Procedure has been framed for emergency units of District hospitals. An emergency area is a place where situations are dynamic and accordingly actions needs to be taken in real time which are often fast paced. Standard Operating Procedures provides a pre-formed framework over which such actions can be taken. It facilitates better work coordination and implementation.

He said that the State-of-Art Emergency and Trauma Centre at TRIHMS is ready and functional. It has dedicated CT scan, modular OT and diagnostic services exclusively for emergency patients. All beds in this emergency block are critical care services ready.

DAPORIJO, June 22:

"The people have been advised to avoid building in flood-prone and landslide-prone areas; move immediately to higher ground if there is any possibility of a flashflood; not enter into flood and landslide-prone areas during rains; refrain from touching electric poles and transformers; avoid travelling during extreme thunder and rain; avoid venturing into river for fishing, swimming etc, during the peak monsoon season."

The DDMA also advised the people to "keep things and appliances on higher grounds, keep safe drinking water and first aid box with necessary medicines, remain alert, and avoid rumours."

The authority advised the people to contact the district's emergency operation centre in +91 9485236667 "if struck by a disaster."

He said that Health Department has provisioned 26 Patient Transport Vehicle, 26 Mobile Medical Vehicle and 26 nos. of Oxygen cum Vaccine Carrier (one for each district) and 27 PM CARES PSA Plants installed have been installed

He said that medical oxygen pipeline has been installed in all District Hospitals and oxygen concentrator and oxygen cylinders have been made available in all districts. Oxygen beds are more than 1500. Training in oxygen therapy, oxygen devices, operation of psa plant, etc., has been done for all district hospital, he said.

The Chief Minister said that for refilling oxygen cylinders, currently our state is dependent on neighboring Assam. The Health Department is under process of setting up state-of-the-art Atmanirbhar oxygen grid.

64 ICU beds were established. To further increase critical care capabilities, 56 ICU beds, 33 Paediatric ICU beds, 40 Paediatric HDU (High Dependency Unit) beds are being added. Similarly, 90 nursing officers for critical and emergency care will be recruited soon, he said.

The Chief Minister announced that Cardiac Cath Lab will soon be launched at TRIHMS which will increase the capability of TRIHMS to handle cardiac emergencies. The setting up of National Emergency Life Support Skill Centre for imparting training on emergency care is under process at TRIHMS, he said.

The Chief Minister announced that 50 bed Critical Care Hospital has been approved for Pasighat. High-capacity diesel generator sets have been installed in 23 district hospitals. Further, Emergency Solar power back up has been established at 23 health facilities.

The Chief Minister said that operation and maintenance of critical care services requires huge resource and adequate number of skilled human resources. "Our government has embarked upon a journey of providing critical care services. Present effort, though may be found less than ideal, will serve as stepping stone in road to affordable, accessible and quality emergency and critical care," he said.

"Let us all come together and work together following the mantra – Sabka Saath, Sabka Prayas and Sabka Vikas," said Chief Minister Shri Khand

The multispectral consultative meeting which saw participation from PRI members, government officials, NGOs and SHGs sought inputs for preparing the State Action Plan for conserving nature, promoting sustainable use of nature and adopting sustainable development pathways.

Addressing the gathering, Deputy Commissioner Cheechukhu suggested for seeking inputs from the people at the grassroot level for framing the SBSAP as he believed that 'it is the livelihood of the people at the last mile which are affected most by conservation plans and programs' and that a middle pathway needs to be worked out to balance conservation and livelihood activities.

He also called for denouncing the lackadaisical attitude towards de-

forestation and urged all to help maintain the state's green cover.

Ranju Dodum, Senior Program Officer, WWF while highlighting the importance of biodiversity conservation in Arunachal Pradesh and the role of the SBSAP in ensuring sustainable development and protection of flora and fauna in the region, informed that similar workshops are being conducted in all the districts to obtain inputs from all the stakeholders before finalising the SBSAP.

District Agriculture Officer, Maze Peil called for promoting and conserving indigenous germplasm, government support for land terracing to discourage jhum cultivation and installation of fish ladders in the dams to replenish fish from downstream to upstreams.

Liamkham Afi, BMM, ArSLM Doimukh suggested for adopting 'endangered animal, plant, bird, butterflies etc as mascots for each district, while narrating how the 'hilllock gibbon' an endangered species was protected and multiplied after it was declared the

state animal in Tirap district.

ZPC Nabam Yakum, ZPM Sangdupota Tok Hina, DPDO, Bengia Yakar, ArSLM BMMs Takhe Ampu, Techhi Nadam and Gyamar Kampung, DHO Tobom Bam, DVO Dr. Monya Kato Jini, Dr. Bamin Yakha, Research Officer also presented their views.

They raised concerns regarding the lack of awareness on conservation activities and funds, the need for marketing linkages and employment generation, the need to protect local wildlife, such as Mithuns and local fishes and also the need to protect the natural drinking water sources.

Constitution of Biodiversity Conservation Committee s/ boards at the Gram Panchayat level was also discussed during the meeting and directives were issued to the DPDO to expedite the formation of the committee for onward submission to the government.

The meeting concluded with vote of thanks from Dolma Wangjom, EAC.

NSCN (K-YA) members arrested, drug cache seized

LONGDING, June 22:

The Khonsa (Tirap) battalion of the Assam Rifles and the Longding police in a joint operation arrested three NSCN (K-YA) operatives and seized a large cache of drug and cash from two villages in Wakka circle of Longding district on 17 and 18 June.

The operation was launched based on an input regarding the presence of suspected NSCN (K-YA)

operatives near Wakka town. The trio was arrested from Wakka and Khanu villages with heroin-based narcotic substance worth approximately Rs 7 lakhs.

The operatives were carrying the narcotic substance procured from the border areas via Myanmarese operatives, reportedly in order to raise money for underground groups.

Drug trade is turning out to

be a major nuisance in the region. It is speculated that drug trade is part of a larger narco-terror racket that is fuelling the fledgling insurgency in the region.

Since extortion activities have plummeted and population support has been waning, the antinational elements are evidently devising new ways to fuel insurgency in the region.

Byorung Bridge ready for use



YINGKIONG, June 22: The strategically important Byorung Bridge over Siang river here on the Yingkiang-Moying road in Upper Siang district has been rehabilitated by the border roads organisation (BRO).

Also popularly known as Gan-

dhi Bridge, the Byorung Bridge remained closed from 22 May onwards for maintenance. The repairing had to be carried out after two bearings of the bridge on the Yingkiang side got damaged, barely four years after its inauguration. This cable suspension

bridge connects strategically important border areas like Tuting with the rest of the country.

The border road task force (BRTF) 761 carried out the repair work.

On Wednesday, June 21 health minister Alo Libang, who is also local MLA visited the bridge and interacted with senior officials of BRO. Libang appreciated the efforts of BRO, Project Brahman for timely completion of the rehabilitation of the bridge.

Commander A K Gupta of 761 BRTF, Yingkiang briefed about the repairing work carried out by his team. He also requested the district administration not to allow vehicles above 18 tonne to use the bridge. As per the original design and load classification, the bridge is only for the use of vehicles upto 18 tonne.

The BRTF 761 based here took over the Byorung Bridge from state PWD in 2021. The 18 tonne bridge was funded by DoNER under the NLCPR scheme and inaugurated in January 2019 by deputy chief minister Chowna Mein. The bearing problem was first detected by BRTF in 2022.

Interaction and awareness programme held for farmers
