Fire broke out at Geku village

GEKU, July 26:

A massive Fire broke out at Geku at around 1100 hours on Friday, 26th July and engulfed one dwelling house, one kitchen, Garage of Govt Model College, Geku College bus however no causality reported. The cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained.

After receiving the reports of fire accident, DC Upper Siang Hage Lailang immediately rushed to the spot and interacted with the fire victims. He also handed over Rs 5000/ as immediate relief to fire victims.

Further, DC directed EAC Geku to make loss assessment and submit the report at the earliest.

During the incident, College bus and vehicle of Principal, Govt Model College, Geku were reportedly partially burnt and damaged by fire.

Measles cases reported in Papum Pare

YUPIA, July 31:

Eleven cases of measles were reported in Papum Pare district till July this year inspite of 94 percent MR vaccine coverage, surveillance medical officer at WHO Dr. Ranadeep Saha said.

He emphasized the importance of timely vaccination and ensuring that all children in the district are fully immunized according to the national immunization schedule and strategies to increase community awareness and engagement.

Dr. Saha on Wednesday, July 31 gave a presentation on routine immunization and strategies to eliminate Measles Rubella during a meeting of the District Task Force on Immunization here on Wednesday.

During the meeting, he discussed strategies to improve outreach especially, in hard-to-reach areas, and to address the challenges posed by vaccine hesitancy.

The meeting was convened to review the progress and strategize future actions for routine im-

munization, the health management information system, key performance indicators and the ongoing efforts to control measles and rubella in the district.

The meeting brought together representatives from the district health department, immunization officers, medical officers, HMIS coordinators, and representatives from education and women and child developments with the goal of improving health outcomes and ensuring that every child and pregnant woman receives the necessary vaccinations.

Chairing the meeting, ADC Tame Yajum called for concerted effort from all the stakeholders to generate a well-vaccinated healthy pool of people.

Terming doctors as 'next to god' with a special emphasis on doctors serving in the outpost, she said that "For the rural people, doctors in the outpost are the saviours. It becomes our prerogative to stay in our posting places and serve the public," the ADC said.

Meeting held to review Sampoonnata Abhiyan under ABP & ADP

NAMSAI, July 30:

A district-level review meeting was convened on Tuesday, July 30 at the DC Conference Hall, Namsai to discuss the ongoing Sampoonnata Abhiyan under the Aspirational Block and Aspirational District Program (ABP & ADP).

The meeting was chaired by SK. Tikhak, ADC Chongkham and attended by key officials from the District Administration, Health Department, Nutrition Department, Social Development, Agriculture and Allied Departments, Education Department, as well as representatives from Piramal Foundation and ABF Chongkham.

Several important points were discussed during the meeting.

In the health sector, it was reported that 5,364 adults aged 30 and above have been enrolled in the NCD portal for Chongkham Block, out of a targeted 9,083. Additionally, a target was set to screen over 1,500 individuals for NCDs in August. Plans for a convergence initiative between the Health Department, ICDS Department, and Piramal Foundation were also discussed to broaden the reach of health camps.

Tasing inaugurates infrastructures in districts



KHONSA, July 30:

Panchayati Raj & Rural Development Minister Ojing Tasing inaugurated a slew of infrastructures in Tirap district on Monday, July 29.

The minister inaugurated the District Panchayat Resource Centre (DPRC) here, a block public health unit at the Deomali CHC, a Panchayat Bhavan-cum-community service centre in Wakka, and Panchayat Bhavans in Longchan and Khela.

The DPRC has been constructed for conducting training programmes to build the capacity of the panchayat officials. It can also be used by other departments for similar purposes.

Responding to a memorandum submitted by the public of Wakka circle, the minister said that he would initiate sanctioning a bus service from Longding to Khanu, considering the

recent bus accident between Wakka and Khanu. Tasing said that he would "discuss with the RD & PR director regarding the construction of an approach road and boundary wall for the Panchayat Bhavan."

In response to another memorandum, submitted by the people of Longchan circle, regarding construction of footpaths connecting Longkai and Kaimoi, and Longkai and Laho; construction of a CC pavement road from the main road to the Panchayat Bhavan; a mini-bus service from Nginu to Kanubari; implementation of the Pandhan Mantri Awas Yojana, etc, the minister said that he would look into the matters.

World Hepatitis Day observed

ITANAGAR, July 28:

Along with the rest of the world, World Hepatitis Day, with the theme is 'one life, one liver', was observed on Sunday, July 28.

At Raj Bhavan dispensary, Itanagar, District Health Society, Itanagar Capital Complex organized an awareness camp under the aegis of the, it aimed to raise public awareness about viral hepatitis and its impact on public health.

A large number of people from all walks of life, particularly from 'A', 'B', and 'P' sectors of Itanagar, including Raj Bhavan staff and ITBP personnel, turned up for free check-ups, testing and advice about the different types of hepatitis and prevention strategies, testing, and treatment options.

Senior Medical Officer, Dr. Jennifer Tayeng said that Hepatitis is an inflammation of the liver that is caused by a variety of infectious viruses and non-infectious agents leading to a range of health problems, some of which can be fatal. Stating that Viral Hepatitis B is a silent killer, has no cure and causes liver cancer, liver cirrhosis and liver failure, she advised that the best treatment is vaccination.

Dr. Tayeng said that ensuring

good hygiene and avoiding contact with contaminated objects or bodily fluids can protect against infection by any hepatitis virus. She further advised the people against regular liquor drinking and frequent use of processed foods in their daily meals.

Limiting red and fatty cuts of meat and deep-fried foods in unhealthy oils, and avoiding processed meats (like hot dogs and deli meats) are some of the preventive measures, she said.

At PASIGHAT, World Hepatitis Day was observed at Judicial Jail Pasighat. It was jointly organized by General Administration and District Health Society East Siang. It was launched by Deputy Commissioner Tayi Taggu.

Speaking on the occasion, DC Taggu opined that it is such a wastage spending time in jail during one's productive life and advised the inmates to reform their lifestyle. DMO Dr. K. Perme, while welcoming all educated the inmates on signs and symptoms and prevention of Hepatitis. To mark the occasion IEC activities along with Screening of 55 jail inmates were carried out. The programme was coordinated by Judicial EAC Sanjay Taram and DRCHO Dr. Nidak Angu.

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DC East Siang chairs NCORD meeting

Emphasizes on close vigil of entry points, hot spots of drugs



PASIGHAT, July 26: A meeting of District Level Committee of Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD) was held on Friday, July 26 under the chairpersonship of East Siang Deputy Commissioner at the office conference hall here to discuss the comprehensive strategy to counter the menace of drug abuse in East Siang district.

DC Tayi Taggu reviewed the implementation of the measures taken and progress achieved to eliminate drug abuse and its peddling in the district.

While taking detailed appraisal from members of NCORD Committee regarding the present scenario of drug related occurrences, areas of concern, age group of addicts, hot

spots of drug abuse the DC stressed upon the concerned officers to further intensify IEC activities, connecting communities including sub-divisional, circle and civil society members.

He also took feedback from the members of the Committee who presented the latest report related to action taken against drug-addiction and drug trafficking in the district.

The DC also meticulously reviewed and discussed of functioning of Drug De-addiction Centres and Addiction Treatment Facility Centre (ATFC) and stressed for making them fully functional so that sufferings of the drug-affected persons is mitigated. He emphasized on ensuring proper counseling and rehabilitation for individuals struggling with addiction.

Superintendent of Police, Dr. Sachin Kumar Singhal apprised the meeting that police personnel were working tirelessly to contain the menace of drugs. Many FIRs were registered and many drug peddlers were arrested and lodged in jails besides seizure of heroin and other contraband substances.

The meeting among others was attended by ASP Pankaj Lamba, DySP Ayup Boko, DMO Dr. Komling Perme, ADC Mebo Sibo Passing, Supdt (T&E) Kingman Komut, ABAK (East Siang Unit) Gen Secy Tigul Megu, WASE President and Gen. Secy Yamik Dulom Darang and Joya Tasung Moyong respectively and representative from Agriculture and Education departments.

RGU to review RGUCET-2024 Results

RONO HILLS, July 26: The Deans' Committee, the RGUCET Coordination Committee and the officers of Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) on Friday, July 26 held a meeting under the chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor Saket Kushwaha, following detection of mismatch in the names and roll numbers of candidates, and subsequent withdrawal of the RGUCET-2024 results declared for a few subjects.

"The results were withdrawn on detection of mismatched particulars immediately with a view to uphold the transparency and merit of the aspirants, and for this all parameters pertaining to RGUCET-2024 are now under review and reverification by a broader result moderation committee

comprising of deans, heads, statutory officers and other officers of RGU," Registrar Dr NT Rikam said in a release.

Dr Rikam said that all the results of the RGUCET-2024 will be declared on or before 5 August.

"The university stands committed to declaring all the results of RGUCET-2024 on or before the 5th of August, 2024, and shall catch up with the admission timeline as per the academic calendar of the university," the release said.

The university acknowledged that "errors have been observed this time in the otherwise flawless RGUCET examinations conducted so far by the varsity, largely due to transition in policy framework regarding

admission and application process from the in-house application portal of RGU to SAMARTH's portal for the first time, following an advisory and guidelines of regulatory bodies at all-India level.

"The university administration has taken this proactive step in order to safeguard the interests of the aspirants and thereby ensuring the admission process to various programmes with minor modification in dates," the release said.

It added that "a dedicated broad-based task force has been formed and the updated results will be released at the earliest, as the university remains committed to upholding the highest standards of fairness and integrity in the processes."

Refresher training imparted to Ziro GBs

AND WHEREAS, it is reported that presence of trees/bamboos groves within the Right of Way of HT/LT/ Electrical lines make the lines faulty during high wind, which causes power lines to swing leading to disruption in the supply of electricity.

AND WHEREAS, as per rule, there should be no bamboo grove/trees of any types within 7.5 meters from the centre on either side of 33 KV line and for 11 KV line, the distance should be 3.5 meters on either side from the centre.

AND WHEREAS, in order to ensure 24 X 7 Power Supply in Itanagar Capital City and to avoid any risk to human life and safety, it is necessary that the owner of such bamboo groves within the Right of Way of HT/LT/Electrical installations to uproot/cut the bamboo/trees.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 152 (d) of BNSS, 2023, undersigned do hereby direct all the owners of such bamboo groves/trees that comes in the either side along Right of Way of HT/ LT Line/Electrical Installations to remove their bamboo groves/trees within 3 (three) days from the date of issue of this conditional order. Failing to remove the same within the stipulated time, this order shall be made absolute.

A one-day training program on the "Economics and Cultivation Package of Practices of large cardamom" was organized by Rural Development department under MGNREGA, Khon- sa, Tirap district on Monday, July 29. About 60 farmers from Khon- sa block attended the training program.

DA for strict implementation of "Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers & their Rehabilitation Act 2013"

DC East Siang Tayi Taggu has asked all stakeholders for strict implementation of the "Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their Rehabilitation Act 2013 in the district and asked for conducting time bound survey and submission of report at both Sub-divisional and district level and for extending support for skill development and assistances under various livelihood schemes etc for a dignified life.

The DC also directed PMC to conduct a survey on insanitary toilets within the municipality areas so that these to be replaced with sanitary toilets.

The DC who is also the Chairman District Vigilance Committee said this while chairing the District Vigilance Committee (DVC) of East Siang District on the implementation of the "The Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavenger and Their Rehabilitation Act 2013" in the district.

MLA Tapi Darang, in his address asked the District Administration and PMC authority to implement the Act, in letter and spirit, so that any beneficiaries or individuals

found engaged as manual Scavenger are given a proper rehabilitation and other facilities as per the Act.

The local MLA also pointed out to the PMC authority to conduct a proper survey along the stretches of Pane Korong stream and other habitations as insanitary toilets are contaminating and polluting the streams through direct disposal of wastes / septic pipe wastes directly into the stream which is posing health hazard and risk of spread of diseases to the citizens/ dwellers. The MLA also called for conducting awareness drive among the citizens.

The SP East Siang, Dr. Sachin Kumar Singhal also assured support for strict enforcement as per provisions of the Act.

Chief Councillor, PMC, Okiam Moyong Borang, informed that a preliminary survey on insanitary latrines/septic tanks have already been initiated and Fund proposal for conversion of insanitary latrines and other equipments shall be placed before the state Government, she added.

ZPC, Olen Rome, also suggested offered suggestions for effective implementation and awareness

campaign.

The House resolved for formation of sub-division vigilance committee (Ruksin and Mebo) and Survey Committee for East Siang.

EE PMC, Er. Tadar Tarang, in his PPT presentation, highlighted on the salient features of the "Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers & their Rehabilitation Act 2013" and the objectives of the Act to eliminate manual scavenging and rehabilitate to a life of dignity, use of modern technology for cleaning of sewers, septic tanks etc, to eliminate insanitary toilets, being punishable offences, he highlighted penalties for construction of insanitary latrine or engaging manual scavengers, the prohibition of persons for employment for hazardous cleaning of sewers and septic tanks, role of Urban and Local bodies for construction of sanitary community toilets to eliminate open defecation etc.
