One-Man Inquiry Commission constituted for inquiring into paper leakages of APPSC

ITANAGAR, August 24:

A One-Man Inquiry Commission headed by Mr. Justice P.K. Deka (Retd.) has been constituted recently by the State Government for inquiring into the allegations of leakages of question papers of recruitment examinations conducted by Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission (APPSC) from 1.4.2014 to 31.08.2022.

It may be recalled that earlier a letter was written to the Department of Justice, Government of India in this regard. The Department of Justice, Gol forwarded a list of names of retired Judges from North East. After following an elaborate due process, the order was issued.

The Terms of Reference of the Commission are as under -to inquire into the facts and circumstances of the incidents of leakage of question papers in the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission examinations held from 01.04.2014 to 31.08.2022; to inquire into the lapses on the part of officers / officials and other stakeholders involved directly / indirectly in the recruitment process; to suggest remedial measures for free and fair recruitment; and to make recommendations on any other related issues.

The Commission, in relation to leakage of question papers of recruitment examinations conducted by Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission from 1.4.2014 to 31.08.2022, may -summon any person and examine him on oath; require the discovery and production of any document; receive evidence on affidavit; requisition any public record or copy thereof from any office; examine witnesses or documents.

The Commission will submit its report within a period of three months.

ITANAGAR, August 24:

Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu asserted that only because of the NDA government at the centre and the BJP governments in the two neighbouring states and with concerted efforts of all stakeholders, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh have come a long way in fostering harmony and peaceful coexistence among the people living on the inter-state boundary.

Attending the first ever interactive session on 'Understanding socio-cultural issues of Bodos in Arunachal' hereat the DK Convention Centre on Sunday, Khandu said that both the states are moving forward with conviction, openness and compassion for greater cultural cooperation between people of the two states.

He said that the disputes along the Assam-Arunachal inter-state boundary of which most is

with areas inhabited by the Bodos are almost resolved barring a few pockets.

He, however, remarked that drawing a boundary line is not the end of the job. For peace and progress to go along together, he said, people living on either side of the boundary have to work together with bonhomie and brotherhood.

"This wasn't possible earlier because of the lack of sincerity of the Congress government and the convoluted approach with which they used to work. They had neither clarity of thoughts nor any concrete action plan. But the BJP government was determined to make the headway with the resolve of 'Abhi Nahi Toh Kabhi Nahi'," he said.

Claiming step motherly and irresponsible attitude of the Congress towards the North East, Khandu said that this 'attitude' caused damage to the North East, particularly Assam, which had to go through a tumultuous phase of violence, gun culture and insurgency.

"Things have changed drastically since 2014. Peace has come back and development is taking place rapidly," he pointed.

Over Rs1.45 Cr bank credit loans disbursed to 107 registered SHGs

SEPPA, August 24:

A mega credit camp cum loans disbursement programme for the East Kameng district's registered 107 Self Help Groups was organized here on Wednesday by the District Mission Management Unit, Arunachal State Rural Livelihoods Mission (ArSRLM), Seppa, East Kameng district.

Total of 107 SHGs facilitated under Block Mission Management Unit Seppa, Block Mission Management Unit Chayangtajo and Block Mission Management Unit Bameng, ArSRLM received bank credit loans of over Rs. 1.45 crore inclusively from APEX Bank and SBI Seppa branch, East Kameng district to enhance various livelihood activities and opportunities.

The disbursed loans amount were handed over to Self Help Group's representatives accompanied by block officials in the form of ceremonial dummy cheques signed by the APEX Bank Manager and SBI Field Officer in presence of various senior officers and PRLs at the spot.

While, addressing on the occasion, Doyak Singhi, ZPM of 7-East Seppa said that the women Self Help Groups have the innate capability of

taking care of the household chores as well as participating on various activities, groups weekly meeting and gram Sabha. PASIGHAT, August 24:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), who was on a two-day tour to East Siang District, chaired a review meeting of the Central and State Governments' sponsored schemes, projects and programmes at Pasighat on Tuesday, August 22, 2023.

Addressing the Heads of Departments, the Governor urged upon them to perform, reform and transform. He advised them to incorporate the spirit in their works.

Terming corruption as one of the biggest hurdles to development and peace in the region, Khandu blamed it too on the Congress regime. He said that 'corruption' was a 'gift' from the then central government.

"Today our government backed by our political will, we are rooting out corruption from every sphere of governance," he said.

Paying rich tributes to Bodofa Upendranath Brahma – the father of the Bodos – whose pioneering non-violent struggle paved the way for self-determination and autonomy leading to the creation of Bodoland, Khandu said the Bodos and Arunachalees share a special rapport based on faith and respect since time immemorial.

He said the age-old relationship shared by Arunachalees and Bodos has made today's event possible and hailed Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR) Chief Executive Member Pramod Boro for his presence along with few of his executive members.

"After the NDA Government assumed charge in Bodoland in December 2020 under the leadership of Pramod Boro, a new era of peace and development has started in the region. I am also very happy to note that the BTR Peace Accord 2020, which was signed in presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, has paved the way for permanent peace in Bodoland," he said.

This, Khandu observed, is a very positive development not only for Bodoland but also for the entire North-Eastern region.

"Being the gateway to the Northeast, I believe in the days ahead Bodoland will emerge as the most peaceful and progressive frontier of the Region," he added.

On a proposal from the BTR Chief, Khandu assured to establish a cultural stall showcasing Arunachal's tourism potential in the proposed complex to be constructed by BTR government at Srirampur, the entry point into Assam from West Bengal.

He also assured to construct a cultural centre for the Bodo community at Itanagar.

"For the Bodo brothers and sisters staying in Arunachal Pradesh, I pledge my full cooperation and support to them in the future," Khandu added.

Being a significant moment in the chapter of Assam-Arunachal relation, the event was graced by top leaders of BTR headed by CEM Pramod Boro, Itanagar legislator Tech Kaso, members of Bodo Sahitya Sabha, Nyishi Elite Society, All Bodo Students' Union and Arunachal Pradesh Bodo Welfare Society.

Earlier, Dr Riken Rina Project Director APSACS, DHS Naharlagun, while welcoming all informed that the primary objective of IHC is to identify new HIV positive cases with co-morbidities among Key Populations (KPs) and provide comprehensive service package to care, support and treatment under NACP, NVHCP, NHM, Social Protection and Benefit Schemes, etc.

As injecting drugs with shared needles, syringes or drug equipment can directly transmit HIV from an infected person to an uninfected person, hence with the rise in cases of drug abuse, the cases of HIV are also on the rise. Therefore, it is important to aware the citizens and to conduct such health screening camps.

He informed that a total of 79 camps have been proposed for Capital and few blocks of Papum Pare which would be completely free of cost.

Training cum demonstration on hatchery operation seed production & fish culture held



ROING, August 24: A training-cum-demonstration programme on hatchery operation, seed production and fish culture by Kolkata Centre of ICAR-CIFE commenced at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Balek today.

A portable fish hatchery FRP made carp eco-hatchery with a holding capacity of 25 kg broodfish and one million fish seed production per cycle was established at Rukmo Village by Kolkata Centre of ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education and KVK Balek with the objective to meet up the local fish seed demand.

A total 20 fish farmers actively participated and received critical inputs for fish farming, such as water testing kit and study materials from the organizers.

Jatan Pulu, a progressive fish farmer and national awardee, shared his experiences on traditional fish farming systems and urged the participants to adopt scientific fish farm-

ing practices to enhance productivity and improve their livelihood.

Dr. Gouranga Biswas, Senior Scientist, ICAR-CIFE, Kolkata Centre delivered talks on composite fish culture, breeding and hatchery management of fish. He imparted the fish induced breeding technique practically to the farmers. He also recommended use of quality, uniform and bigger size fish seeds in multiple stocking and multiple harvesting farming system to increase the fish productivity.

Dr. Dilip Kumar Singh, Scientist, ICAR-CIFE, Kolkata Centre covered the design and construction of fish hatchery, nursery management, brood-stock and larval nutrition, importance of farm made aquafeed utilizing locally available cheap feed ingredients to reduce the feed cost. He also practically demonstrated preparation of fish feed and analysis of water quality parameters, and recommended application of agricultural

lime to reclaim the acidic soil and water of Lower Dibang Valley.

Dr. Deepanjali Deori, Senior Scientist and Head, KVK, Balek expressed that the establishment of hatchery would immensely benefit fish farmers who lack knowledge on scientific fish farming and meet up the fish seed demand to improve their livelihood by adopting modern methods of aquaculture.

Neriyang Jamoh, Fishery Officer, briefed about various developmental schemes of the government. She appreciated the step of establishment of fish hatchery by ICAR-CIFE which will help in enhancement of fish production and urged the participants to make use of beneficial schemes for utilization of water resources and enhancement of fish production.

- 4602 Primary teachers (PRT), 2248 Upper Primary teachers (TGT) including 34 HTs, 433 Subject Teachers (TGT) including 81 HTs in Secondary Schools, and 430 Part Time Instructors in Upper Primary Schools have been recruited so far under Samagra Shiksha.
- Database Management SystemThe software has been developed for keeping records of all the contractual employees working on the project. This DBMS will act as a central pool for all the data regarding employee details and other records.
- 99 Block Resource Centers (BRCs) and 1Urban Resource Centre (URC) have been strengthened with permanent building and support staff including Resource Persons for different subjects & CWSN, MIS coordinators, Data Entry Operator and accountants for academic support to the teachers and schools.
- Presently all 101 Govt. Hr. Secondary Schools and 70 Secondary Schools and 11 KGBVshave been approved forthe introduction of Vocational Education and Classes with Information Technology (IT) and Tours and Travels (TT) trades are going in 171 Schools. There are 75110 Students enrolled in Vocational Education From 2017 to 2023.Approved addition of Beauty and Wellness and with Automotive trade in the School Curriculum. As per the Vision of NEP 2020 to let each studentlearn one Vocational in his/her schooling period, GoI has recently approved Information and Technology (IT) and Tours and Travel (TT) trades in 16 GSSand Information and Technology in 33 GSS for the current academic year.
- An Updated and improved version of Unified District Information on School Education (UDISE) known as UDISE+ was introduced in 2018-19 for the collection of data online in real-time and data has been collected for the year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 so far.
- Information and Communication Technology (ICT)is providing computer education at Govt. Secondary, Higher Secondary School levels and extended to Govt. Aided Schools as well upper primary level. The scheme was launched during 2005-06 and covered 387 schools till date in the State providing students with access to modern teaching tools and resources, leading to an improvement in their learning outcomes and a reduction of dropout rate. During the session 2022-23, the number of ICT facilities in 39 Schools has been approved.
- Free Textbook:** - Against the approved outlay for 2022-23 under RTE entitlements to provide free textbooks to Children of schools run underDeptt. of Education and Govt.Aided (Elementary level highest up to class VIII), distribution of textbooks to 175618 Children from Class I to VIII have been implemented at the cost of Rs 531.59 (lakhs).
- Teacher and Student Diary:** -The Teacher and Student Diary have been provided to every teacher and student of government schools from Classes III-XII. The essence of using a diary is to keep track of records and class activities such as topics taught in the classroom, course coverage, daily attendance, check absenteeism, class/homework assigned, weekly test, terminal, and annual examinations, along with the quality analysis of the result and to take remedial measures with an objective to improves the learning outcomes of the children with the involvement of both teachers and parents.
- ORCHID SERIES:** -A supplementary reading material developed by the State Samagra Shiksha Society, introduced in the form of reading corners targetingthe children for the development of their language skills at the elementary level. The booklets contain folktales of 16 major tribes of Arunachal Pradesh. The booklets are developed in graded form considering age specific such as children reading in Classes III-V. The prime goal of developing these books is to provide the opportunity to children to inculcate reading habits through self-reading with an understanding in one's own context and to grow as habitual readers. These help children to catch up with their imagination, perception, and conception in their daily life.
- ArunKiran:** A graded supplementary material developed for Foundation Literacy and Numeracy, where objects, counting numbers, eatable items etc, were drawn in pictorial forms and level with their own mother tongue/languages, which is again interpreted in bi-lingual (Hindi & English).

- In-service Teacher Training.** The implementation of a NISHTHA Online Teacher Training and Continuous Development Program at the Primary Level, Upper Primary level, Secondary Level, and Hr. Sec. level, resulting in an improvement in teacher performance. A total of 7356 teachers at the elementary level and 3559 teachers at the secondary level have been provided with in-service teacher training through offline and online modes. The Training for Master Trainer for 100 BRC and 221 CRC under NISHTHA ECCE Training has also been completed.
- Special Training:-** 2710 Schools Children have been imparted training under Special Training till now. The Introduction of bridge course for OoSC(Out-of-School Children) provides them with the skills and knowledge required to successfully transition into formal education. The successful implementation of the community mobilization program for elementary and secondary levels resulted in an increasing number of parents who enrolled their children in the school.
- Inclusive Education for CWSN:** - Inclusive Education aims to improve the quality of education for all children including children with special needs(CWSN). The Program includes several initiatives to support the education of CWSN such as providing assistive devices to 1986 children, 1762 stipend for CWSN Girls, Escort Allowance, 126 Home-based education children, 161 Therapeutic Services to CWSN as per need base, 126 Escort Allowance, 324 transportation allowance to CSWN have been provided till now.
- Foundational and Literacy and Numeracy (NIPUN Bharat):**-FLN refers to the child's ability to read with meaning and solve Maths problems by class 3. These are crucial basic skills that help them to succeed in life. It also helped in increased enrollment and retention of children in primary school, particularly among girls. A total of 104120 students have been provided with Teaching Learning Materials and a total of 6723 Primary Teachers have been provided with Teacher Resource Materials in the current year.
- Support at Pre-Primary:** -The intensified research carried out during the last decade across the globe reveals that the investment in early childhood Education significantly expands child's physical, linguistic, cognitive, and Socio-emotional abilities, which in turn leads to their better health and earnings in the future. A quality pre-primary programme helps in shaping a child into an asset to a nation, who can contribute meaningfully to its development. The state is having 550 Pre-Primary schools. 342 approved during 2018-2019, 198 PPS approved during 2020-2021 and 10 Pre-Primary has been approved in 2022-23. All 550 Pre-Primary Schools are functioning in the State. 11103 students are enrolled in 550 Pre-Primary schools during 2022-23, all PPS are attached to existing Government Schools. In addition, 300 ECCE centers has been installed and being operated in the state. These ECCE center caters to the education need f Children between 3-6 years of age.
- KGBV (Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya):** - Initially there were 50functional, there are 13 type-I, 30 type- II and 7 type-III KGBVs in the state. A new KGBV was sanctioned by the MoE during PAB 2022-23 for Nacho Educationally backward block (EBB) in upper subansiri, totaling 50 (fifty) KGBVs in the state till date. 32 Type-IV KGBVs has been sanctioned till date which is attached with Higher Secondary School in the District.
- PM SHRI SCHOOLS:** - PM Shri School is a program under SamagraShiksha, Govt. of India. The Program aims to improve access to education, improve the quality of education, and bridge the gaps in the education system. A total of 202 benchmark schools have been listed in PM Shri Schools Portal for the state, out of which 112 have been selected at the district level. Out of 53 Schools recommended only 41 schools got selected as per the benchmark criteria set from the National level in the First Phase.
- Vidya Samiksha Kendra (VSK):-**It is a surveillance system thattracks enrolment, attendance, learning outcomes, drop-outs, and school accreditation and monitors school, teachers, and block and cluster resource centre coordinators. VSK System which has been approved in PAB 2022-23, will be established at the State Project Director Office for aiming at leveraging data and technology to improve learning outcomes. It will monitor all the government schools and hands holds more than 16 thousand teachers to help improve the learning outcomes of nearly around 2.5 lakh students.
- LPD:-** Changlang district being the low performing amongst the district in India has been sanctioned for television to be provided in 228 schools in the additional PAB-2022-23 which is actively under progress.
- ICT:-** As per PAB 426 schools has approved out which 358 schools are functioning. 68 more schools are under actively consideration for implementations.

RASHTRIYA AVISHKAR ABHIYAN (RAA):-

- a) **PROJECT JIGYASA:** -The program is based on the guidelines of Rashtriya Aviskar Abhiyan (RAA), a national initiative by the Ministry of education. The activities covered under Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan of project Jigyasa for Samagra Shiksha, Arunachal Pradesh implemented by UNISED (Unit of Science and Educational Development) in collaboration with Samagra Shiksha/ ISSE Itanagar. The Project Jigyasa is implemented at 347 Government schools of the State in both Elementary and Secondary levels targeting Upper Primary Schools. Under this scheme following items are provided:-
- Enabling every school with a "Low-Cost Solar Power Operated Audio Visual system (Smart Class) and e-content in accordance with the curriculum.
 - Every School is provided with Science and Mathematics Learning resource Kits, which include NCERT Kits and UNISED Kits, focused TLM for kids to learn by doing activities in the classroom and outside the classroom.
 - Hands-on training/peer-to-peerlearning sessions for teachers at the school level.
 - Hands-on teachers training & capacity building workshop for science and Mathematics teachers by IIT Kanpur/IIT Guwahati/NITs/ State HEIs twice in a year.
 - Exposure visits of industries/research labs for selected students and teachers.
- b) **Atal Tinkering Lab (ATL):-**These activities covered under the intervention of Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan for Samagra Shiksha, Arunachal Pradesh where ATL Lab have been established in 24 District where Science Stream is Available in Higher Secondary Schools.
