Interstate boundary issues resolved

PASIGHAT, February 16:

The 3rd meeting of Regional Committees for interstate boundary of East Siang (AP) and Dhemaji district (Assam) was held recently at Hotel Ratnamouli Palace, Guwahati (Assam). With successful culmination of the Regional Committee meeting, the longstanding interstate boundary issues within East Siang District have been resolved, informed East Siang Deputy Commissioner Tayi Taggu on Thursday, February 9.

The MLA-cum-Chairman of the Regional Committee, East Siang District (Arunachal Pradesh) Ninong Ering and Cabinet Minister (Assam)-cum-Chairman of Regional Committee, Dhemaji District (Assam) Jayanta Malla Baruah, DC East Siang Tayi Taggu, DC Dhemaji AK Bhat-tacharya and the members of both the committees after threadbare discussion on the reports of East Siang and Dhemaji administrations, and

on examination of the existing settlements along the interstate boundary, arrived at a resolution and adopted the mutually agreed upon boundary line with geo-coordinates as the interstate boundary line, acceptable by both the committees.

From East Siang (AP), the historic meeting was also attended by ADC Mebo-cum-Nodal Officer (Border Affairs) Ainstein Koyu, CO Namsing Radhe Tatung, AMBK GS and VP Okom Yosung and Mojit Pao respectively and Mondal John Pan-yang.

Minister (Assam) Dr. Ronuj Pegu, Jonai MLA Bhupen Pegu, Principal Secretary G.D. Tripathi, Commissioner and Secretary Assam Akash Deep, Secretary Prabh-hati Thaosen, CEM (MAC) and EM Parmananda Chayengia and Raju Medok respectively represented Assam.

Secretary asks departments not to compromise work quality

AALO, February 16:

A district level monitoring committee meeting was held here on Tuesday, February 14 where Home Secretary and mentor secretary of West Siang district, CN Longphai asked the implementing agencies, "especially the engineering departments," to not compromise the quality of work, and to complete the projects concerned on time.

Longphai said, "If any hindrance erupts during the work, the implementing agency concerned should inform the DC for early solutions", while chairing the meeting

"All the ongoing projects in West Siang are equally important, but the work on upgrading the district hospital and the maternity and child healthcare retrofitting of DC office must be completed in due given period by maintaining the quality," he said, and directed the site engineer of the project to "engage more workforce for early completion."

Deputy Commissioner Penga Tato informed the secretary that "maximum work shall be completed in due period."

During the meeting, which was attended by, among others, Kam-ba ADC Rujum Rakshap, HoDs, and administrative officers, officials of the departments concerned presented updates on the status of the projects being implemented by their departments.

The secretary, along with the DC, the DPO, and the PWD EE later inspected the ongoing projects in Aalo Township, such as the construction of the general hospital building; construction of the sports stadium; construction of an arch bridge in Paya village; and the completed arch bridge in Bene village.

Longphai also visited the district jail and interacted with Jail Superintendent Maryom Karlo, and assured to have a videoconference hall constructed for the prisoners, besides looking into other grievances.

Ering takes stock of developmental activities

MWYA, February 16:

Arunachal Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Chowma Mein inaugurated the newly established Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko, an indigenous tribal tradition and cultural school in Mwya village, Lower Subansiri district in presence of the Minister of Education, Culture and Indigenous Affairs, GoAP, Tabat Tedir, and MLA-cum-Advisor to Home, Tax & Excise, Nyamar Karbak, among others on Tuesday, February 14.

The Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko will play a major role in preservation and promotion of Arunachal Pradesh's indigenous tribal culture and traditions. "The school is aimed at providing quality education to the tribal children in an environment that respects and promotes their culture, language and traditions," said Mein while addressing the event.

Deputy Chief Minister also lauded the efforts of the local community in setting up the school and highlighted the importance of preserving the indigenous cultures & traditions of Arunachal Pradesh. He also urged the local community to take full advantage of the school to ensure that the rich heritage of the State is preserved for future generations.

In his speech, Mein emphasized that every child should learn about their cultural heritage from a young age and that every Gurukul in the state should be a center of learning where traditional values and ethos are taught. In the same line, he advised the school's faculty to also provide modern education in addition to knowledge of indigenous cultures and heritages. Such learning centers should adopt efficient mechanisms which incorporate both the NCERT syllabus and rich cultural heritages and literature so that their students not only grow up to become doctors and engineers but are also well

equipped with traditional knowledge for becoming Nyubu (priests) or take up any other indigenous role in society if they choose the path.

Mein further asserted that the teaching of third language Govt. school should be monitored and mooted that it needs to be introduced in private schools as well, so that future generations can speak fluently in their pure dialect, without mixing up with any other languages.

During his speech, Mein also assured to provide Rs 1 Crore as grants-in-aid for support of Nyubu NyvgamYerko, Mywa and also gave assurance to facilitate grants-in-aid to all the indigenous teaching schools of the State and to enhance grants-in-aid to Donyi Polo Charitable Society.

Mein also further said that cul-

tural development should go in parallel with the with other infrastructural development taking place in the State. He reiterated the support of the Government of Arunachal Pradesh for the protection and promotion of the indigenous traditions and cultures of the State.

On the occasion, Minister Tabat Tedir, Advisor Nyamar Karbak, President NES, Prof Tana Showren, President IFCSAP, Katung Wahge and Chairman Nyubu NyvgamYerko, Mywa Likha Tongum also spoke among others.

Students of the school presented indigenous prayers, songs & dances and also chanting of Nyishi proverbs during the programme. The dignitaries also offered prayer at the indigenous prayer hall, Nyubu Namlo at Mwya.

CS apprised of status of aspirational dist programme during a review meeting

World Day of Social Justice

World Day of Social Justice is observed on 20 February to promote gender equality, indigenous peoples and migrants' rights. This day also focuses on achieving the goal of full employment and social integration.

This is the day to raise voice against social injustice and to remove barriers regarding gender, race, inequality, religious discrimination, etc. It also highlights the social injustice done throughout the world and to look into the solutions and improvements.

We can't ignore the fact that Social injustice is an important principle for peaceful and prosperous coexistence within and among nations. To remove the barriers basically that people face about gender, age, race, ethnicity, religion, culture or disability, etc. it is necessary to uphold the principles of social justice.

Let us tell you that the World Day of Social Justice is a global observance and is not a public holiday. In 1995, the World Summit for Social Development was held in Copenhagen, Denmark and resulted in the Copenhagen Declaration and Programme of Action. In the summit more than 100 political leaders pledged to fight against poverty and full employment, also they will work for stable, safe societies. It was also decided that there is a need to put people at the center of development plans.

After 10 years, the members of UN states reviewed the Declaration of Copenhagen and Programme of Action for Social Development in New York in February 2005. How to advance social development was also the key point of discussion. On 26 November, 2007, the UN General Assembly declared 20 February as the annual World Day of Social Justice. In 2009, this day was first observed.

According to the World Summit, social developments aimed at social justice, solidarity, harmony and equality within and among countries. No doubt that social justice, equality, and equity constitute the fundamental values of all societies. It is necessary for the government to create a framework for achieving 'a society for all' to promote social justice at national, regional and international levels.

They also pledged to create an equal opportunity for job seekers, equitable distribution of income and greater access to resources through equity and equality.

It is celebrated with the objective of raising your voice against social injustice that is to promote social justice and to bring the various communities internationally together to eliminate poverty, gender, and physical discrimination, illiteracy, religious discrimination, etc. to make a socially integrated society.

'Major Bob Khating Day' celebrated

TAWANG, February 16:

Tawang celebrated 'Major Bob Khating Day' at the war memorial here on Tuesday, February 14.

Deputy Commissioner Kesang Ngurup Damo unfurled the national flag and paid tribute to Maj Ralengnou Bob Khating, who consolidated the Shimla pact of 1914 and made Tawang an integral part of India on 6 February, 1951.

This was the first celebration of its kind, organised by the Indian Army's Tawang Brigade. The brigade's commander, Brig NM Bendigeri and all other ranks also paid tributes to Maj Khating.

GBs from various villages, along with Monpa Mimang Tsogpa secretary-general Namgye Tsering, public leaders, ex-servicemen, officers and jawans of the paramilitary forces stationed in Tawang, students, and others participated in the event.

The DC in his address con-

veyed gratitude to the Indian Army, especially the 5 Mountain Division GOC and Brig Bendigeri "for initiating such an important day," and added that, "in the coming years, this day can be celebrated as Tawang Day, since on 14 February, 1951, Maj Khating for the first time hoisted the Indian national flag in Tawang, making it an integral part of the great nation."

He informed that, at the initiative of the state government, "a state-of-the-art museum in memory of Maj Khating will be coming up soon," and expressed hope that "from next year on, this day could be dedicated to the public."

DLTF meeting on illegal mining and illegal transportation of minerals held

Quarry and crusher owners operating illegally asked to apply for license within 15 days



YUPIA, February 16:

"Any discussion on the extraction of natural resources for development is a seesaw battle between demand and its impact. However our demands should be regulated to slow the impact on the nature and to ensure a sustainable development," Papum Pare Deputy Commissioner Sachin Rana said while chairing the meeting of the District Level Task Force on illegal mining and illegal transportation of minerals, convened in the DC Conference Hall, Yupia on Thursday, February 9.

On learning about many quarries operating without proper license, DC Rana asked the quarry and the crusher owners to apply for the legal permits within 15 days by producing all the pre-requisite documents as notified by the Government for obtaining the quarrying license. He further directed that "no quarrying activity shall be held within 50 meters of the Electric transmission towers and the railway bridge at Dikrong River in Doimukh."

While directing the Police, Transport and the Geology and Mining officials to carry out joint surprise

raids and checks on the illegal mining activities DC Rana added that, "The check on rampant mining and quarrying activities is a comprehensive task and needs absolute cooperation from all the stakeholders."

Superintendent of Police Dr. Nyelam Nega while addressing the gathering called for "generating a continuous sense of awareness among the people thriving in the mining bearing region and involving the participation of common people in protection, development and harnessing minerals".

Expressing his anguish on the present condition of the rivers Dikrong, Pachin, Pare etc. from that of 10 years ago he added that "The present condition of these rivers is a resultant of the rampant quarrying activities and there is a need to adopt a balance approach to these activities."

He suggested for devising a "planto restrict and limit stone crusher installations within a certain stretch of the river and also based on the replenishment of the rivers during the monsoon."

Assistant Director, Dept. of Mining and Geology TassarTalo high-

lighted the roles and responsibilities of the members of the District Level Task Force. He also spoke about the procedure to obtain quarrying and stone crusher license; emphasizing on the need for a District mining survey report and mining plan which has been newly included as a prerequisite for obtaining quarrying license.

Highlighting the provisions under Arunachal Pradesh Minor Mineral Concession Rule 2020 he further informed that "illegal extraction of minerals can lead to an imprisonment of one year or with fine which may extend to 2 lakh rupees or with both."

Members of the Quarry and stone crusher associations also spoke. They unanimously called for creating awareness on the procedure to obtain legal permits and dos and dongs of quarrying and mining activities and suggested for installing signage at prominent locations.

Among others ADC, T Bodung, admin officers, officials from Department of Geology and Mining and the members of the DLTF and the quarry and stone crusher associations of Papum Pare attended the meeting.

Whispering Bahadur Hill and Colony Beneath Gently Beckons

Occasionally I indulge myself in the reverie of Ruminating over the Past that Lingers 'bitter- sweetly' in the corridors of my mind. Years have gone by but still the pristine Bahadur Hill and one of the oldest colonies of Aalo Town, PI line that exists today as PI colony beneath the hill where I spent my large part of my childhood for decade from last part of 60s always reflects in front of me. My Memories is tied to the friendly jungles, bushes, Meadows, trees, bird and perennial clear running water to quench thirst, Jungle plant and fruit to fill my empty stomach and always evoke a feeling of home away from home. I am still part of all that I have met and encountered during my growing up years.

It was the industrial hub of my childhood where I use to manufacture wooden three - wheeled vehicles to take part in the wooden car race along with other children of my age group down the road beneath the hill up to Sipu Bridge and reaching the middle of the bridge was always considered an excellent race. The roads in those days were free from din and bustle, hue and cry as hardly few vehicles of army and BRTF use to traverse. Occasionally, one aged and noisy CPWD truck and civilian 1-ton vehicle called as 'Lama Gad' use to ply around. Manufacturing a wooden vehicle at that time needed lot of patience, time and labour as good tress had to be felled, cut into sizes of wheel and drill perfect holes to put through connecting wooden pieces fixed with nails that were seldom available in those days. Strolling along the roadside jungles of the hill looking for ferns to be crushed and used as lubricants for the vehicle and those crushed ferns were kept in bamboo container. To retain maximum greasiness water had to be poured intermittently.

Jungles never sacred me but parent and teachers occasionally did. Childhood offences, consequent backlashes from parent and warning from my respected teacher late Talar Sendak when he used to say "Ome no Homework Imayom nok apin em pulen yelpeke ai" (Boys! If you don't do homework, I will peel your skin alive!) scared me and my friends and jungle was in contrast a safe haven to escape such warnings and beatings. The abrupt shift from Assamese to English medium of education had an awful taste for the new language and fear

of beatings from teachers for not doing the home works forced me to skip school most of the time than to confine myself with friends in the meadows of Bahadur Hill. The adjoining hills connecting Bahadur Hill bisected by the road on the left after crossing PI line, popularly called "Bomb Beda" (Road to Bombs) was one of my favorite childhood destinations. My infancy knew nothing about what type and quantum of bombs that were stocked inside the Godown but fear of the word bomb scared us to keep at bay from that location.

The hills there belonging to generous Kabu villagers of yesteryears were either spared for free or settled for lump sum payment for jhum cultivation by my parent. I traversed 10 to 15 Km up to the hill just after the school hours to take lunch with the parent but through trekking were tiresome with empty stomach but quite fascinating in those days as wells, clear running water, jungle fruits like Buku Jayu, Aaskaya, enpi, penlo, taklom, taptare, takuk, ensi, kobu meku, ekse etc. to quench thirst and hunger. Now only I realize that living closely with parent to wage war with adversities right from the childhood days harden an individual to face challenges of life.

Living closely with the children of heterogeneous tribes with the likes of Etes, Eshis, Takis, Tataks, Darangs, Gamlins, Pangus, Sitangs, Lolens, Bojes, Panors, Yabus etc. in PI Colony taught me sub tie nuances of life including sublimity and humility to live with varied community without an iota of segregation from my childhood days. Never did I imagine in those days that such thought pattern inculcated in my formative years will be narrowed gradually after 50 years like tail of a mouse, broad in the origin and narrowing down and down to be too brittle in the end point. The quest for identity crisis, patronizing and glorifying one's own clan instead of building a concrete society ails way of living today.

In the absence of modern judiciary and lock up in those days, the colony was the judicial hub of the entire district of West Siang as all cases including murder trials were settled there through intervention of Political Assistant and interpreters and even criminals were put under the care of a particular house, perhaps as house arrest and one such Memba woman

from Mechuka was put under the care of my father and we fondly called her 'Mechuka Didi' to serve us for a very long years. One more Boje woman who took refuge in my house, refusing a marriage to an old man of her dislike was forcibly dragged out by a group of men after a case was settled in favour of that old man and my heart ached and disillusionment of whimsical local keba grew harsher day by day as such incidents were rampant in those days though justice delivery system were faster without opposition.

As a penniless child, opening of a shop by my uncle Rakmik Boje in the later part of my life childhood brought cheer and excitement in me to earn money to make some purchase and I took charge of my mother's marketing of vegetables to Boruah and Madan Canteen right from morning to evening skipping school to earn Rs 11 and 75 paise and Rs 11 was spent for procuring a very thin white checked blanket to roll around me to negotiate spine chilling winter in those days. A full vest falling below the knee was brought for 75 paise and wearing that vest and loitering along the streets just to show off my maiden purchase is still vivid in my mind.

The virgin and pristine Bahadur Hill worth its name exists today with encroachment here and there as a source of inspiration, guide and memory to me and stands as witness towarded and unwanted growth and development of Aalo town. The morning and evening walks by the health conscious men, women and children gathering dusts in the crowded streets of Aalo in the absence of park, open space for recreation and trekking in open air will be growing problem in the days to come. The hill can be converted into neat and clean, free from all vices and paid and restricted eco-park to have a refreshing and panoramic glance of Aalo Town from its hill top in the line of many parks in the North East States where outsiders make bee-line to spend their leisure time and huge amount is earned as revenue.. The PI Colony where I spent my Childhood life is also at its usual best but what is miss are traditional childhood simplicity, adventure, labour and pains to fight childhood adversities which I keep as part of history to pondered over in my pensive mood as a bliss of solitude. Sweet are the uses of adversity.
