President of India Graces the 37th Statehood Day celebration

NAHARLAGUN, February 20:

The President of India, Droupadi Murmu graced the 37 Statehood Day celebrations of Arunachal Pradesh and attended the civic reception hosted in her honor by the State Government at Itanagar on Monday, February 20 along with Arunachal Pradesh Governor Lt General Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd), State Chief Minister Pema Khandu, Union Law & Justice Minister Kiren Rijiju and Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein.

Speaking on the occasion of the state's 37th Statehood Day the President, stressed on the need to build better infrastructure in the strategically located Arunachal Pradesh, given that it shares borders with three countries.

The President said she was happy to note that several ambitious infrastructure projects are being taken up in Arunachal, which is also geographically the largest state in the Northeast.

Both India and China have



been building a network of roads, bridges, tunnels, dams and airports to connect the border areas of Arunachal and eastern Tibet, respectively. Troops from the two Asian giants have also had face-offs with each other in border areas in the recent past.

"For economic development and from security point of view, the state needs to have better infrastructure. I am happy to know that the

Centre has sanctioned the Rs 40,000 crore ambitious Frontier Highway project for the state. Moreover, for development of national highways, projects worth over Rs 44,000 crore have been proposed in the state," the president pointed out.

She added that the 600 mw Kameng hydro project in West Siang district, inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra in November last year, would make Arunachal a power surplus state in the country.

"With the inauguration of the state's first Greenfield airport, Donyi Polo Airport, air connectivity and trade potential will receive a major boost," Murmu said.

The president, who also laid the foundation stone of a 40-km-long double-lane road from the airport to the Naharlagun railway station on the occasion, said that the new road would ease travel for people.

Murmu also spoke on the need to empower women, and said that the "society cannot develop without their being given a leading

role."

"Woman is a force multiplier for development of a society. Without their development, no society can progress," Murmu, clad in a colourful traditional tribal attire, said in her address.

Referring to Everester Anshu Jamsenpa, the first woman in the world to scale the summit of Mount Everest twice in a season, and the fastest double summiter to do so within five days, the president said that women from Arunachal have excelled in various fields.

Jamsenpa, who hails from Bomdila in West Kameng district, received the Padmashree in 2021.

Murmu also mentioned Nari Shakti Purashkar awardee Tage Rita Takhe from Ziro in Lower Subansiri district, who is the first kiwi wine brewer in the country.

"I am of the firm belief that such women will inspire many women in the country in the days to come," she added.

Lt General Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik sworn - in as Governor of Arunachal Pradesh

ITANAGAR, February 23:

Lt General Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd) was sworn-in as the new Governor of Arunachal Pradesh at an impressive function held at Darbar hall of Raj Bhawan, Itanagar on Thursday, February 16, 2023.

Justice Nani Tagia, Gauhati High Court administered the oath to the Governor amidst presence of State Chief Minister Pema Khandu, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein, Speaker Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly PD Sona, Council of Ministers, Legislators, Senior Government Officers and Officials led by State Chief Secretary Dharmendra and other who's who of the State.

Earlier, the Chief Secretary read out the Warrant of Appointment of the Governor and requested the Justice to administer the Oath to the Governor Designate.

Born on 28 June 1953, Lt General Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd) is an alumnus of Sainik School Rewa and NDA. He was commissioned in 2 Rajputana Rifles (of TOLOLING fame) on 31 March 1972, which he later commanded in Rajasthan Sector and

Jammu & Kashmir.

He held the reign of an Infantry Brigade in challenging environments of Kupwara Sector during 'Operation Parakram' on the Line of Control. Later, he commanded 17 Mountain Division in Sikkim, Indian Military Training Team in Bhutan and 4 Corps in North East.

Governor Lt General Parnaik held number of prestigious staff appointments at the Integrated Headquarters of Ministry of Defense. He was assigned on UN Mission in Angola and as Director General of Perspective Planning Directorate dealing with modernization and Transformation of Indian Army.

For his exemplary conduct of operations, he was awarded with Yudh Sewa Medal in Operation Parakram in 2003 and Uttam Yudh Seva Medal in Operation Rhino in 2010.

At the peak of his career, he commanded the northern Army in J&K initiating a strategy of perception management for ushering peak in J & K. For his outstanding vision and strategic initiative he was decorated with Param Vishist Seva Medal in 2012 in J & K.

Governor addresses Special Assembly session

ITANAGAR, February 23:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt General Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd) addressed the Special Assembly session of the Arunachal Pradesh State Legislative Assembly in presence of the President of India Droupadi Murmu on Tuesday, February 21, 2023.

Addressing the august house, the Governor said "I am happy to note that the political leadership of the State is fully seized of the challenges and opportunities and is working sincerely to usher in a new era of peace and prosperity for its people. There is nothing which can stand in the way of Arunachal Pradesh provided there is will and determination on the part of its people and leaders".

Stating that the State has crossed a long journey in a comparatively short period of time, he said, "Today's Arunachal Pradesh stands between the legacy of an ancient civilization and the promising horizons of a boundless future. May Arunachal Pradesh emerge as a land of grace and beauty, a shining jewel amongst the beautiful states that make up our great and glorious country".

He said that one of the basic objectives of a representative democracy is to see that governance is carried out keeping in mind the mantra - people first. In a parliamentary democracy, the legislature represents the sovereign will of the people and

President addresses special session of the assembly in the State



ITANAGAR, February 23:

President Droupadi Murmu on Tuesday, February 21 said that the participation of women must increase in all state assemblies, including that of Arunachal Pradesh, for inclusive development of the country.

Addressing a special session of the assembly here, she asserted that Arunachal plays an important role in the social and economic development of the country, and that the "sun of development" is shining over the state.

"For overall and inclusive development of our country, there should be more participation of women in every field of work. Participation of women must increase in all the state assemblies, including that of Arunachal Pradesh, as well as in other institutions of people's representation," she said.

The declaration envisages a multi-sectoral approach for low emission and climate resilient development in the state.

Murmu expressed hope that other states would also adopt the model to tackle the climate change issue.

Recalling the contributions of former prime minister Atal Behari Vajpayee in creating the DoNER ministry for the development of the Northeastern states, the president said that "his dream for a developed Northeast has been made a reality with the sanction of various projects by the present government at the Centre."

Referring to the state assembly's decision to go paperless through the e-vidhan initiative, the president said that "such an innovation should be a role model for other states to emu-

late."

She also commended the assembly secretariat for opening a library which would help the younger generation in research.

Lauding the 'Know Your Assembly' initiative, under which students are invited to the state assembly to acquaint them with the functioning of the legislature, she said that the young generation must take advantage of such facilities and contribute to the progress of the country.

Noting that a vibrant system of self-governance and grassroots democracy existed in Arunachal Pradesh for centuries, she said that the people of the state have actively participated in modern democratic process, as well, which reflects their political consciousness and faith in democracy.

Murmu inaugurates exhibition on state's unsung heroes

President Droupadi Murmu inaugurated an exhibition on the unsung heroes of Arunachal Pradesh, set up by Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU), at the legislative assembly premises here on Tuesday, February 21.

"The exhibition was curated as part of the findings of the research project on unsung heroes of Arunachal Pradesh by RGU," the university informed in a release.

The president was accompanied by a host of dignitaries, includ-

ing union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju, MPs Tapir Gao and Nabam Rebia, former CM Nabam Tuki, Chief Minister Pema Khandu, his cabinet colleagues, legislators, officers, and others.

The Core Committee on Unsung Heroes of Arunachal Pradesh, led by its chairman, Deputy CM Chowna Mein, also attended the exhibition which showcased the timelines of various resistance movements, photos of the unsung heroes, artifacts used during the resistance

movements, and important archival documents and photos, it said.

The photographs were sourced from the British Museum Library, London.

An interactive mobile app on the unsung heroes was also launched during the programme.

The exhibits will be displayed till 22 February.

The research team from RGU, led by Vice Chancellor Prof Saket Kushwaha and Registrar Dr NT Rikam, also attended the event.

President of India plants Red Sandalwood sapling in Raj Bhawan premises

The President of India Droupadi Murmu on second day of her two-day maiden visit to Arunachal Pradesh planted a Red Sandalwood sapling in the premises of Raj Bhawan, Itanagar on Tuesday, February 21 morning, before leaving for Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly to address a Special Session.

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt General Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd) and officers and officials of Raj Bhawan were present on the occasion.

The plantation was organised in the front lawns of the main building of Raj Bhawan where the President planted a sapling of 'Pterocarpus Santalinus', commonly known as Red Sandalwood. This species of timber is one of the most valuable plant species found in Southern parts of India, and is generally used for medicinal purposes as antipyretic, anti-inflammatory, tonic etc, besides furniture making.

The President of India thus carried on the exclusive tradition of planting saplings by the visiting dignitaries in Raj Bhawan premises.

India celebrates National Science Day on 28th February to commemorate the discovery of the 'Raman Effect' by a great Indian scientist Dr. Chandrasekhar Venkata Raman or C.V. Raman. He had invented the Raman Effect on 28th February 1928.

Raman Effect – A Great Discovery

Raman Effect was an important discovery in the field of scattering of light. The discovery states that when the light traverses through a transparent object some of it gets dispersed and the dispersed light changes its wavelength and amplitude, though slightly. The discovery was made by Sir C.V. Raman on 26th February 1928. He was also awarded the 1930 Nobel Prize in Physics for this important discovery. It is to commemorate Sir C.V. Raman and his discovery, the 'Raman Effect' that we celebrate National Science Day.

National Science Day - History

The first National Science Day was celebrated in 1987. Nearly six decades after Sir C.V. Raman made the important discovery, the National Council for Science and Technology Communication (NCSTC), requested the government in 1986, to designate February 28th as the National Science Day. Hence, beginning from 1987, National Science Day is observed every year in Indian schools, colleges, universities, and other relevant places.

Special Events/Activities

One of the main events of the day includes 'National Science Popularization Awards' handed over to the people and also institutions for outstanding contribution in the field of science or for the popularization of science and communication.

Several activities like debates, talk shows, science exhibitions, etc. are held to celebrate National Science Day.

Significance

Celebration of the National Science Day is very important in the way that it promotes the institution of science and its implementation in our daily lives. It also encourages the people, scientists, writers, etc. who are doing the commendable job of promoting and researching science.

It provides a platform for the scientific fraternity to interact with the people as well as the government and inform them about the usefulness of science and possible expanse of its growth. Science presents limitless possibilities of growth and makes day to day living more comfortable and convenient.

President of India Graces the 37th Statehood Day...

Describing Arunachal, with its many tribes and diverse cultures, as an example of unity in diversity, Murmu appealed to the people of the state to preserve its uniqueness and traditions.

The president also laid the foundation stone of a common directorate for the state's human rights commission, the lokayukta, and the State Food Commission here.

Lt General Governor Kaiwalya Trivikram Parnaik PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd urged the people of the state to "walk the talk to make Arunachal Pradesh a peaceful and progressive state."

Addressing the 37th Statehood Day function at IG Park, in the presence of President of India Droupadi Murmu, the governor said that the state government is focused on creating job opportunities for the youths, improving the standard of living, maintaining law and order, protecting the environment, and ensuring security in the state's border areas.

"Arunachal Pradesh has come a long way from being the remote NEFA at the time of independence to becoming a full-fledged state in 1987, and since then the state has progressed in leaps and bounds," he said, adding that the state is receiving "unflinching support of the union government for development and prosperity."

Stating that connectivity in the border areas has been "ramped up," he said that "the airstrips in Mechukha, Tuting and Vijaynagar will become operational, while the proposal for three more ALGs, in Dirang, Anini and Upper Subansiri districts, will improve the communication and logistics of far-flung border areas and largely benefit the livelihood of the population in the border areas, as well as sustenance of our defence forces deployed ahead."

"With the increasing importance towards development of border areas in the last seven to eight years, around 1,200 kms of roads have been built, along with ancillary facilities like repair and maintenance of foot suspension bridges, resultantly uplifting the socioeconomic life of the people and ensuring reverse migration from border villages like Huri and Taksing," Parnaik said.

He added that, "in resonance with the Centre's vibrant villages programme, we have identified five vibrant villages along the border areas, which are being developed with a view to attract and inspire locals to inhabit border areas by organizing fairs, local festivals, tourist activities, and development of livelihood."

The governor released an animation film of indigenous folk stories and a coffee table book titled *Unsung Heroes of Arunachal Pradesh*. He presented the book's first copy to the president.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu said that his government will introduce chapters on the unsung heroes of the state in the school syllabus.

The chief minister said that the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, conceptualized by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, is providing a platform to honour the unsung heroes of the state who sacrificed their lives for the country's freedom movement while addressing the Statehood Day.

"We have prepared a report on all unsung heroes of the state after extensive research and fieldwork, which was released today. Based on the history of the freedom fighters, we will soon introduce chapters in the school syllabus on their contribution to the country's freedom fight," Khandu said.

Terming Arunachal "the Northeast of NE states," the chief minister asserted that the state is developing, "for which the region is also developing."

"Earlier, the Northeast was a neglected region. But in the past eight and half years, the Modi government at the Centre brought a lot of developments in terms of connectivity and other social sectors," he said.

Asserting that there will be no dearth of funds for development work in Arunachal Pradesh, union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju, urged the people of the Northeastern state to be a part of the growth story.

"Nobody can develop the state single-handedly. Every stakeholder will have to make concerted efforts," Rijiju, who represents the Arunachal East constituency in the Lok Sabha, said.

The minister, addressing people on the 37th Statehood Day celebration said, "Prime Minister Narendra Modi has always prioritised the development of Arunachal Pradesh, and I, being the state's representative at the Centre, will see to it that there is no dearth of funds for the state."

He recalled that officers and ministers from the state had to go to Delhi in the past for sanctioning projects, and that, too, by "offering commission."

"Things have changed after PM Modi came to power in 2014. Now, nobody needs to go to Delhi for projects, which are being sanctioned by the Centre without any requests," he pointed out.

Rijiju noted that Arunachal, before attaining statehood, barely had any road.

"I had seen aircraft first and then vehicles as we didn't have road connectivity during childhood. The scenario has now changed with the state witnessing rapid development in the last few years," the minister added.

Earlier, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein said that "war memorials will be built to commemorate the wars and the brave sons of Arunachal in 12 places where battles between the locals and the British took place."

Delivering his welcome address on the occasion of the 37th Statehood Day celebration here on Monday, Mein informed that the names of 220 unsung heroes, "including 18 heroes, 76 martyrs and 126 freedom fighters from various communities, have been recorded and documented."

He said that the government honoured these unsung heroes posthumously with citations and medallions on the occasion of the 37th Statehood Day.

Mein informed that the state government has constituted "a core committee on unsung heroes" and entrusted the history department of Rajiv Gandhi University with the task of carrying out the research and documentation.

"They have carried out in-depth research work by carrying out field works, interacting with community leaders, academicians and intellectuals of the community, touring all the districts and visiting the historical incident places, researching and collecting the published books and articles and official gazette notification of those times that referred the incidences carrying out research works at various institutions across India, like the National Archives of India, New Delhi; the West Bengal State Archives, Kolkata; the Assam State Archives, Dispur; the Arunachal Pradesh State Archives, Itanagar; the Asiatic Society, Kolkata; and the Cellular Jail, Port Blair," he said.

Mein further informed that "scholars have also visited the United Kingdom and collected records of archival documents and photos from the British Library, the British Museum, the British Archives, the Royal Geographical Society, the School of Oriental and African Studies and the Pitts Rivers Museum, Oxford."

"As a result of the intense research work, the scholars have recorded and documented the various wars and freedom movements against the British," he said.

Mein said that the research scholars have also recorded three major wars fought by the tribal people of Arunachal Pradesh. "One of the wars, popularly known as the Khamti Rebellion of 1839, took place much before the Sepoy Mutiny of 1857," Mein said.

Other major field wars were the four Anglo-Abor wars of 1858, 1859, 1894 and 1911-12, fought by the Adis, and the 'Ninu Massacre of 1875' by the Wanchos, the DCM said. He said also that "many other incidences of resistance against the British invasion have also been recorded."

Mein added: "After the completion of the research work, our research scholars will be writing our own history in our own perspective and will publish it in book form which will be introduced in the school curriculum, so that our children are able to read and learn about our own history."

VDVKC micro-food processing unit set up at Ziro

Indigenous technologies in management of storage seeds

Nearly 30% of the seeds are lost during storage period due to insects, rodents and microorganisms. Management of these insect pests by chemical method is not economically feasible but also unsafe for consumption. There is evidence of ash, sand, herbs used in ancient civilization, which have been credited with mystical power for increasing storage life of seed called as indigenous management practices.

Insect's management:

1. Common salt: In this method of seed storage 150 -200gm of available table salt in houses is mixed for a kg of cowpea seeds manually and stored in jute gunny bags it should stich properly. Due to this practice insects are deter from the stored grains. This method is very much

suitable for short term storage and it is moderately effective and affordable in cost

2. Neem products

Neem leaves: Take required amount of neem and leaves and shade dry it till it becomes papery. Seeds are filled up to ¾th of a storage bin and covered with a clean cloth. Mix the above leaves and spread a handful on the surface of the seeds in the storage bag or bin. This method can also be followed in bigger storage containers.

Neem oil: It can be mixed with the seeds at the rate of 2% by the weight of the seed. Using oil is more effective than the leaves. Seeds can be stored by mixing with Neem oil (2-3 ml / kg of seed). 50 kg gunny bags of any seeds need 150 ml of the

oil for mixing.

Neem seed and kernel: Neem seed powder can be mixed at the rate of 1% to the volume of the seed. This is practiced for the control of khapra beetles, rice weevils etc. which is found in storage. Mix 30g of ginger rhizome powder and 50 g of neem kernel powder with 1 kg of any of the pulse variety such as cowpea, soyabean, redgram, Blackgram, green gram etc.

3. Wood ash and Lime: Wood ash is a safe and effective pest control material. Mix equal quantity of seed and wood. Ash to prevent the attack of beetles and other storage pests. Lantana camara leaf ash is very effective against pests attacking pulses. Dusting of lime powder about 10gm/kg of grains and later store in gunny bags.

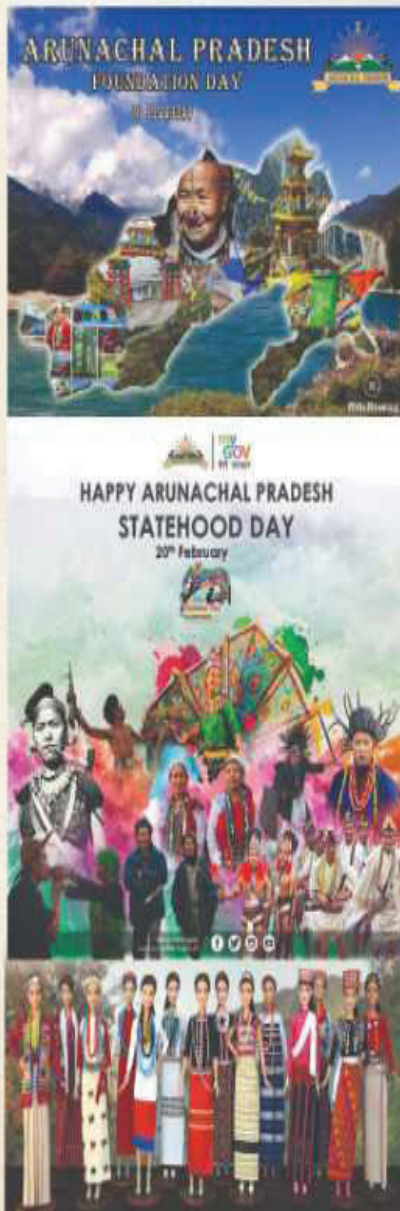

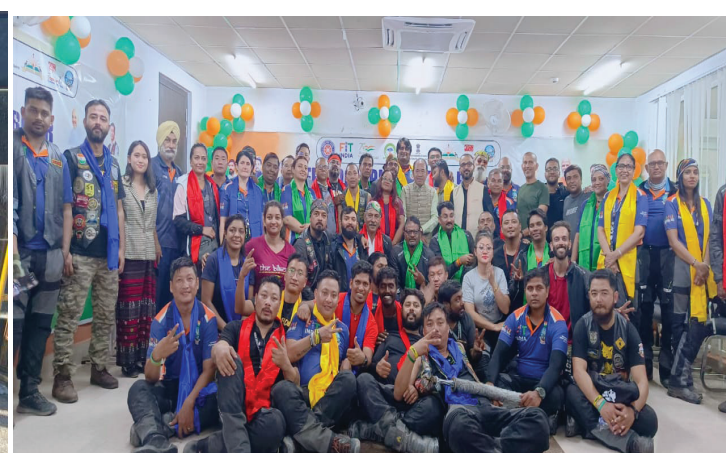

ITANAGAR, February 23: The 37th Statehood Day of Arunachal Pradesh was celebrated in all the districts with great enthusiasm and fanfare on 20 February.
