PASIGHAT, December 28: The Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways and Ayush, Sarbananda Sonowal and the Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh, Pema Khandu laid the foundation stones for capacity expansion at the North Eastern Institute of Ayurveda and Folk Medicine Research (NEIAFMR) here at Pasighat on Tuesday, December 26, 2023.

With a total investment of Rs. 53 crores, additional infrastructure will be developed at the institute.

The event was also graced by the Speaker of Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly, Pasang Dorjee Sona, Health & Family Welfare Minister Alo Libang, Arunachal East Lok-Sabha MP Tapir Gao, MLAs Kaling Moyong, Ninnog Ering, Kento Rina and Talem Taboh, State Information Commissioner Gumjhum Haider, the Vice-Chancellor of Arunachal Pradesh State University, Prof Tomo Riba, NEIAFMR Director Rabindra Teron and East Siang DC Tayi Taggu among other dignitaries.

Addressing the gathering, the Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways and Ayush, Sarbananda Sonowal said, "Folk medicine has a rich heritage of healing humanity for thousands of years. It has remained among our communities helping generations to enrich their lives."

Administration must cater for convenience facilities, medical aid and emergency rescue facilities along the highway: Governor



ITANAGAR, December 28:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) reviewed the frequent traffic congestion and urgent repair of internal roads of the Capital City Itanagar at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar on Wednesday, December 27, 2023.

The Governor expressed deep concern for the inconvenience caused to common people due to regular traffic jams and potholes on the city roads.

The Governor advised that internal roads should be quickly repaired, the vehicle parked on roadside removed and bypass/diversions be created at chokepoints. He urged the department of Urban Development to plan adequate parking areas and bazaar areas along the roads to decongest the traffic.

The Governor proposed a plantation drive along the highway, installing ornamental trees and flowers by the Environment and Forests Department with appropriate signage signifying the rich cultural aspects of flora and fauna of the State. The administration must cater for convenience facilities, medical aid and emergency rescue facilities along the highway, he said.

Governor calls for strengthening security apparatus in TCL

ITANAGAR, December 27:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) has called for strengthening the security apparatus in the eastern district of Tirap, Changlang and Longding (TCL) Districts.

The Governor discussed ways and means to strengthen the security in TCL districts with the Sector Commander of Assam Rifles, who called on him at Raj Bhavan here on Saturday, December 23, 2023.

He called upon the Commander to spruce up the system in militant affected areas in coordination with para-military forces and Arunachal Pradesh Police.

The Governor suggested implementation of measures to share real time intelligence with the forces including Arunachal Pradesh Police operating in TCL districts to stamp out anti-national elements and restore peace in the region.

The Commander briefed the Governor on the security scenario of the TCL region and various issues including goodwill projects of the Force. He assured the Governor of the proactive role of the Assam Rifles in maintaining law and order in the Eastern Arunachal.

Governor emphasizes on strengthening Industry ecosystem in the State

Union Minister of State for Textiles and Railways, Smti Darshana Vikram Jardosh called on the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar on Tuesday, December 26, 2023.

They discussed promotion of textiles and improvement in railway service.

The Governor emphasized on strengthening the industry ecosystem in the State, which has a vibrant textile segment. He said that large

numbers of womenfolk of Arunachal Pradesh are involved in the textile sector and such a proactive role of the Ministry will reinforce 'Atmanirbhartha' amongst the Arunachali women in true sense.

The Governor stressed on promotion of traditional textiles of Arunachal Pradesh by fostering the growth of micro and small enterprises in the State. He said it will be the growth engine for employment opportunities with special focus on women empowerment.

The Governor also called for

better services for the railway passengers, in view of large numbers of people availing the train services, especially the tourists. He further requested for commencing 'Goods train/bogies services' to facilitate transportation of goods and arts and crafts items to different parts of the country.

The Union Minister of State briefed the Governor on the proposed Railway projects as well as initiatives being taken by the Textile Ministry to promote textiles industry, through training and marketing.

Rijiju said this, after inaugurating a post office, a Canara bank and unveiling Mahatma Gandhi's bust at the NIT, Jote campus here on Saturday, December 23 last in presence of Doimukh MLA Tana Hali Tara, Deputy Commissioner Jiken Bomjen and Director NIT Dr. RP Sharma and other dignitaries.

Congratulating the students and the faculty members of NIT, the Union Minister said that, "Improving the facilities and services in the NIT

campus has always been a priority of the government. Such initiatives will supplement in creating a conducive academic atmosphere."

Imploring the inhabitants of the nearby villages to adopt the NIT and coordinate with the NIT administration in running the institute smoothly, Rijiju added that, "the locals and the elected PRI members must ensure no anti social elements disturb the management. A premier institute like NIT can increase the economic activities in the area. In return the NIT shall also take up subsidiary works in and around the village as a part of their social responsibility activities," he added.

Rijiju further asked the Director i/c, NIT to submit in written all the issues faced by the institute like boundary, campus issues etc. He also spoke about his Ministry's plan for technological advancements in long term weather forecasting. "This

long term system is envisioned to provide a precise forecast of rainfall, temperature, humidity etc which will help the farmers plan their agricultural activities accurately," he added.

Speaking on the occasion, Tana Hali Tara, MLA expressed gratitude to the Union Minister for supporting NIT, Jote right from its inception to shifting to its permanent location at Jote in 2021 from Yupia. He further brought to the notice that 53 non teaching staffs of the institute are yet to be regularized despite of working in the institute for 10-15 yrs and sought the intervention of the union minister.

Under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji, a sincere effort has been made to rejuvenate the traditional medicine including the folk medicine to bolster our healthcare system and provide people with an experience of enriched life experience. I am also happy to share with you all that a new centre on Sowa Rigpa will be set up in Arunachal Pradesh soon."

The institute has also been working towards scientifically documentation, record, researching as well as validate the folk medicine of the Northeast. The capacity expansion at the institute includes an Academic building, hostels for boys and girls students, staff quarters as well as director's bungalow. The hostels will accommodate 70 boys and 70 girls students from the institute. The investment will cater to develop of additional infrastructure for opening of Ayurveda college for imparting quality in undergraduate course in Ayurveda, Bachelor of Ayurveda Medicine and Surgery (BAMS) as well as Post Graduate courses in due course of time. The new Ayurveda college at NEIAFMR, Pasighat will promote and develop Ayurveda through Education, Research and Extension Services. The Engineering Projects (India) Limited, a Government of India Enterprise, is the executing agency for the project.

Elaborating on the role of NEIAFMR, Minister Sonowal said, "Under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister, the Government is working towards rejuvenating the traditional form of medicines like Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, Homoeopathy, Sowa Rigpa and Naturopathy. As the nation cruise towards becoming an Atmanirbharta, the Ayush ministry is working relentless towards enabling our rich traditional medicinal system with scientific validation for wider usage in the pharmaceutical and patient care areas of medical science. This is going to not only benefit our traditional healers but also expand the scope of folk medicine, allowing it to reach greater number of people to heal and enrich their lives.

The NEIAFMR is a leading institute of India that has been dedicatedly working towards reviving the folk medicine from the region. Our rich heritage of Ayurveda can also flourish from the local rich traditional medicinal practices. With this idea, the institute incorporated Ayurveda to further rejuvenate with a wider range of patient care solutions. In order to further bolster its effort, we are committed to develop this institute as the national hub of folk medicine."

The Government aims to further strengthen NEIAFMR with infrastructure like (Regional Raw Drug Repository (RRDR) & Museum, Sophisticated Analytical Instrument Facility (SAIF), State of Art Panchakarma Treatment & Research Center, Paramedical Teaching Center, etc at NEIAFMR, Pasighat in the near future, added the Union Minister.

Speaking on the occasion, the Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu said, "We are very happy that an institution of Arunachal Pradesh - North Eastern Institute of Ayurveda and Folk Medicine Research (NEIAFMR) - is working towards harnessing the richness of folk medicine of the Northeast.

Under the inspiring leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi the capacity of the institute is being expanded that will not only help the traditional medicine from the region but also is an opportunity to document our age old folk medicine in a scientific manner for wider application in patient care beyond its traditional geographical reach. Modi has always laid emphasis on the rejuvenation of India's traditional medicine as it has proven its effectiveness to treat various ailments and enabling a better life experience. The Governor called for concerted effort by all stakeholders and agencies, including district administration, police and Municipal Corporation in addressing the issues. He emphasized on working on 'mission mode', using technology and thinking out of the box to find solutions.

Principal Secretary (PWD), Commissioner (Urban Development), DIG (ICR), Deputy Commissioners of Itanagar Capital Region and Papum Pare, ASP (Capital), Commissioner, Itanagar Municipal Corporation, Chief Engineers of PWD and Highways briefed the Governor on the issues related to beautification and traffic of the State Capital.

1st Coordination Meet of Tourism stakeholders & Arunachal...

Addressing the meeting, DC Talo Potom urged all to work in coordination with each other and directed the DTO to work in liaison with the tour operators to prepare a detailed plan on tourism sector.

Earlier, DTO Capital Rechi Lugnya through a PPT explained the tourism structure at district level in detail.

She also briefed about the current tourism schemes like Chief Minister Paryatan Vikash Yojana which is for Homestay/food court/Adventure etc and Chief Minister Paryatan Shiksha Yojana (I&II). She also highlighted the existing assets of Tourism in Capital like the Gekar Sinyi (Ganga Lake), Biological Park Itanagar, Theravada Buddhist Temple, Itafort, J.L. Nehru State Museum, Itanagar Gompa, IG park etc.

DEOs urged to update status of Special Summary Revision...

Datas on webcasting of polling stations, issued arm licenses and steps planned to get the firearms deposited as per laid down guidelines were sought from each DEO.

The CEO emphasized on appointment of 16 Nodal Officers in the line of ECI's instructions, Sector Officers and Designated Sector Police Officers in every district with the announcement that he shall conduct review meeting on the progress of poll preparedness with all DEOs, once every week.

Speaking on the occasion, Deputy Election Commissioner, Manoj Kumar Sahoo advised all the District Election Officers to be involved in the Election-eering Processes by not delegating everything to the next in command officer. He informed that the current preparatory review meeting would be followed up by full-fledged meeting by ECI in the State in January 2024. He focused on importance of imparting periodical thorough trainings to the Officers and Officials for error free conduct of elections and advised the DEOs to analyze the law-and-order preparedness with the enforcement agencies in the district. Presence of Strong room in the district, stand-alone or combined with Counting Centre was also discussed.

Pankaj Srivastava, Director, ECI, urged the DEOs to tighten the Election Expenditure Monitoring Mechanism of their respective districts and suggested to go through latest compendium on the same. Formation of District Grievance Committee in the district and data entry in Election Seizure Management System for real time updates, circulars relating to frisking of passengers at airports were highlighted.

All the District Election Officers presented their district poll preparedness status through power point presentations. Thorough discussion on each content of PPT was done and the daylong review meeting ended on a suggestive note from the Deputy Election Commissioner, ECI. Earlier, the Chief Electoral Officer was on district tour to get first-hand information on poll preparedness in the adjoining districts of Longding and Tirap with DEOs and EROs concerned. The state is gearing up to conduct a smooth and peaceful Elections 2024.

missioner on January 17, 2024 at 1030 hrs along with deposited copy of the Treasury Challan including information as sought by the Appellant.

The Commission further cautioned that in case of his failure to comply with the directions, disciplinary action under Section 20(2) of the RTI Act, 2005 shall be recommended to the competent authority, under the service rules applicable on the PIO.
