Tobacco products seized

YINGKIONG, October 29:

The anti-tobacco flying squad, led by town magistrate Kenbang Jongkey with help of police, seized tobacco products from various shops operating within 100 yards of educational institutions here in Upper Siang district on Tuesday, October 29.

Approximately 17 kgs of different types of tobacco products, including cigarettes, beedis, chewing tobacco and gutkas were seized and 19 shopkeepers were fined for violating section 6(b) of the COTPA Act 2003.

The seizures were made during an unannounced checking drive conducted as part of the nationwide 'Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 2.0.'

The shopkeepers were warned against selling tobacco products within 100 yards of educational institutions.

Later, the seized tobacco products were destroyed under the supervision of the town magistrate on the outskirts of the town. The team also included officials of the district tobacco control cell.

State Cabinet approves Framing of Transfer and Posting Policy of nurses



ITANAGAR, October 28:

The State Cabinet that met on Monday, October 28 under Chief Minister Pema Khandu made several landmark decisions. Khandu chaired the cabinet from Tawang.

In a major decision, the State Cabinet approved Framing

of Transfer and Posting Policy of various nurses of all cadre in the department of Health & Family Welfare. This decision shall ensure equitable and rational distribution of competent human resources to health facilities in the state and deliver quality health care services to

the people.

The council of ministers approved the proposal for setting up of Administrative Reforms Commission to ensure efficient governance and address the challenges faced by the State administration. ARC is mandated to comprehensively review and recommend improvements in the State's governance apparatus. It shall strive to create a more efficient, citizen-centric and accountable administration.

In yet another landmark decision, the Cabinet gave approval to change the nomenclature of Special Investigation Cell (Vigilance) to Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) to curb and check all sort of corruption in the state. SIC being the premier investigating agency of the state and undertakes investigations into all major cases, the change of nomenclature signals clear intention of the Government that there will be a check on corruption and ACB will make sure that the corrupt are caught and punished.

Minister inaugurates LMO Plant and 8 bedded ICU at Zonal Hospital Aalo

AALO, October 29:

The plant can fill up to 40 oxygen cylinders at a time.

Wahge advised the doctors and the nurses to render services to the people with utmost sincerity and dedication.

The zonal hospital here is one of the best performing hospitals in the state. Recently, the hospital has been awarded LaQshya certification for fulfilling all standard services of labour room and OT.

Five out of 11 health and wellness centres in West Siang have received NQAS certificate from govt. of India. In the last four years, no malaria cases have been reported in the district.

The minister appreciated the

health department, West Siang, led by DMO Dr. Dubom Bagra for the achievements.

Wahge also inspected the two under construction hospital buildings, and asked the executing agencies to complete them within six months. He also directed the executing agencies to install air conditioners in all the OPD waiting halls.

NHM mission director Marge Sora appealed to the health workers and doctors to be sincere in their duties. He also appealed to the health department to ensure timely vaccination of children.

Earlier, the DMO and Dr. Karken Rina briefed the minister about the activities of health department of West Siang.

- Documentary should be submitted either on FilmFreeway.com under "Arunachal Film Festival" or physically through a pen drives at the DIPR office, Soochna Bhawan, Papu Nallah.
- The film must be submitted prior to the deadline set by the organizers, which is December 31st, 2024.

Governor participates in 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' plantation programme

State seeks support for uplift of Animal husbandry and fisheries sectors

ITANAGAR, October 29:

Union Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Panchayati Raj Prof. SP Singh Baghel assured to extend all support to develop animal husbandry and fisheries sectors in Arunachal Pradesh while adding that inclusion of Mithun and Yak species under the National Livestock Mission's Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP) shall be taken into serious consideration.

Responding to the issues raised by Gabriel D. Wangsu, minister for Animal Husbandry and Fisheries, GoAP during a review meeting at the State Civil Secretariat in Itanagar on Sunday, October 27, Prof. Baghel emphasized the importance of quick delivery of services and directed his accompanying officials to follow up on the proposals submitted by the states to ensure timely implementation. He also expressed concern over the apathetic attitude exhibited by banking institutions in delivering the benefits of government policies to farmers, highlighting the need for immediate corrective measures.

Prof. Baghel proposed several key initiatives aimed at enhancing the livestock sector in Arunachal Pradesh especially for strengthening animal health services for providing comprehensive animal health care and support to local farmers.

Besides institutes dedicated to imparting training for diploma courses in livestock management the union minister underscored the need to intensify goat and sheep husbandry practices.

These initiatives are expected to significantly contribute to the development of the livestock sector in Arunachal Pradesh, ensuring better health services, skilled personnel, and quality meat production, ultimately benefiting the farming community, the minister opined.

Prof. Baghel also instructed his officials to collaborate closely with the state government to implement



these suggestions effectively and address the concerns raised.

The meeting also underscored the commitment to support and empower the agricultural sector in Arunachal Pradesh through strategic initiatives and enhanced cooperation between government bodies and financial institutions.

While raising various concerns Gabriel D. Wangsu, Minister of Animal Husbandry and Fisheries urged the visiting the union minister to provide enhanced support for the development of animal husbandry and fisheries sectors in the state.

Mr. Wangsu highlighted the challenges faced by the state in implementing centrally sponsored schemes (CSS) and state-flagship programs designed to improve the welfare of farmers. He said that delays in the release of subsidy-related funds, particularly in loan disbursements by the Lead Bank have hampered efforts to double farmers' incomes by 2025. Further, Mr. Wangsu underscored the hindrance caused by present norms of releasing the Central Sponsored/ Central Sector funds in four instalments, and urged to draw a mechanism for timely disbursement in two instalments to improve program efficiency.

Mr. Wangsu also handed over a memorandum outlining specific initiatives to advance technical capacities in the Animal Husbandry and Fisheries sector.

His requests included establishment of a Veterinary College and Fisheries College in Arunachal Pradesh; inclusion of indigenous Mithun and Yak species under the National Livestock Mission's Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP); and establishment of a Regional Research Laboratory for Cold Water Fisheries.

Mr. Wangsu expressed optimism that the Union Government's intervention will be pivotal in overcoming obstacles to the growth of agriculture and allied sectors in Arunachal Pradesh, which remains crucial for the socio-economic upliftment of its rural communities.

Earlier, on October 28 last, Prof. Baghel accompanied by Gabriel D. Wangsu, Mr. Hage Tari, Secretary (AHVDD & Fisheries) and senior officers visited the Integrated Aqua Park, located in Tarin (Ziro), Lower Subansiri underscoring the state's commitment to adopting innovative models in aquaculture.

The team inspected various facilities such as Raceway culture system, RAS (Re-circulatory Aquaculture System), Bio Floc culture system etc. and other modern fisheries related activities. The MoS expressed satisfaction for the ongoing efforts and appreciated the project's alignment with the Ministry's goals to support sustainable fishery practices and enhance productivity in the sector.
