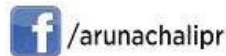

ITANAGAR, December 27:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) has condoled the demise of former Prime Minister of India Dr. Manmohan Singh.

The Governor said that Dr. Singh was a distinguished economist and statesman, and was instrumental in liberalizing India's economy, propelling the nation towards significant economic growth. Known for his humility, integrity, and intellectual brilliance, the passing away of Dr. Singh marks the end of an era in Indian politics, but his contributions to the State Arunachal Pradesh, like the Trans-Arunachal Pradesh Highway, the State Secretariat building, the Pare and Dibang power projects, and the Itanagar water supply scheme will endure as a lasting legacy, he said.

I join the people of Arunachal Pradesh in extending our deepest condolences to his family and relatives, the Governor said.

CM Pema Khandu attends Donyi Polo Day celebration



ITANAGAR, December 31:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu revealed plans for establishment of a university-level institute in Arunachal Pradesh for promotion, documentation, research and education on indigenous culture, faith and languages of the state in collaboration with the US-based International Centre for Cultural Studies (ICCS).

ICCS, it may be noted, already has a centre here in the state called RIWATCH at Roing in Lower Dibang Valley, which is exceptionally doing well

to document, preserve, promote and do research on Idu Mishmi culture and language.

Khandu had an exclusive meeting with ICCS Founder Prof Yashwant Pathak on the sidelines of the Silver Jubilee Celebrations of the Indigenous Faith and Cultural Society of Arunachal Pradesh (IFCSAP).

Speaking after dedicating a Donyi Polo Nyedar Namlo to the people at Pachin Colony on occasion of Donyi Polo Day, Khandu said that the idea stemmed during his discussion with

Prof Pathak to further boost the indigenous culture movement and put the significance of preserving indigenous culture and faith of the state on a global platform.

"Let there be research and documentation of our indigenous faiths and culture at the highest level. Let us produce scholars on indigenous culture and languages. Let our indigenous priests adorn the professor's gown and teach young minds about the age-old chants," he said.

While admitting that the proposal is in its nascent form and much work lies ahead, Khandu expressed optimism that with cooperation from ICCS the same would be realized in the coming years.

"If it comes up, it would be a huge boost to our movement to preserve our indigenous culture, faith and languages and thus preserve our identity. When a research center of much smaller scale-RIWATCH can do wonders, think what a university can do," he added.

Extending greetings to the people of Donyi-Polo faith, Khandu urged them to be 'practice what they preach'. He said that only speaking about Donyi Polo and its significance won't bear fruits but actually practicing Donyi-Polo faith in everyday life would.

Union Tribal Affairs Minister calls on the Governor

Viksit Bharat PPT challenge held

The Directorate of Youth Affairs of Arunachal Pradesh, in collaboration with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of India and the Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan in Itanagar, successfully conducted the Viksit Bharat—State Championship PPT Challenge on December 27 at the Papum Conference Hall, DK Convention Centre, Itanagar.

Freedom of Religion Act to be implemented soon: CM



ITANAGAR, December 27:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu informed that the Arunachal Pradesh Freedom of Religion Act 1978 – dormant as of date - will soon have its rules framed and implemented in the state.

Speaking at the Silver Jubilee Celebrations of the Indigenous Faith and Cultural Society of Arunachal Pradesh (IFCSAP) at I G Park, Khandu expressed gratitude to the first Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh, P K Thungon, during whose government, the legislation was passed in the Assembly in 1978 that envisions 'to provide for prohibition of conversion from one religious faith to

any other religious faith by use of force or inducement or by fraudulent means and for matters connected therewith'.

Khandu revealed that the Act was lying dormant so far but with a recent directive from the Gauhati High Court, the state government is bound to frame its rules for execution and implementation.

"The process of framing the rules is underway and soon we will have a proper structured Freedom of Religion Act in place," he said while adding that the development will play a significant role in preserving Arunachal's indigenous faith and culture.

While asserting that 'faith' and 'culture' are faces of the same coin, he insisted that both cannot 'walk' separately.

Citing examples of several indigenous tribes and cultures vanishing from the face of the world, Khandu underscored the necessity to preserve the distinct culture and faith of Arunachal Pradesh. He, however, expressed satisfaction that despite the onslaught of modernity and development, Arunachal Pradesh has not only successfully preserved its unique indigenous identity but has passed it down through generations.

Mock drills on earthquake held at Yingkiong

YINGKIONG, December 27:

The District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), Upper Siang in collaboration with 12th Bn NDRF successfully conducted District Level Mock Exercise on Earthquake Scenario here at general ground Yingkiong on December 27. It was a simulation scenario of earthquake measuring 6.5 richter scale.

During the mock exercise a real time scenario was set up of collapsed buildings, injured victims, road blockade and disrupted communications triggered by landslide, firebreak out etc at the ground and NDRF teams demonstrated meticulously their skills, search and rescue techniques and knowledge to operate in such situations. All resources -fire tenders, ambulance, excavator and vehicles including manpower were mobilized as per

mock drill plan.

Following the completion of mock exercise, a debriefing session was organized wherein Incidence Response System Team (IRST) members including Incidence Commander Dr.N.Dangnan, Assistant Commandant 12Bn NDRF Mr Manmeet Singh, Inspector Oyin Tari, Observer Er.Loyi shared their experience about mock drill. In the meantime, DDMO Ms. Anie Yangfo thanked NDRF and all the IRST members for their support and co-ordination in successful conduct of exercise.

The Mock exercise was conducted to test the IRS framework, enhance disaster response efficiency, coordination among all stakeholders and to improve community awareness of earthquake preparedness.

CM Pema Khandu attends Donyi Polo...

He underscored the role IFCSAP can play in preservation of indigenous culture of the state and suggested that under its leadership brainstorming sessions be held with all stakeholders to find out the basic reasons for erosion of indigenous culture and faiths in the state.

"Unless we realize and pinpoint the causes of cultural erosion, we will not be successful in preserving our culture and faith in the long run. IFCSAP should take the responsibility to find out the causes," he observed.

When drawn attention to the fact that earlier December 31 (Donyi Polo Day) used to be a holiday but not now, Khandu assured that there is no 'ill-intention' of the government in doing so. In fact, he informed, December 31 was earlier celebrated as the IFCSAP Day, which was declared a holiday by the state government.

"However, as the IFCSAP Day was fixed on December 1 to commemorate the birth anniversary of Late Talom Rukbo, considered father of the indigenous faith movement in the state, the holiday too got shifted. I assure you all that from December 31, 2025, the Donyi Polo day will be a declared local holiday in the areas inhabited by Donyi Polo believers," Khandu added.

The Nyedar Namlo dedication ceremony was also attended by Indigenous Affairs Minister Mama Natung, IFCSAP President Dr Emi Rumi, former Indigenous Affairs Minister Taba Tedir, former MLA Kaling Jerang, former Advisor to CM Tai Tagak, senior leader Kamen Ringu and others.

Kaling Borang, Chief Advisor of Donyi Polo Yelam Kebang and compatriot of late Talom Rukbo, from Pasighat was the Resource Person of the day.

Governor participates in IFCSAP foundation...

The Governor commended IFCSAP for facilitating the establishment of community centers, temples, and platforms that enable the practice and preservation of indigenous faiths. He observed that these centers serve as hubs for transmitting ancestral traditions and provide a nurturing space for youth facing challenges, offering care, guidance, and support.

The Governor suggested that the society organize workshops and seminars to educate younger generations about their ancestral heritage and emphasize the value of live storytelling to preserve oral histories, folktales, and legends. He urged the society to promote community engagement amongst various tribes of Arunachal Pradesh by involving youth in traditional crafts, music, and rituals, ensuring the continuation of these skills. He also advocated for inter-community exchanges among tribes to foster mutual understanding and appreciation and suggested organizing regular prayer gatherings and spiritual events rooted in indigenous beliefs.

The Governor stressed the need for preserving indigenous scripts, documenting rituals, prayers, songs, dances, and oral histories, and archiving them for future generations. He encouraged the creation of cultural repositories or libraries to safeguard artifacts, scripts, and manuscripts related to indigenous traditions.

In the silver jubilee celebration, the Governor presented Shri Techiko with the IFCSAP Excellent Award for his contributions to the preservation of Indigenous culture and faith.

State Minister of Indigenous Affairs and Home, Shri Mama Natung, Prof. Yashwant Vishnupant Pathak, founder member of International Centre for Cultural Studies in Bharat, IFCSAP President, Dr. Emi Rumi, Vice President Er. Pai Dawe and General Secretary, Smt Maya Murtem also spoke on the occasion.

A cultural presentation showcasing the vibrant traditions and heritage of the indigenous communities was presented on the occasion.

Union Tribal Affairs Minister calls...

The Union Minister apprised the Governor about additional assistance that has been granted beyond the Central schemes by Hon'ble Prime Minister which is being sponsored by 17 ministries under coordination by ministry of Tribal Affairs to include housing, health, education, telecommunication, sports etc. He said that the State could bid for these based on justifications to benefit the tribal societies.

The Governor discussed schemes for the promotion of tribal livelihood, tribal entrepreneurship and facilitation of livelihood opportunities. He stressed livelihood opportunities for tribal artisans of North Eastern States of India through increased efficiency in procurement, logistics and marketing of tribal products.

The Union Minister appreciated the suggestions and assured the Governor to address the requirements of Arunachal Pradesh.

Tayang reviews 4th Edition Arunachal Yuva...

Later on Secretary and his team inspected the ongoing construction of outdoor stadium Aalo and he also inspected the venue at Jirdin village under Kombo Circle and interacted with the GBs , Public's and urged them to cooperate the Govt. calendar events of 4th Arunachal YuvaSamanvay. Also Secretary (SYA) informed the DC West Siang to conduct more meeting for successful conduct of the mega event.

During the meeting ADC(HQ), DSO Sports, DTO (Tourism), UD, DIPRO, DTO(Transport) were present and accompanied the Secretary(SYA).

Freedom of Religion Act to be...

"Most of the credit of course goes to the pioneers of IFCSAP and hundreds of volunteers who gave their time and energy in dedicatedly working for preservation of indigenous culture. As the saying goes "Loss of culture is loss of identity" we have succeeded in retaining our culture and our identity stands tall among its peers across the world. Today, we acknowledge the instrumental role IFCSAP has played in fostering a deeper understanding of indigenous faiths and cultures both within the state and beyond," he said.

He paid rich tributes to the champions of indigenous faith and culture including Golgi Bote late Talom Rukbo, late Mokar Riba, late Nabam Atum, Dr Tai Nyori and others.

Recognizing the importance of saving the indigenous culture,faith and languages from disappearing, the state government, he informed, the state government established the Department of Indigenous Affairs in 2017.

"Through the department we have collaborated with IFCSAP and the CBOs in doing everything possible to preserve and promote our indigenous culture, institutions and languages," he added.

Khandu, however, cautioned that the government and its initiatives alone cannot protect and promote indigenous culture and faith. He said that the responsibility lies on the 26 major tribes of the state.

To an oft-repeated request by indigenous groups, Khandu said that the process for renaming of the department of Indigenous Affairs has been initiated.

While assuring unconditional support to the indigenous movement, the Chief Minister called upon the IFCSAP, its associates and the CBOs to continue working for preserving the state's indigenous culture, faith and languages and take the next generation into their folds.

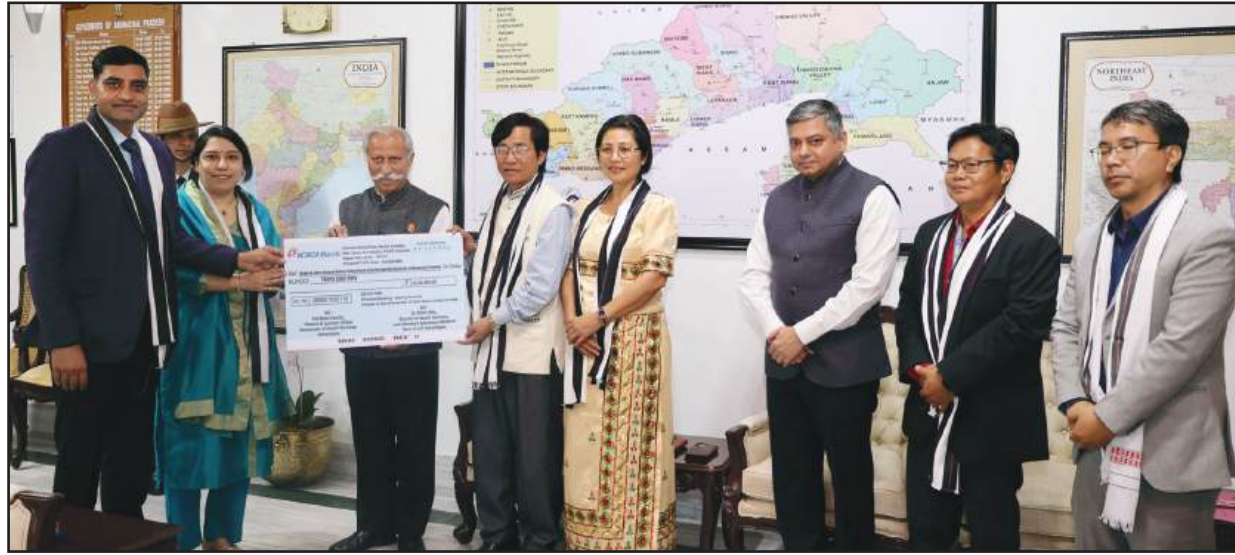

- Films that were submitted in the previous Arunachal Film Festival will not be allowed to participate again.
- The film should not be uploaded or made available on any social media platform.
- The films, trailers, clippings and posters of the selected films will be put in the official social media pages as well as in the archive of the Arunachal Film Festival, and will be used for further promotional and publicity purposes of the AFF. Ownership right of the film to remain with the filmmaker.
- All disputes in respect of any matter relating to the AFF shall be subjected to the exclusive jurisdiction of the competent courts and forums in Itanagar capital region.
