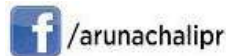

Aboh provides relief materials to Chinhan village fire victims

LAZU, January 15:

On behalf of Khonsa West MLA and Adviser to Minister (State Transport), Chakat Aboh, a team led by public leader Riawang Kamhwa and Longlang Aboh distributed relief materials to the fire-affected families of Chinhan village under Lazu Circle.

It may be mentioned that four houses in Chinhan village were reduced to ashes in a devastating fire incident on January 10 last.

In the meantime, Chakat Aboh appealed to the residents of hilly, fire-prone areas to maintain sufficient spacing while constructing houses to minimize the risk of frequent fire accidents.

The relief materials provided included 25 pieces each of CGI sheets and other essential items for the four affected families.

State cabinet to take significant step toward strengthening infrastructure and governance



ITANAGAR, January 15:

The first meeting of the Arunachal Pradesh Cabinet for the year 2025, chaired by Chief Minister Pema Khandu, was held on Wednesday, January 15. The meeting marked a significant step toward strengthening infrastruc-

ture, governance, and citizen service delivery across the state.

The Cabinet decided to recommend to the Government of India the proposal to set up a 100-seat Medical College and a 420-bedded hospital at Namsai under the Aspirational District

Programme. This project is planned under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model and aims to bridge the gap in healthcare services and medical education in the region. The total project cost is ₹375 crore.

Chief Secretary calls on the Governor



ITANAGAR, January 10:

State Chief Secretary Manish Kumar Gupta called on the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar on Friday, January 10 to discuss the developmental progress of the State.

The Governor said that regular inspections and reviews need to be carried out for Central and State governments sponsored programmes and policies. He underscored the review of programmes which have been committed by the Hon'ble Prime Minister including eradication of Tuberculosis by 2025.

The Chief Secretary informed the Governor of the State's efforts to propel development in all spheres. Towards that purpose a conference

of Deputy Commissioners has been planned to address the implementation of 'Sashakt Arunachal'. The Governor appreciated the State's efforts and advised the Chief Secretary to include issues, which emerged during his numerous visits to the Districts.

The Governor emphasised on real time monitoring of developmental works in the State. He stressed on timely implementation and quality work of the projects.

The Governor advised the Chief Secretary to start automation of all data of the departments and districts. He said that such concerted steps will ensure the analysing of the implementation process and avenues where more funds and technological inputs are required.

Agri. Minister Calls for Unity and Brotherhood at Charaideo Mahotsav

ASSAM, January 11:

In a significant display of inter-state solidarity, Gabriel D. Wangsu, Arunachal Pradesh's Minister for Agriculture and multiple other portfolios, called for unity and brotherhood between the two northeastern states during his participation in the prestigious Charaideo Mahotsav in Assam on Saturday, January 11.

The festival, which celebrates the rich history of the Charaideo Maidams, saw the attendance of several international diplomats, including His Excellency, ZawOo, Ambassador of Myanmar, accompanied by his wife Mrs. Pwint New Wai and Economic Attaché MyoMyint Maung. Other distinguished guests included Mr. Kongkeo Sayvangmeuang, Deputy Chief of Mission and Counsellor of the Lao PDR Embassy, Mr. Conrad Nana Kojo Asiedu from the Ghana High Commission, Joseph A Kawinga from the Malawi High Commission and Dharmeswar Konwar, MLA of Sonari, Assam.

In his address, Minister Wangsu highlighted the historical significance of the relationship between Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. "The bond between Assam and Arunachal Pradesh extends far beyond geographical proximity. It is deeply rooted in shared histories, intertwined cul-

tures and enduring relationships between our communities," he said.

Speaking on the special connection between the Wanchos of Arunachal Pradesh and the Ahom dynasty, Wangsu recounted the historical matrimonial alliance between Queen Nape Wangcha of the Wanchos and an Ahom king, noting that her well-preserved graveyard in Kanubari still stands as a timeless reminder of this enduring relationship. "This bond is not just a historical fact; it is a symbol of love, respect and unity that has defined the relationship between our people for centuries," Wangsu stated.

The Minister also expressed pride in Assam's recent achievements, particularly praising the state's progress under Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma's leadership and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's guidance. While congratulating the people of Assam for the Charaideo Maidams' UNESCO World Heritage status, describing it as a momentous achievement, he applauded the festival's role in raising awareness about these sacred burial sites and their historical significance.

The Charaideo Festival, initiated in 2015, aims to celebrate the historical and cultural legacy of the Charaideo Maidams, which served as the first capital of the Ahom dynasty.

CM attends Silver Jubilee celebration of the Galo Welfare Society



AALO, January 10:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu has hailed the Galo community for cooperating with the state government and supporting in successful implementation of government schemes and projects.

Speaking at the opening ceremony of the three-day Silver Jubilee celebration of the Galo Welfare Society (GWS) here on Friday, January 10, Khandu said the Galos – one of the most advanced communities of the state – have been in the forefront in implementation of government schemes and projects, which has completely facilitated the Galo-dominated areas.

He asserted the state government's commitment to keep the trend of development on albeit in a faster pace.

Informing that during his tenure of nine years as chief minister several milestones were created, Khandu credited the growth track record to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's concern and love for the North East.

"Modi ji always says – we have to compensate for the 60 years of deprivation and neglect given by the Centre to the North East. We have witnessed the transformation. We still remember the situation of Arunachal Pradesh before ten years," he insisted.

Khandu said that as the revenue generation of the state has grown substantially in the last 7-8 years, the state government has been able to execute people centric projects and welfare schemes.

Stressing on the need to tap the natural potential of the state for resource generation, he pointed that the more revenue generated more development will come. He, however, cautioned that in the face of development and modernity, the cultural identity of the state's indigenous communities should not get diluted.

"We cannot sacrifice our cultural identity and indigenous languages for the sake of development. And it is upto organizations like GWS, AITF and

other CBOs to preserve our tribal identity alive for posterity," he said.

Drawing attention towards reports of alarming drug addiction among Galo youths, Khandu called upon the GWS, especially its youth wing, to join with the government to fight against the menace. He said the state government and its police are combating the menace jointly with all the North Eastern state governments and police. However, he said, active participation of the society is needed in creating and spreading awareness.

Khandu urged all not to treat addicts as outlaws or outcasts.

"Treat them as you treat any other patient. They are patients and we need to care and treat them," he appealed.

He appreciated the Mothers Vision NGO for running a rehabilitation centre at Aalo but also observed that due to lack of advanced facilities, there is a need to take some of the patients to well equipped facility centres outside.

Khandu announced that in case patients from very poor family background need such shifting, the state government will bear their expenses. He asked the district administration to identify rehab centres where they will be shifted and the government will take over.

Taking the opportune moment of the platform, the Chief Minister reiterated his stand on the Siang Upper Multipurpose Project, the significance of which has grown manifold after the reports of China constructing the world's largest dam on the river in Tibet.

"Please remember, this is not a hydroelectric project but a multipurpose project and a project of national importance," he added.

DCM takes stock of Dibang Multipurpose Project



DAMBUK, January 11:

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein conducted a comprehensive site visit to the Dibang Multipurpose Project, a transformative initiative poised to redefine Arunachal Pradesh's energy landscape. With an installed capacity of 2880 MW, this flagship project is set to enhance the state's energy infrastructure while driving economic growth and connectivity in the region.

Speaking at the site, Deputy Chief Minister Mein reflected on the progress of the long-awaited project: "This marks a significant step forward

in our efforts to harness Arunachal Pradesh's vast hydropower potential. Under Chief Minister Pema Khandu's leadership, we have terminated stalled projects and handed over it to the CP-SUs. Today, the Dibang Multipurpose Project is a testament to what can be achieved through perseverance and collaboration."

Mein highlighted the role of local communities and youth in driving the project's development, emphasizing their contributions as key to its success. "This initiative is not just about energy—it's about creating opportuni-

ties. It will catalyze economic growth, boost tourism, and improve connectivity, bringing long-term benefits to the people of Arunachal Pradesh," he said.

The Deputy Chief Minister also deliberated on infrastructure improvements associated with the project, maritime boating from dam site towards Anini. He also informed that the bypass road for Roing, Pasighat and Gerakamukh have been proposed with the Central Govt as it will ease movement of the heavy vehicles carrying construction materials.

Mass drug awareness rally organised

LUNGLA, January 11:

A mass drug awareness rally cum campaign was successfully organised in Lungla sub-division in Tawang district to address the growing concerns of drug abuse in the region on Saturday, January 11.

Sponsored by local MLA Tsering Lhamu, the event aimed to educate the community about the dangers of substance abuse and promote a drug-free society.

The event, organized collaboratively by the NGO Dhagpa Mirror, the local administration, and the Tawang District Health Society, witnessed the participation of prominent dignitaries including Deputy Commissioner Kanki Darang, Lungla ADC Lobsang Wangchu Bapu, district SP DW Thongon, DMO Dr Rinchin Neema, ZPMs of Lungla and Jemithang Duitongkhar, Thutan Gombu and Lek Norbu, along with representatives from various organizations such as WWA, DEWA, MMT, AMSU, and public leaders, students, and general public.

Carrying banners, posters, and placards with anti-drug slogans, students from multiple schools led the awareness rallies from their respective institutions. The event culminated at Tsona Gontse Rinpoche Amphitheatre at Lungla HQs.

Speaking at the event, Tawang DC Kanki Darang commended the organizers and urged all participants to take a pledge to build a drug-free society. He emphasized the pivotal role of parents in guiding their children and encouraged students to actively engage in sports and other constructive activities.

SP DW Thongon shared alarming statistics from a 2019 national survey, which placed Arunachal Pradesh as one of the highest-ranking states in drug and synthetic substance abuse. He lauded the district's efforts in reducing drug-related activities and highlighted the positive impact of community-led awareness campaigns.

The campaign also featured 'Miss Northeast 2023' Kenei Ritse,



who spoke about the importance of addressing drug abuse and mental health issues, while Anupam Rohit, Project Head of Recovery Wellness Society, shared his personal journey from drug addiction and emphasized the importance of love and support for recovering addicts.

Bendang Imsong, State Coordinator for Arunachal Pradesh and Naga-

land under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, spoke on the Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan, highlighting efforts for reducing substance demand.

He also administered the Nasha Mukta Bharat pledge to the participants. The event concluded with cultural performances by students, adding vibrancy to the campaign and reinforcing the message of unity against drug abuse.

State cabinet to take significant step toward strengthening...

In a major decision to enhance financial viability of large hydropower projects rejuvenated through MoAs with Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSUs), the State Cabinet approved the grant of SGST reimbursement concessions for the Tato II Hydroelectric Project (700 MW) and the Kamala Hydroelectric Project (1,720 MW). The Tato II HEP, located on the Siyom River in the Shi Yomi district and the Kamala HEP, is located on the Kamala River in the Upper Subansiri district. Both these projects will be implemented in Joint Ventures between the State Government and the respective CPSUs, with the State Government holding 26% equity share in the Joint Venture.

These projects entail a cumulative investment of around ₹35,000 crore and are expected to generate close to ₹470 crore in free power and ₹79 crore Local Area Development Fund every year after commissioning. These 2 projects are part of the 13 stalled large HEPs rejuvenated by the State Government through the signing of MoAs with four CPSUs in 2023.

The two HEPs will generate significant employment and self-employment opportunities through infrastructure development and ancillary services, along with benefits to local communities through enhanced infrastructure, including roads, healthcare, and educational facilities, fostering long-term socioeconomic growth. The projects will upskill local workers, create a pool of skilled labor, and boost regional economic activity, contributing to Arunachal Pradesh's development, as well as harnessing Arunachal Pradesh's significant hydroelectric generation potential of 58,000 MW.

The State Cabinet also approved the policy on the Arunachal Pradesh Policy for Restoration of Terminated Large Hydropower Projects under Special Circumstances, 2025. This policy aims to revive terminated large hydropower projects that achieved substantial progress at the site. This will help facilitate a development-focused environment through timely project restoration and promote investments and employment opportunities, while enhancing the ease of doing business in the state.

In an effort to enhance administrative efficiency and optimize citizen service delivery, the State Cabinet also approved:

a. the upgradation of 20 JE (Civil) posts in the Department of Hydropower Development to 20 ASW (Civil) and AE (Civil) posts to streamline the efficient functioning of the Department and ensure proper manning of positions at the divisional and district levels, and address issues of stagnation and lack of career advancement opportunities for the incumbent officers

b. Creation of 36 posts in the Department of Land Management including 1 Group A Post, 15 Group B posts and 20 Group C posts to enhance operational capacity of the Department

c. 32 teaching and non-teaching posts were approved for the Government Engineering College, Tezu, to enhance its academic and administrative capacity, and provide new age-learning and skilling opportunities for students

Khandu attends SARAS Fair



ITANAGAR, January 13:

"India will develop when the North East develops. North East will develop when Arunachal develops. Arunachal will develop when its villages develop. Villages will develop when women of the villages develop," said Chief Minister Pema Khandu after opening the SARAS Fair on Monday, January 13.

The SARAS Fair, organized annually by the state government, is a bridge connecting talented rural artisans with national and international markets. It serves as a platform to showcase the rich cultural heritage, handicrafts, handlooms, and organic products of villages while also promoting sustainable livelihoods, where SHGs from across the state puts up their products for display and sale.

Khandu informed that currently, state SHGs and federations collectively manage a corpus pool of about ₹300 crores, which, he said, is a testament to the scale and impact of the collective effort within small but difficult terrains of Arunachal Pradesh.

He expressed happiness that the effort towards making SHG members into Lakhpati households is flowing down in a systemic manner. In the first phase of the certification, Arunachal has been able to certify over 1600 Lakhpatididis in the state.

"This success is a result of their hard work, resilience, and diversified livelihood activities, such as agriculture, horticulture, livestock farming, and small enterprises," Khandu said while appreciating the dedication of the Arunachal State Rural Livelihood Mission (ArSRLM) officials engaged in handholding the SHGs.

"We have further identified 29000 potential SHG members whose capacity building has started so as to make them Lakhpatididi. These individual and collective achievements reflect the power of unity and the entrepreneurial spirit of our women," he said.

Khandu said this fair is in line with the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi Ji, who has been promoting the concept of "Vocal for Local" and "Atmanirbhar Bharat".

The fair includes food stalls by "Mother's Kitchen" - a unique project which supports 433 catering units managed by over 3,500 members of SHGs, who are redefining community-led service by running and operating kitchen units; Handloom-handicraft products from all those SHG members for whom the Cluster based initiative was launched (as on date there are close to 900 artisans are involved with their diverse range of the product to cater to wider market); and processed items from 84000 members engaged in high value-added Agri-Horti-forest products from various SHG groups.

Khandu reiterated that the state government is committed to empowering the SHGs by providing them with access to training, credit, and market linkages.

"Their participation in SARAS Fair is a reflection of their aspirations and achievements, and I take this opportunity to salute their indomitable spirit," he said.

On the occasion, the Chief Minister launched the Handloom, Handicraft, Crochet, Knitting & Embroidery Cluster Initiative under ArSRLM to support rural artisans engaged in weaving, crochet, knitting, embroidery, and handicrafts.

Under this initiative, Master Trainers will be developed across the state through specialized Design Development Training programs. To further strengthen these clusters, each unit will receive seed capital support of ₹2 lakh per cluster. This initiative aims to enhance skills of rural artisans by providing them with advanced training and design expertise, support sustainable livelihoods and create income-generating opportunities for women and marginalized communi-

ties and preserve and promote the traditional arts and crafts of Arunachal Pradesh while integrating them with contemporary market demands.

Capital Support of Rs 1 Crore each for Handloom Cluster, Handicraft Cluster, Crochet, Knitting and Embroidery Cluster (total Rs 3 Crore) were handed over by the Chief Minister.

"The Rs 1 Crore Support provided by the state government for the establishment of a dedicated marketing outlet for SHG products in the State Capital will be implemented through the Arunachal State Rural Livelihoods Mission", Khandu announced.

The outlet will serve as a permanent marketing platform for SHGs to showcase and sell their handcrafted and handloom products year-round. Further, an inventory and fulfillment hub will be made functional to support the onboarding of SHG products on e-commerce platforms, enabling access to national and global markets.

Khandu informed that to provide market links to farmers, the state government, through the state marketing board, has signed agreements with the Indian Army and ITBP posted in Arunachal Pradesh for supply of fresh vegetables, fruits and other food products. He said that as the system gets smoothened and well-oiled, this would become a huge marketing place for locally produced products.

"The seed of state rural livelihood Mission which was sown way back in 2016 has grown deep and wide now involving close to 1,40,000 households and 14000 SHG across 25 districts and 125 blocks of the State," he informed.

SHGs from Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, Assam, Jammu and Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh, Goa and Jharkhand are also participating in the SARAS Fair.

An Asiatic pangolin with a pangopup was rescued by one Taying Taduk along with his wife Yale Taduk of Bamin village in Arunachal Pradesh's East Siang district from their farm yard on Tuesday, January 15.

The rescued pangolin with its pangopup was later handed over to the Range Forest Officer (RFO), Anchalghat Wildlife Range, D Er-

ing Memorial Wildlife Sanctuary, Pasighat, Orin Perme, before being released inside the sanctuary area by the wildlife officials.

Asiatic pangolin (Philippine pangolin) is listed as Schedule I animal under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 and as endangered in the Red List of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

All pangolin species are listed in Appendix I of Convention on

International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) which prohibits their commercial trade.

Meanwhile, RFO Orin Perme has felicitated Taduk and his wife for rescuing the endangered species. He also appealed to all the people of the fringe villages to come forward and help in conservation of wildlife and control wildlife crime in and around the sanctuary area.
