CM announces ₹ 50 Lakhs and Job for family of IAF Martyr Tage Hailyang



ZIRO, April 24:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu on Thursday, April 24 announced Rs 50 lakhs and a government job for a family member of Late Corporal Tage Hailyang, who was among the 26 shot dead by terrorists at Baisaran near Pahalgam in Kashmir on April 22.

Khandu, who visited late Hailyang's native village Tajang in Ziro, Lower Subansiri this morning, paid floral tributes to the mortal remains of the late airman and consoled the grieving family members and relatives.

He also announced that the state government will construct a permanent memorial of late Hailyang in the village.

"In the face of grave danger, Tage Hailyang demonstrated exceptional courage. He had the chance to escape but chose instead to protect those around him. Risking his own life, he guided civilians to safety, helping them escape the line of fire. His selflessness in that critical moment stands as a rare and inspiring act of bravery," said Khandu.

Offering his deepest condolences, Khandu said that the loss is beyond measure, and the people of Arunachal Pradesh stand in solidarity with the family during this time of profound sorrow.

Condemning the heinous act of terrorism, Khandu observed that Pakistan's continued sheltering of terrorist elements is a grave threat to global peace and called for resolute action.

"I appreciate the firm stand of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji and am confident that under his leadership, the nation will respond with the strength and resolve that such a grave sacrifice demands," he said.

He further said that late Hailyang's inspiring journey - from his early education in Ziro and Haryana's Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram - to his graduation from Don Bosco College, Itanagar, and his dedicated service in the Indian Air Force since 2017, is a shining testament to the strength, discipline, and patriotism of the state's youth.

"Late Tage Hailyang's legacy will endure. His name will forever be etched in the history of Arunachal Pradesh as a symbol of valour, and his sacrifice will continue to inspire generations to come," Khandu added.

NEEPCO Director (Personnel) calls on the Governor

Automation is imperative for good governance: Governor



ITANAGAR, April 30:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), participated in a PowerPoint presentation on the application of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar, on Wednesday, April 30.

The Governor emphasized that automation is imperative for good governance, stating that adopting AI tools can significantly enhance efficiency in record-keeping, data analysis, and real-time planning. He reiterated Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a Viksit Bharat (Developed India) through the strategic use of technology. He underscored that Arunachal Pradesh can also move

towards becoming Viksit Arunachal by building a strong foundation based on AI integration.

Highlighting the benefits of AI, the Governor said that the best part about AI tools is the speed and accuracy with which they deliver results. He further observed that while individual departments are functioning efficiently, challenges persist in inter-departmental coordination. Technology can help analyze, plan, and address these gaps, he said, stressing the need for structured, tech-enabled governance.

The Governor also pointed out specific areas where AI tools can make a tangible impact, such as in anti-drug operations, real-time moni-

toring of infrastructure projects, particularly road development, and in enhancing administrative oversight.

Drawing from his experiences during district tours, the Governor urged ministers and senior officers to prioritize bottom-up automation, starting from the district level. As an enabler, I will continue my mission to promote automation, he affirmed.

DC ICR chairs review meeting on Monsoon Preparedness

ITANAGAR, April 29:

With the onset of the monsoon approaching, a comprehensive review meeting on disaster preparedness was convened under the chairmanship of Talo Potom, Deputy Commissioner, Itanagar Capital Region on Tuesday, April 29. The meeting, attended by heads of line departments and administrative officers, focused on ensuring a coordinated and effective response to potential emergencies such as floods, landslides, and heavy rainfall incidents.

Key directives issued during the meeting include:

PHED was asked to report any damage or disruption to water pipelines caused by illegal earth-cutting activities and to take necessary legal action against defaulters. The department was also directed to ensure timely pipe booking and adequate water supply arrangements for emergency situations.

Power Department was instructed to regulate voltage fluctua-

tions and ensure prompt restoration of vulnerable or damaged electrical poles and installations.

PWD and Highway Division were tasked with clearing all roads and drainage systems of blockages to ensure uninterrupted transportation and effective drainage during heavy rains.

DF&CSO was directed to maintain sufficient buffer stock of essential commodities and LPG. The officer was also instructed to reserve an adequate supply of POL (Petrol, Oil & Lubricants) for emergency operations and the movement of vehicles.

DTO (Transport Department) was asked to prepare and submit a detailed list of Light Motor Vehicles (LMVs), JCBs, and dumpers, along with names and contact details of their owners and drivers, for potential deployment in emergency situations.

SDRF was directed to stay on high alert and remain prepared to carry out search and

DCM Mein conferred Honorary Doctorate by Gauhati University



GUWAHATI, April 25:

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein was conferred the degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Honoris Causa) by Gauhati University, Assam, during its 32nd Convocation held in Guwahati

on Friday, April 25.

The honorary degree of Doctor of Philosophy was conferred to Mein in recognition of his multifaceted contributions to political leadership, cultural preservation, and social

development. He served as Speaker of the Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly from 1998 and held key ministerial positions, including Finance, Power, and Non-Conventional Energy Resources. In 2023, he was appointed Chairman of the North-Eastern Regional Power Committee, underscoring his leadership in regional energy cooperation.

As a founding member of the Tai Khamti Heritage and Literary Society, he helped revise the Tai Khamti script and promote folk songs and music. Papum Pare gears up for SAFF U-19 Championships 2025: SAFF to be a plastic-free event

**YUPIA, April 29:**

The Deputy Commissioner of Papum Pare, Jiken Bomjen, convened a meeting with the Arunachal Pradesh Football Association (APFA) to review preparations for the upcoming SAFF U-19 Championships. The event is scheduled to take place at the Golden Jubilee Outdoor Stadium, Yupia, from 9th to 18th May 2025.

Describing the international tournament as a matter of pride for the entire state and the country as a whole, DC Bomjen emphasized the importance of collective and coordinated efforts among all stakeholders to ensure its success. He conducted a detailed review of arrangements, including medical services, security, traffic management, water and electricity supply, road

Director Sports Tadar Apa, ADC Tame Yajum, Administrative Officers, HoDs and officials from the APFA attended the meeting.

rescue operations whenever necessary during emergencies.

DMO will oversee medical preparedness, including the availability of essential medicines and ambulance services. All health centers have been instructed to ensure their disaster management protocols are up to date and functional.

EACs and Administrative Officers were instructed to identify suitable relief camp locations, vulnerable areas, and evacuation routes in their respective jurisdictions.

IMC were instructed to prepare for the safe disposal of carcasses and maintain sanitation to prevent the outbreak of diseases during the monsoon. DIPRO was asked to ensure the timely dissemination of early warning alerts to the general public regarding heavy rainfall and other weather-related developments.

Deputy Commissioner Talo Potom emphasized that all departments must maintain a high level of readiness and work in close coordination to respond swiftly and effectively to any crisis. He also underscored the importance of regular situation reporting, resource inventory updates, and public awareness campaigns to minimize disaster risks.

Deputy Commissioner, Lower Subansiri District Vivek HP distributed Test Reports of the Gastric (Stomach) Cancer Epidemiology & Risk Study done on 203 volunteers at Gyati Takka General Hospital, Ziro on Friday, April 25. The screening was done from March 5 to 8, 2025 in a move aimed at understanding and preventing gastric cancer among the people of Ziro Valley. While distributing the test reports, DC Vivek HP expressed his concerns over excessive consumption of carbonated drinks like Coke, Pepsi etc. by the children & youths of Ziro and also cautioned the people about decreasing population of certain clans

of Apatani tribe and exhorted the participants to take care of their dietary habits and asked them to encourage their family members and friends to come forward and assist the screening team in their endeavors.

Dr. B.B. Borthakur, Director, BBCL, Guwahati gave brief highlights of the cancer screening test reports. He said, out of 203 participants, 51 are on High Risk Category, 70 are on Moderate Risk Category and 82 are on Nominal Risk Category for developing stomach cancer. He further told that there are multiple factors causing stomach cancer, so requested the participants to voluntarily assist them for few years, so that his team can

assess their conditions, monitor their diets and bring forth timely interventions for prevention of onset of gastric cancer.

The on going gastric cancer screening program is a collaboration between Dr. B. Boroah Cancer Institute (BBCI), Guwahati, The State Cancer Society of Arunachal Pradesh, Naharlagun and Gyati Takka General Hospital, Ziro with support from the District Administration of Lower Subansiri and the Community Advisory Board of Ziro. Dr. Koj Jarbo, Medical Superintendent of GTGH, Ziro, other doctors, medical staff and hundreds of participants also attended the test reports distribution program.

He proudly announced that 16 out of Arunachal Pradesh's 27 districts have been declared malaria-free, marking significant progress in the state's public health achievements. These malaria-free districts include: Tawang, West Kameng, East Kameng, Pakke Kessang, Lower Subansiri, Kra Daadi, Kurung Kumey, Kamle, Upper Subansiri, Dibang Valley, Anjaw, East Siang, Siang, Namsai, Longding, Lower Siang, Lower Diabng valley.

Dr. Mulung commended the tireless efforts of health workers, community volunteers, and field staff who have made this possible.

He reiterated the department's commitment to achieving a malaria-free Arunachal Pradesh by 2027.

As part of the observance, a Pledge and slogan on Malaria was led by Dr. Rikken Rina, Director of Health Services, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, in which all attendees pledged their dedication to the continued fight against malaria.

A short video presentation on malaria was also screened, showcasing impactful stories.

The event concluded with a heartfelt Vote of Thanks by Dr. Gopi Basar, Consultant PSCM, NCVBDC, who expressed gratitude to all dignitaries, officials, and participants for their active engagement and support.

Survey of Unexplored Category-B GLOF Conducted on Khangri Glacier



DIRANG, April 26:

The Centre for Earth Sciences and Himalayan Studies (CESHS), Government of Arunachal Pradesh along with the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), Goa, Ministry of Earth Sciences and the Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (IITG), conducted the 3rd high-altitude expedition to the Khangri Glacier in the Gori-chen Mountain region from April 19 to 26, 2025. The joint team—comprising four scientists and engineers each from NCPOR and CESHS, and one expert from IIT Guwahati—undertook detailed glacio-hydrological studies aimed at understanding the glacier's health and associated water resources. Key activities included glacier mass balance measurements at 5032 msl aimed at understanding the glacier's health and response to climate change.

As a pioneering effort in the re-

search, the team conducted a comprehensive risk assessment of Rani Lake, a Category-B glacial lake—identified by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA)—for its potential to trigger Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOFs). This involved a bathymetric survey to determine lake depth and volume, along with terrain observations to evaluate moraine stability, drainage pathways, and downstream hazard potential.

To support continuous climate monitoring, the team also performed maintenance of an Automatic Weather Station (AWS) and successfully retrieved winter-over data, ensuring uninterrupted acquisition of essential meteorological parameters critical for glacier and climate studies.

In addition, the team also performed maintenance of water level sensors and conducted direct measurements of glacier meltwater

discharge, enabling accurate assessment of total runoff from the glacier system.

Marking another first-of-its-kind initiative, the team carried out a first-ever Reconnaissance Survey of a cluster of Category-B glacier lakes located at an altitude of 5300msl. These lakes, identified by the NDMA, were assessed for their risk potential to inform future hazard mitigation and disaster preparedness strategies. Reaching the remote site involved a strenuous high-altitude trek across rugged terrain, snow-covered passes, and rapidly changing weather conditions, indicating the logistical challenges faced by the scientists.

Additionally, in order to make such expeditions more convenient the team successfully identified a suitable site at Mirathang for establishing a long-term high-altitude Field Research Station.

EXECUTIVE ORDER (Under Section 152 of the BNSS, 2023)

Whereas, an executive order was issued vide this office order even No. dated 17.12.2024 promulgating a complete ban on use of firearms and air guns for hunting wild animals/birds within Upper Siang District till 30.03.2025 and also thereby requiring all Arms Licence holders to deposit their licenced firearms and air guns in the nearest police station.

And whereas, it has been observed that few licence holders neither complied with the said order nor deposited their firearms/ air guns in the nearest police station within the stipulated time.

And whereas, it is felt expedient to extend the ban on use of firearms and air guns for hunting wild animals/birds considering the fact that the ongoing season is the peak time for breeding of wild animals and birds.

Now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred under section 152 of the BNSS, 2023, I, Shri Talo Jerang, District Magistrate, Upper Siang District do hereby promulgate a complete **ban on use of the firearms and air guns for hunting wild animals/birds** for another period of **3 (three) months i.e. up to 30.06.2025** in the entire territorial jurisdiction of Upper Siang District. Further, as per provisions contained in Section 21 of the Arms Act 1959, all licencees of Upper Siang District are hereby required to **deposit their licenced firearms and air guns in the nearest police station on or before 10.05.2025.**

Any person found violating this order shall be prosecuted as per law. Furthermore, any un-authorized weapon should immediately be seized and the culprits be booked under relevant sections of the law.

The Superintendent of Police, all Executive Magistrates/Admin. Officers, DFOs (Territorial Division, Yingkiong & Wildlife Division, Jengging) and all HGBs/GBs of Upper Siang District shall ensure strict compliance and enforcement of this order.

Since this order cannot be served to individuals due to perceived exigencies, it is made absolute in public interest.

Governor inaugurates Autism Awareness programme

**ITANAGAR, April 28:**

Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), participated in the 'Awareness and Observation of Autism Month' at Golden Jubilee State Banquet Hall, Niti Vihar, Itanagar on Monday, April 28. Inaugurating the two-day programme, the Governor, along with State Social Justice Minister Kento Jini, distributed teaching and learning kits and aids and appliances to children with special needs. They also interacted with the parents and their autistic children, educators and medical specialists and caretakers of rehabilitation and special centers on the occasion.

The Governor said that the event should be the beginning of our amplified understanding and celebration of neurodiversity, while committing to building a more inclusive world for everyone on the autism spectrum. Referring to autistic children as the 'Shining Stars' of Arunachal Pradesh, he highlighted the importance of embracing their unique talents, focus, and attention to detail. He called on everyone to listen to autistic voices, learn from their experiences, and work toward ensuring equal opportunities across education, employment, and social participation.

The Governor assured the parents that the State government will address their challenges and will go beyond the normal means. He said that Raj Bhavan will involve the Shining Stars in all the Raj Bhavan programmes and chalk out events for them. As Chancellor of the Universities in the State, he will initiate a

PhD subject on autism for meaningful research, which will be useful in addressing this neurodiversity challenge.

The Governor called for an in-depth review and mapping of the Children With Special Needs (CWSNs) in the State to bring out an impactful policy for them. He emphasized on conduct of intensive sensitization programs for all stakeholder departments, especially Education, Health, Social Justice, and Women and Child Development. He emphasized that the frontline workers in these departments must be trained and encouraged to actively reduce stigma and foster a more inclusive, supportive environment for these children and their families.

The Governor suggested the proper and full implementation of inclusive education across all schools in the State by mandatory appointment of Special Educators, particularly during the early, formative years of a child's schooling. He also suggested exploring the possibility of establishing Government-run Model Special Schools, while recommending that the Health and Social Justice Departments work together to standardize the private centers and bring them under the umbrella of welfare programs provided by the State and Central Governments. This support would help ensure that therapy services are accessible, affordable, and of a high standard for all children who need them, he said.

The Governor commended the Rehabilitation Centre cum Special Schools and officials of the Directorate of Health Services for their

selfless service to the needs of individuals, providing support, guidance, and hope to those struggling with autism. He also commended Ratan Anya, Chairperson, APSCPCR for her painstaking effort to pursue the issue at the State level.

The State Social Justice Minister, Kento Jini, while highlighting the responsibilities towards the CWSNs, assured the parents that all central and State Government schemes or programmes to address the autism and other benefits for the children with special needs will reach every household in the State.

The Chairperson, Arunachal Pradesh State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (APSCPCR) Ratan Anya and the Member Secretary, APSCPCR Khoda Rakhi highlighted on children affected by autism and recommended steps to address the issue.

One of the parents with an autistic child shared a heart-touching narration of the challenges on the occasion.

The two-day programme is being organized by the Arunachal Pradesh State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, in collaboration with the State Health Department, National Institute of Locomotor Disabilities and Toko Rehabilitation Centre cum Special School.

Large numbers of parents and their wards from the Capital Region participated in the programme. The highlight of the programme was a free disability assessment camp for Children with Special Needs and registration for future consultations and records.

Forest Minister lays foundation stone for bridge construction over Dirok river

Minister for Environment & Forest and DoTCL, Wangki Lowang, laid foundation stone for the construction of a 50-meter span bridge over the Dirok River at Kenon under Deomali circle, Tirap district on Wednesday, April 30.

The project, funded under RIDF (Major Head: 5054 R&B), is estimated at ₹11.19 crore (excluding 1% contingencies and consultancy charges). It was re-cast by the Executive Engineer (Planning), Khonsa Circle, and further modified by the

Superintending Surveyor Works, PWD Eastern Zone, Namsai.
